The Board of Trade have received from the Collector of Customs at Mauritius a copy of the following Proclamation prohibiting the importation of cattle and certain goods from Natal, Basutoland, and Cape Colony:—

Proclamation No. 10.

To prohibit importations from Natal and Basutoland.

In the name of His Majesty Edward VII of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, &c., &c., &c.

CHAS. BRUCE.—By His Excellency Sir Charles Bruce, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Mauritius and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

(Seal.)

Whereas by Article 12 of Ordinance No. 39 of 1881 as amended by Ordinance No. 3 of 1900, and Regulation No. 79 of 1882, power is given to the Governor in Executive Council by Proclamation, to prohibit absolutely, or to admit, subject to such conditions as he may be advised to impose, all or any importations of any kind from any port or place where cattle plague shall be reported to exist or from any country adjacent thereto, and to impose such measures of disinfection as he may be advised on all vessels, crews and passengers and their clothes, luggage and personal effects, from any such port, place or country, and to revoke or amend such Proclamation;

And whereas it has been reported to the Governor that cattle plague exists in Natal and Basutoland and Cape Colony and it is expedient to take measures to prevent the introduction of that disease into Mauritius;

Now, therefore in virtue of the powers in me vested by the Ordinance aforesaid, I do hereby order and proclaim that the importation from Natal, or Basutoland or Cape Colony of any or all of the following articles is hereby prohibited:

(a.) Cattle, dead or alive, as defined by Ordinance No. 39 of 1881 (including horses, asses and

mules as provided for in Regulation 79 of 1882) (Subject to the provisions hereinafter contained.)

(b.) Fresh offal, hoofs, horns, bones, horse-hair, hairs, raw silk and wool.

(c.) Straw, hay or litter.

(d.) Raw leather, untanned hides, fresh hides.

(e.) Milk, fresh butter, cheese, and generally all dairy produce.

(f.) Rags and drills, without including rags packed under hydraulic pressure conveyed in bales as merchandise.

(g.) Old books and old newspapers.

(h.) Manures and other fertilizing products of animal or vegetable origin.

(i.) Live plants and the soil in which they are planted.

(j.) Old or second-hand clothes, gunny bags, new or old.

(k.) Soil of every description, and ballast consisting of earth or mud-sand.

(l.) Potatoes, peas, lentils, beans, maize, raw coffee, fresh vegetables and fruits.

All animals, dead or alive, except cattle as above defined and horses, asses and mules, may be imported from Natal and Basutoland and Cape Colony with the permission of the Governor, on a report of the Director of the Medical and Health Department, and subject, in the case of dogs, to the provisions of Ordinance No. 26 of 1845, and No. 12 of 1867.

All articles not enumerated above may be imported from Natal or Basutoland and Cape Colony provided they be disinfected to the satisfaction of the Sanitary Authorities should they in the opinion of the Sanitary Authorities be considered likely to convey or retain infection.

All vessels, crews or passengers arriving from Natal or Basutoland or Cape Colony and all clothes, luggage and personal effects of such crews and passengers may, if so ordered by the Director, be disinfected in such manner as is provided by Regulation 204 of 23rd August, 1898, passed under the Quarantine Ordinance, 1897-98, or by any Regulations to be made hereafter under the said Ordinance.

COUNTY BOROUGH OF BOURNEMOUTH.
BYE-LAWS made by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the County Borough of Bournemouth, acting by the Council, as the promoters of the Corporation Tramways in the county borough of Bournemouth, under section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870.

Interpretation of Terms.

1. Throughout these Bye-laws the following words shall have the meanings respectively assigned to them, that is to say:—

“Corporation” means the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Bournemouth, and shall include any Lessees or other persons for the time being working the Tramway system hereinafter referred to;

“Tramways” means the Tramway system of the Corporation, situate within the county borough of Bournemouth.

“Car” means any carriage or car run by the Corporation upon the Tramways for the conveyance of passengers.

“Conductor” means any servant of the Corporation having the charge of or helping in the charge of a Car.

“Driver” means any servant of the Corporation driving or helping to drive a Car.

“Officer” means any Tramway Inspector or any Inspector of Public Carriages in the employ of the Corporation, or any member of the Police Force.

Offensive Language or Conduct.

2. No person shall swear or use obscene, indecent, or offensive language or conduct himself offensively whilst in or upon any car, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any car or tramway station or premises used in connection with the tramway system, or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger. No person shall play or perform upon any musical instrument, or distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind, or beg or collect money, alms, or subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game, or gamble, or deposit remnants of food or fruit in or upon any car.

Objectionable Persons.

3. Any person who is in a state of intoxication, and who from that cause is in the opinion of the conductor unfit to be a passenger on a car, shall not be allowed to board or enter upon any car, and if any such person be found in or upon any car, he or she shall be requested by the conductor to leave the car, failing which it shall be lawful for the conductor or an officer of the Corporation to remove such person from the car.

