And whereas the mortgagees of the advowson of the said benefice of Tooting Graveney have offered no objections to the said scheme.

And whereas one calendar month has elapsed since the date of the transmission of the drafts of the scheme as aforesaid.

And whereas notwithstanding the objections of the said John Hendry Anderson as such patron and Incumbent as aforesaid the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Rochester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five; duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of February in the year one thousand nine hundred and three in the words following; that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Saviour Weston-super-Mare situate within the new parish (sometime particular district) of Emmanuel Weston-super-Mare in the county of Somerset and in the diocese of Bath and Wells.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said new parish of Emmanuel Weston-super-Mare and of the new parish (sometime particular district) of Christ Church Weston-super-Mare which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such new parishes.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said new parish of Emmanuel Weston-super-Mare and of the said new parish of Christ Church Weston-super-Mare should be formed

into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Saviour Weston-super-Mare situate as aforesaid.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend George Wyndham Bishop of Bath and Wells as such Bishop and with the consents of the Reverend Thomas Dehany Bernard Clerk in Holy Orders Chancellor of the Cathedral Church of Wells and one of the Prebendaries of the same church the Reverend John Beresford Clerk in Holy Orders one of the Prebendaries of the said Cathedral Church of Wells and vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the parish of Saint Cuthbert Wells in the said county of Somerset the Reverend William Henry Askwith Clerk in Holy Orders one of the Prebendaries of the said Cathedral Church of Wells and vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the parish of Saint Mary Magdalene Taunton in the said county of Somerset William Wildman Kettlewell of East Harptree in the said county of Somerset Esquire and the Reverend James Phelips one of the Prebendaries of the said Cathedral Church of Wells and vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the parish of Yeovil in the said county of Somerset as the patrons as well of the vicarage of the said new parish of Emmanuel Weston-super-Mare as of the vicarage of the said new parish of Christ Church Weston-super-Mare (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said new parish of Emmanuel Weston-super-Mare and of the said new parish of Christ Church Weston-super-Mare which are described in the schedule hereunder written all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Saviour Weston-super-Mare situate as aforesaid and that the same should be named The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Saviour Weston-super-Mare."

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Saviour Weston-super-Mare, comprising:—

"All those two contiguous portions of the new parish (sometime particular district) of Emmanuel Weston-super-Mare and of the new parish (sometime particular district) of Christ Church Weston-super-Mare both in the county of Somerset and in the diocese of Bath and Wells which are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the parish of Uphill in the said county and diocese from the said new parish of Emmanuel Weston-super-Mare crosses the middle of the Weston loop line of the Great Western Railway and extending thence eastward along the said boundary for a distance of thirty-seven chains and a quarter or thereabouts (thereby in part following the course of the drain or stream called Uphill Great Rhyne) to the point where such boundary meets the boundary which divides the parish of Bleadon in the said county and diocese from the said new parish of Emmanuel Weston-super-Mare and
