

Persons suffering from Disease not to travel on Cars.

22. No person who has any infectious or contagious disease shall board, enter, or travel on any car, or attempt so to do. And no driver or conductor shall knowingly suffer or permit any such person so to do.

Obstructing Officials in exercise of duty.

23. No person shall wilfully obstruct, impede, or interfere with any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any of the cars or the tramways.

Power to remove Passengers committing offence.

24. Any person who shall, whilst on any car, commit any legal offence, or any breach of these Bye-laws, shall, in addition to being liable to a penalty, be liable to be immediately removed from the car, and if such person shall have paid his fare, shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of the fare so paid or any part thereof.

Conductors and Drivers to enforce Bye-laws.

25. Every conductor and driver shall to the best of his ability enforce these Bye-laws and prevent the breach thereof; and if any such conductor or driver knowingly and wilfully fails to enforce the same or to prevent such breaches aforesaid, he shall be deemed to have committed a breach thereof.

These Bye-laws shall come into force on the day of , one thousand nine hundred and three.
