REGULATIONS respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the situation of Valuer and Surveyor (Second Section) in the Department of the General Valuation and Boundary Survey of Ireland.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations.

I. The limits of age for this situation are 22 and 28, and Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the Examination.

In reckoning age for competition the following allowances will be made, viz. :—

(i.) Persons who have served in the Army or Navy may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have served ;

(ii.) Persons who may be serving or who may have served in the Militia, the Imperial Yeomanry, the Honourable Artillery Company, or the Volunteers, may deduct from their actual age any time spent on actual military service, such time being reckoned by the number of days for which they received Army pay ;

(iii.) Persons who have served for two full consecutive years—

(A) In any Civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners,

(B) In the Royal Irish Constabulary, or

(C) As Registered Copyists or Registered Boy Clerks in succession with the Civil Service,

may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding five years which they may have spent in such service.

II. Candidates will be required to show what technical education and preliminary training they have undergone to qualify themselves for a situation of this nature. They must show (1) that they have served for at least two years in a public or private office under a Civil Engineer, Architect, or Surveyor, (2) that the works on which they have been engaged during those years were such as to afford them the opportunity of gaining a satisfactory knowledge of their profession ; and (3) that they have fully profited by their practical training, and possess the necessary qualifications and experience. Evidence on these points must be sent in at such times and in such manner as the Civil Service Commissioners may appoint. If such evidence should prove

prima facie satisfactory, the Candidate will be admitted to examination, subject, in the case of his being successful in the competition, to such further inquiry, and the production of such further evidence as may be necessary.

III. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz. :—

1. English Composition (including Hand-writing and Orthography).
2. Arithmetic.
3. Land Surveying, including Draughtsmanship and the making and plotting of Surveys; and *either*
4. Architectural Surveying and Valuing; or
5. Practical Farming, including the elements of Geology and Chemistry as applied to Agriculture, and Land Valuing.

In subjects 3, 4, and 5 there will be an Oral and Practical Examination.

Candidates must pass to the satisfaction of the Civil Service Commissioners in subjects numbered 1, 2, 3, and must obtain such an aggregate of marks in the Examination, as a whole, as may indicate in the judgment of the Civil Service Commissioners a competent amount of general proficiency.

IV. Subject to the provisions of Clause II of these regulations the examinations are open, to all natural-born subjects of His Majesty, being of the requisite age, health, and character, with the following restrictions :—

(i.) The following classes of persons are ineligible, viz. :—

- (a) Persons actually serving in the Army or Navy.
- (b) Members of the Royal Irish Constabulary of less than five years' service.
- (ii.) The following classes of persons are eligible under certain conditions only, that is to say :—
- (c) Persons holding situations in the Civil Service.
- (d) Members of the Royal Irish Constabulary, of more than five years' service.
- (e) Apprentices and Engineer students in His Majesty's Dockyards.
- (f) Persons who have been trained in Training Colleges at the public expense.
- (g) Persons who have been trained in the Inland Revenue Branch of the Government Laboratory.

Persons comprised in the classes (c), (d), (e) must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination, before the commencement of the competition.

Persons comprised in class (f) will not be qualified to receive appointments until the consent of the Board of Education in England, the Committee of Council on Education for Scotland, or the Commissioners of National Education, Ireland, as the case may be, given in conformity with rules sanctioned by the Lords of the Treasury, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

**ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE.**

(DATED 2ND MAY 1903.)

**ABERDEENSHIRE (PARASITIC MANGE) ORDER OF
1903.**

The Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in
exercise of the powers in them vested under the
Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of
every other power enabling them in this behalf,
do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

**Separation of Diseased and Suspected Animals
and Notice of Disease.**

1.—(1.) Every person having in his possession
or under his charge a horse, ass, or mule affected
with or suspected of parasitic mange shall (a) as
far as practicable keep that animal separate from
animals not so affected or suspected; and (b)
with all practicable speed give notice of the fact of
the horse, ass, or mule being so affected or
suspected to a constable of the police force for
the police area in which the horse, ass, or mule
so affected or suspected is.