4. No person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of the car, soil or injure the seats, linings, or cushions of the car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, and no person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall be entitled to enter or remain in or upon any car, and any such person may be prevented from entering or remaining in or upon any car, and shall not enter, or be, or remain in or upon any part thereof, after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and, if found in or upon any car, shall, on request of the conductor, leave the car, upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

Persons suffering from Disease not to travel on Cars.

5. No person afflicted with any infectious or contagious disease shall board, enter, or travel on any car, or attempt so to do. And no driver

or conductor shall wilfully or knowingly suffer or permit any such person so to do.

"Infectious or contagious disease" means any of the following diseases:—Small-pox, cholera, diphtheria, membranous croup, erysipelas, the disease known as scarlatina or scarlet fever, and measles; also the fevers known by any of the following names: typhus, typhoid, enteric, relapsing, continued or puerperal.

Dogs.

6. No person shall take a dog or other animal into any car. Any dog or other animal taken into or found on any car shall be removed by the person in charge thereof from the tramway car immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request, such dog or other animal may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor. Provided that where, by a notice affixed in a conspicuous position on any car, the Corporation shall prescribe conditions upon and subject to which dogs and other animals may be taken upon any car, this bye-law shall not prohibit the taking of dogs or other animals on any such car under and subject to such conditions.

Damaging Cars.

7. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, or damage the seats, cushions, curtains, or linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice in or on any car, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage any car. Any person acting in contravention of this regulation shall be liable, in addition to the penalty prescribed by these bye-laws, for the amount of any damage so done.

Smoking.

8. No person shall smoke or carry lighted pipes, cigars or cigarettes inside any car except in a compartment which may be specially set apart for the purpose.

Spitting.

9. No person shall spit in or on any car.

Payment of Fares.

10. Every passenger shall before leaving the car, pay to the conductor the fare legally payable for his or her journey and obtain a ticket therefor. Such ticket shall not be transferable, and shall be available only for the journey and on the car for and on which the same is issued, except in the case of special return or transfer tickets. Any person leaving a car shall be deemed to have completed his or her journey. A child under five years of age, who is sitting on the lap of a passenger, shall not be liable to pay a fare, provided that this provision shall apply only to one such child accompanying any one passenger. Any additional child, irrespective of age, accompanying such person, shall pay the full ordinary fare.

No person shall travel or attempt to travel on a car without paying his fare, and with intent to avoid payment thereof.

Tickets.

11. Each passenger shall immediately upon demand show his or her ticket to any officer of the Corporation, duly authorized in that behalf, and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his or her ticket or pay the fare for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

12. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Corporation, shall not use or attempt to use, any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers.

Interference with the duties of Conductor or Driver.

13. A passenger or other person shall not wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any car or tramway.

14. No person other than the conductor or driver shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights, ventilators, trolley cord, or any part of a car or its equipment.

Luggage.

15. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform, and not in the interior or on the top of any car.

No person shall carry or deposit upon any car any luggage, article, instrument, or implements which shall cause hindrance or annoyance to passengers, or which may, in the opinion of the conductor, be dangerous or offensive to any passenger.

Full Number of Passengers.

16. When any car contains in the interior thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation, according to the notice thereof attached to the car, is provided in such interior, no person beyond such number shall enter, mount, or remain therein except by the express permission of the conductor first obtained.

When any car contains on the outside thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation, according to the notice thereof attached to the car, is provided on such outside, no person beyond such number shall enter, mount, or remain thereon.

Disabled Cars.

17. If at any time a car becomes disabled, or in any way injured, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon the request of the conductor, leave the same, and if such passengers have paid their fares, shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but on production of their tickets shall be allowed to travel by the next available car the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares. No person shall, except with the leave of the conductor, enter a disabled or injured car.

Cars proceeding to Sheds.

18. No person shall travel upon a car which is proceeding to a shed and is not on its usual route, unless permitted to do so by the conductor, and where such person is so permitted, he shall pay the usual fare payable on such route.

Travelling on Step, &c.

19. No person, except a driver, conductor, or officer of the Corporation, shall travel or ride on the steps, driver's platform, outside rails, buffers or guards of any car, or stand upon the upper deck of any car while the same is in motion, or, except in accordance with the Regulations of the Corporation exhibited upon such car, stand either on the conductor's platform or in the interior of any car.

No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or board a car, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of a car.

Firearms.

20. No person shall travel in or on any car with firearms, or dangerous articles or things, provided that nothing contained in this Bye-law shall apply to persons in the Naval, Military, Reserve, or Auxiliary Forces carrying unloaded firearms.

Entering and leaving Cars.

21. Every person shall enter or depart from a car by the step of the hindermost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise, unless so directed by the conductor or officer.

No person shall board a car before any person desiring to alight therefrom shall have done so.

Entering a Car when in motion.

22. No person shall enter, board, or leave, or attempt to enter, board, or leave any car whilst in motion.

Use of Signal Bells.

23. No person shall ring, or cause to be rung, any of the signal bells upon any car, so as to effect the unnecessary stopping of any car, nor signal a car to start.

Power to remove Passengers committing offence.

24. Any person who shall commit, whilst on any car, any offence or any breach of these Bye-laws rendering him liable to a penalty, shall, if he persists in the offence after being requested by a conductor to desist, be liable to be immediately removed from a car, and if such person shall have paid his or her fare, shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of his or her fare so paid.

