## ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 22ND APRIL 1903.)

(SWINE-FEVER INFECTED AREA.)

The Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

### *Extension of Limits of Swine-Fever Infected Area.*

1. The limits of the Swine-Fever Infected Area declared by Order of the Board dated the twentieth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and three, are hereby extended so as to comprise the Area described in the Schedule to this Order, and the Area so described is hereby from and after the commencement of this Order declared to be an area infected with swine-fever for the purposes of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902.

### *Commencement.*

2. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-ninth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and three.
