The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Statutes made by the University of London Commissioners it is provided that four members of the Senate of the University shall be appointed by His Majesty in Council, and that two of the four shall vacate their office on the expiration of two years from the second Tuesday in May next following their appointment:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to appoint Sir John Wolfe Wolfe-Barry, K.C.B., F.R.S., and Sir Francis Mowatt, G.C.B., to be members of the Senate of the said University of London from the twelfth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and three.

The KING has been pleased to order a Congé d'Elire to pass the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, empowering the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Winchester to elect a Bishop of that See, the same being void by the promotion of Doctor Randall Thomas Davidson to the See of Canterbury; and His Majesty has been pleased to recommend to the said Dean and Chapter the Right Reverend Father in God Doctor Herbert Edward Ryle, now Bishop of Exeter, to be by them elected Bishop of the said See of Winchester.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that by Memorial dated 4th February, 1903, a representation has been duly made to him by the East Grinstead Urban District Council that a Fair has been annually held at East Grinstead, on the 11th December and the 21st April, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that such Fair should be abolished.