(2.) The constable receiving such notice shall
forthwith give information of the receipt by
him of the notice to an Inspector of the Local
Authority, who shall forthwith report the same
to the Local Authority.

Duty of Inspector to act immediately.

2. An Inspector of the Local Authority on
receiving in any manner whatsoever information
of the supposed existence of parasitic mange, or
having reasonable ground to suspect the existence
of parasitic mange, shall proceed with all practic-
able speed to the place where such disease,
according to the information received by him,
exists, or is suspected to exist, and shall see that
the provisions of this Order are complied with.

Treatment for Parasitic Mange.

3.—(1.) A person having in his possession or
under his charge a horse, ass, or mule affected
with parasitic mange, shall from time to time as
often as may be necessary treat that horse, ass, or
mule, or cause it to be treated, with some dressing
or other remedy for parasitic mange.

(2.) If any person fail to comply with the requirements of this Article he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Regulations of Local Authority as to Cleansing and Disinfection.

4.—(1.) The Local Authority may, for the purpose of preventing the spreading of parasitic mange, make Regulations for the following purposes, or any of them :

- (a.) For providing for the cleansing and disinfection of any place used by, and of utensils, mangers, feeding-troughs, pens, hurdles, harness, or other things used for or about, any horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of parasitic mange :
- (b.) For prescribing the mode in which such cleansing and disinfection are to be effected :
- (c.) For requiring the owner, lessee, or occupier of any such place to cleanse and disinfect any such place, utensils, mangers, feeding-troughs, pens, hurdles, harness, or other things, at the expense of the Local Authority, or at the expense of such owner, lessee, or occupier.

(2.) If any person fail to cleanse and disinfect any place or any utensil, manger, feeding-trough, pen, hurdle, harness, or other thing, in accordance with any such Regulation, it shall be lawful for the Local Authority, without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for the infringement of such Regulation, to cause such place or such utensil, manger, feeding-trough, pen, hurdle, harness, or other thing, to be cleansed and disinfected, and to recover summarily the expenses of such cleansing and disinfection from such person.

(3.) If anything is omitted to be done as regards cleansing or disinfection in contravention of a Regulation of the Local Authority made under this Order, the owner and the lessee and the occupier of any place in or in respect of which the same is omitted, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Occupiers to give facilities for Cleansing.

5.—(1.) Where the power of causing any place to be cleansed and disinfected under this Order is exercised by the Local Authority, the owner, lessee, or occupier thereof shall give all reasonable facilities for that purpose.

(2.) If any person fail to comply with the requirements of this Article he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Provisions as to Regulations of Local Authority.

6.—(1.) The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board two copies of every Regulation made by them under this Order.

(2.) If the Board are satisfied on inquiry, with respect to any Regulation made by the Local Authority under this Order, that the same is for any reason objectionable, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

Extension of certain Sections of Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

7. Horses, asses, and mules shall be animals, and parasitic mange of horses, asses, and mules (in this Order called parasitic mange) shall be a disease for the purposes of this Order and of the following sections of the Act of 1894 (namely):
Section forty-three (powers of police);
Section forty-four (powers of inspectors);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences or procedure.

Exemption of Army Veterinary Department and Veterinary Colleges.

8. Nothing in this Order applies to any horse, ass, or mule kept in stables of military barracks or camps under the care and supervision of the Army Veterinary Department, or in stables of any Veterinary College affiliated to the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons.

Interpretation.

9. In this Order—

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture:

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Extent.

10. This Order extends to the administrative county of Aberdeen only.

Commencement.

11. This Order shall come into operation on the ninth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and three.

Short Title.

12. This Order may be cited as the ABERDEENSHIRE (PARASITIC MANGE) ORDER of 1903.

III, cap. CXXVII, 5 Vict. Sess. 2 cap. i., 7 and 8 Vict. cap. XLIII, 15 Vict. cap. 3 and any other Act or Acts relating to the Royal Infirmary.

To vary or extinguish all existing rights and privileges which would or might in any manner impede or interfere with any of the objects or purposes of the said Additional Provision, and to confer other rights and privileges.
