YOUTHFUL OFFENDERS ACT, 1901.

In pursuance of section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, notice is hereby given that after forty days from the date of the publication of this notice the Lord Chancellor proposes to make Rules under the Summary Jurisdiction Acts annulling the Summary Jurisdiction Rule, 1895, and prescribing forms to be used under the Youthful Offenders Act, 1901, also forms to be used for convictions and detentions under the Reformatory Schools Acts, 1866, 1893, and 1899, the Industrial Schools Act, 1866, the Industrial Schools Act Amendment Act, 1880, the Industrial Schools Act, 1894, and the Elementary Education Act, 1876.

The Tramways Act, 1870. The Chester Corporation Act, 1901. TRAMWAY BYE-LAWS.

OTICE is hereby given, that the Mayor,.
Aldermen, and Citizens of the City and County Borough of Chester, acting by the Town Council, have, subject to the approval of the Board of Trade, made Bye-laws pursuant to the provisions of the above Acts, as follows:— Chester Corporation Tramways, Bye-laws.

Made by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the city and county borough of Chester pursuant to the powers conferred upon them by the Tramways Act, 1870, and the Chester Corporation Act, 1901, with respect to the tramways for the time being belonging to and worked by the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens.

Repeal of former Bye-laws and Regulations.

1. From and ofter the date of these Bye-laws coming into force, all Bye-laws and Regulations heretofore made with respect to any tramways within the said city shall be repealed; but any proceedings pending at the time of such repeal. may be continued and prosecuted as if such reveal had not taken effect.

Interpretation.

2. Throughout these Bye-laws the words "the Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the City and County Borough of Chester; the expression "the Town Clerk" means the Town Clerk of the city and county borough of Chester; the word "tramways" means the tramways for the time being belonging to and worked by the Corporation, whether situate within or without the boundary of the city and county borough of Chester; the word "car" means any carriage or car run by the Corporation upon the tramways for the conveyance of passengers; the word "conductor" means any officer or servant of the Corporation having the charge or helping in the charge of a car; and the word "driver" means any officer or servant of the Corporation driving or helping to drive a car.

Penalty.

3. Any person infringing any of the following Bye-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings, and in case of a continuing offence. to a penalty not exceeding ten shillings, in addition to the first-mentioned penalty, for every day during which such offence continues.

Offensive language or conduct.

4. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language or conduct himself offensively whilst in or on any car, or spit or commit any nuisance in or on or against any car, or tramway station, or premises used in connection with the tramways, or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger or intending passenger. No person shall sound or play upon any musical instrument, or distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind, or beg or collect money, alms, or subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game, or gamble, or deposit remnants of food or fruit, or any paper or other litter in or on any car.

Intoxicated persons.

5. Any person who is in a state of intoxication shall not be allowed to board or enter in or on any car, and if any such person be found in or on ... any car he shall be requested by the conductor to leave the car, failing which it shall be lawful for the conductor, or any Police Constable, or any other officer or servant of the Corporation, toremove such person from the car,

Objectionable persons.

6. Any person whose dress or clothing, or any article or thing carried by him or her, is calculated, in the opinion of the conductor, to soil or injure the car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or who, in the opinion of the conductor, may for any other cause be offensive to passengers, shall not be allowed to board or enter in or on any car, and if found in or on any car shall, on the request of the conductor, leave the car upon the fare (if previously paid) being tendered to him, and failing compliance with such request, it shall be lawful for the conductor or any police constable, or any other officer or servant of the Corporation, to remove such person from the car.

Dogs.

7. No person shall take a dog or other animal into or on any car after having been requested not to do so by the conductor or other authorized officer of the Corporation. Any dog or other animal taken into or found on any car shall be removed from the car by the person in charge of such dog or other animal immediately upon request by the conductor.

Damaging Cars.

8. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the seats, cushions, curtains, linings, or any other part of any car or of its equipment, or remove ou deface any number plate printed or other notice, or notification or advertisement, or other article in or on any car, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage any car or its equipment. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable, in addition to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws, for the amount of any damage so done, or the value of the article so removed or defaced.

Smoking.

9. No person shall smoke or carry lighted pipes, cigars; cheroots, or cigarettes inside any car, except in a compartment (if any) specially set apart for the purpose.

Payment of Fares.