Conductors and Drivers to enforce Bye-laws.

25. Every conductor and driver shall, to the best of his ability, enforce these Bye-laws and Regulations and prevent the breach thereof; and if any such conductor or driver fails to enforce the same as aforesaid, he shall be deemed to have committed a breach thereof.

Penalty.

26. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws or Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

27. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each car in use a printed copy of these Bye-laws.

These Bye-laws shall come into force on the first day of July, 1903.

The foregoing Bye-laws were made at a meeting of the Council, held on the seventh day of April, 1903.

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COUNTY BOROUGH OF SOUTHAMPTON.

The Tramways Act, 1870.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the County Borough of Southampton, acting by the Council, have in pursuance of the powers in them vested made the following Bye-laws:—

1. Throughout these Bye-laws the word "Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the county borough of Southampton, acting by the Council; the word "tramways" means the tramway system worked by the Corporation, within the county borough of Southampton; the words "Tramways Committee" mean the Committee for the time being appointed by the Corporation to undertake the control and management of the tramways; the word "car" means any carriage or car run upon the tramways for the conveyance of passengers; the word "conductor" means any officer or servant

of the Tramways Committee having charge of or helping in the charge of a car; and the word "driver" means any officer or servant of the Tramways Committee driving or helping to drive a car.

2. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a car by the step of the hindermost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise, unless so directed by the conductor.

All persons desiring to alight from any car should do so before any person boards such car for the purpose of travelling thereon, and all persons desiring to board the car shall permit such persons to alight as aforesaid.

3. No person shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe, or cigar, or cigarette, inside any car.

4. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any car, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

5. No person in a state of intoxication, or affected with any dangerous, contagious, or infectious disorder, shall enter or mount upon any car, and any such person found in or upon any car shall be immediately removed from the car by or under the direction of the conductor.

6. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any car, or spit or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any car, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

7. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on any car, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage any car.

Any person acting in contravention of this Bye-law shall, in addition to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws, be liable to pay the amount of any damage so done.

8. No person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a car, soil or injure the linings or cushions of a car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, nor any person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to any passenger, shall be entitled to enter or remain in or upon any car, and may be prevented from entering or remaining in or upon any car.

No such person shall enter in or upon any car after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and if any such person be found in or upon any car, he shall, on the request of the conductor, leave such car upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

9. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor or other servant of the Tramways Committee acting in the performance of his duty, the fare legally demandable for the journey, or for the stage thereof for which it be demanded, and shall forthwith take a ticket from the conductor for the fare so paid.

10. Each passenger shall, as and when requested so to do, show his ticket to the conductor or other servant of the Tramways Committee acting in the performance of his duty, and shall also, when requested so to do by the conductor or other servant of the Tramways Committee acting in the performance of his duty, deliver up his ticket, or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

11. A passenger not being an artizan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of section 8 of the Southampton Corporation Tramways Order, 1900, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artizans, mechanics, or daily labourers.

12. No passenger shall bring on to any car any luggage other than his own personal luggage, which shall be placed by the passenger in such

position on the car as shall be directed by the conductor.

13. No person other than the driver or the conductor of a car, or a servant of the Tramways Committee acting in the performance of his duty, shall travel or ride upon the steps, platforms, outside rails, buffers, or guards of any car, or shall stand in any case on the outside, or, except by the express permission of the conductor first obtained, in the interior of any car.

No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall board a car, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of a car.

14. When any car contains in the interior thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation, according to the notice thereof attached to the car is provided in such interior, no person beyond such number shall enter, mount, or remain therein, except by the express permission of the conductor first obtained.

When any car contains on the outside thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation according to the notice thereof attached to the car is provided on such outside, no person beyond such number shall enter, mount, or remain thereon.

15. No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave any car whilst in motion.

16. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any car. No person shall take a dog or other animal into or on any car. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any car shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the car immediately upon request by the conductor, and, in default of compliance with such request, may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

17. No person shall travel in or on any car with loaded firearms, or with any article, instrument, or implement or any material or substance which may be dangerous or offensive to the passengers.

18. No person other than the conductor or driver, or other servant of the Tramways Committee acting in the performance of his duty, shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controller, brakes, lights, ventilators, trolley cord, or any part of a car, or its equipment, and no person other than the conductor, or other servant of the Tramways Committee acting in the performance of his duty, shall signal a car to start.

19. No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any car, or obstruct or impede any conductor, driver, or other servant of the Tramways Committee acting in the performance of his duty upon or in connection with any car or tramway.

20. Every conductor and driver of a car shall, to the best of his ability, enforce these Bye-laws, and prevent the breach thereof.

21. Any person offending against, or committing a breach of, any of the Bye-laws, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

22. From and after the date of these Bye-laws coming into force, the Bye-laws and Regulations made by the Southampton Tramways Company which came into force on the 1st day of January, 1880, shall be repealed.

23. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each car in use a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.

24. These Bye-laws shall come into force on the 1st day of July, 1903.
