NOTICE is hereby given, that the above petition for the winding up of the above named Company by the High Court of Justice, directed to be heard on Tuesday, the 17th day of March, 1903, was adjourned by the Court, and will be heard on Tuesday, the 31st day of March, 1903, before the Court sitting at the Royal Courts of Justice, Strand, London, when, in consequence of the Shareholders of the Company having at an Extraordinary General Meeting, held on the 11th day of March, 1903, resolved that the Company be wound up voluntarily, and that Charles Ernest Bullock, of Hanley, be appointed Liquidator of the Company, the Court will be asked by the petitioners to make an Order for the compulsory winding up of the Company, or in the alternative for an Order continuing the voluntary winding up of the Company under the supervision of the Court, instead of making an Order for the winding up of the Company by the Court; and any creditor or contributory of the Company desirous to support or oppose the making of an Order on the said petition, either for continuing the winding up of the Company under the supervision of the Court or for the winding up by the Court, may appear at the time of hearing by himself, or his Counsel, for that purpose.