10. Each passenger shall, on demand, or before leaving the car, pay to the conductor the fare legally payable for his journey and obtain a ticket therefor. Any person leaving a car shall be deemed to have completed his journey.

No child under five years of age and sitting on the lap of a passenger shall be liable to pay a fare, provided that this provision shall apply only to one such child sitting on the lap of any one passenger; any additional child, irrespective of age, accompanying such passenger shall pay the full ordinary fare.

Tickets.

11. Each passenger shall immediately upon demand, show, and, if required, deliver up his ticket to any officer or servant of the Corporation, and in default shall pay the fare for the distance travelled on the car by such passenger.

Tickets shall not be transferable and shall only be available by the car on or for which they are issued.

Wrongful use of Workmen's Tickets.

12. No person, other than such as are artizans, mechanics, and daily labourers within the true intent and meaning of "The Chester Corporation Act, 1901," shall use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artizans, mechanics, and daily labourers.

Interference with the Duties of the Conductor or Driver.

13. No person other than officers and servants of the Corporation shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights, ventilators, trolley cord, or any part of a car or its equipment, or signal a car to start or stop.

Luggage.

14. No luggage or parcels of any description shall be conveyed upon any car except such personal luggage as is allowed by section 48 of the Chester Corporation Act, 1901, and is carried in manner prescribed by that section.

Entering full Cars.

15. When any car contains the full number of passengers which it is intended to carry, no additional person shall, without the consent of the conductor, enter, board, or remain in or on such car, and any person having so entered or boarded a car without such consent shall leave the car immediately upon the request of the conductor.

Disabled Cars.

16. If at any time a car, in the opinion of the conductor, becomes disabled or injured, or from any cause unable to proceed, or unfit or unsuitable for carrying passengers, the passengers shall, upon the request of the conductor, leave the same, and if such passengers have paid their fares, shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid. No person shall, except with the leave of the conductor, enter a car so disabled, or injured, or unable to proceed, or unfit, or unsuitable.

Cars proceeding to Sheds.

17. No person shall travel upon a car which is proceeding to a shed and is not on its usual route unless permitted so to do by the conductor, and where such person is so permitted, he shall pay the usual fare payable on such route.

Travelling on Steps, &c.

18. No passenger or intending passenger shall stand, travel, or ride on the step, platform, staircase, outside rail, buffer, or guard of any car, and no passenger or intending passenger shall stand on the outside of any car, nor in the interior of any car, except only in accordance with the regulations (if any) of the Corporation exhibited upon such car.

No person, except officers and servants of the Corporation, and passengers or intending passengers, shall board or enter on a car, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of a car.

Firearms.

19. No person shall travel in or on any car with firearms, or any dangerous article or thing, provided that nothing in this Bye-law shall apply to persons in the Naval, Military, Reserve, or Auxiliary Forces carrying unloaded firearms.

Entering and leaving Cars.

20. Every person shall enter or depart from a car by the step of the hindermost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise, unless so directed by the conductor.

All persons desiring to alight from any car shall do so before any person boards or enters the car for the purpose of travelling thereon, and all persons desiring to board or enter the car shall permit such persons to alight as aforesaid.

Entering a Car when in motion.

21. No person (except officers and servants of the Corporation) shall enter, board, or leave, or attempt to enter, board, or leave, any car whilst in motion. Persons suffering from Disease not to travel on Cars.

22. No person who has any infectious or contagious disease shall board, enter, or travel on any car, or attempt so to do. And no driver or conductor shall knowingly suffer or permit any such person so to do.

Obstructing Officials in exercise of duty.

23. No person shall wilfully obstruct, impede, or interfere with any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any of the cars or the tramways.

Power to remove Passengers committing offence.

24. Any person who shall, whilst on any car, commit any legal offence, or any breach of these Bye-laws, shall, in addition to being liable to a penalty, be liable to be immediately removed from the car, and if such person shall have paid his fare, shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of the fair so paid or any part thereof.

Conductors and Drivers to enforce Bye-laws.

25. Every conductor and driver shall to the best of his ability enforce these Bye-laws and prevent the breach thereof; and if any such conductor or driver knowingly and wilfully fails to enforce the same or to prevent such breaches aforesaid, he shall be deemed to have committed a breach thereof.

These Bye-laws shall come into force on the , one thousand day of nine hundred and three.
