For the purposes of the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 and 1888, and of the Electric Lighting (Scotland) Act, 1890, and all Provisional Orders and Licences made and issued thereunder, the

Board of Trade approve of the pattern and construction of the meter (hereinafter described) for the measurement of electrical energy when supplied on the constant potential alternating current system, namely:—

The meter No. 300,095 deposited at the Board of Trade on the 8th of June, 1900, by or on behalf of the British Thomson-Houston Company, Rugby, and sealed by the Board of Trade and known as the Elihu Thomson Recording Wattmeter.

Provided that the meter be tested, fixed, and used as described in the specification and instructions deposited at the Board of Trade and dated and numbered 21st April, 1903, and H. 6767.

BOARD OF EDUCATION.

Appointed Day.

Order made under Section 27 (2) of the Education Act, 1902.

Whereas by Sub-section (2) of Section 27 of the Education Act, 1902 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that the Act shall, except as expressly provided, come into operation on the appointed day, and the appointed day shall be the twenty-sixth day of March, nineteen hundred and three, or such other day, not being more than eighteen months later, as the Board of Education may appoint, and different days may be appointed for different purposes and for different provisions of the Act and for different Councils.

And whereas by Order dated the sixteenth day of March, nineteen hundred and three, the Board of Education have fixed the first day of April, nineteen hundred and three, as the appointed day for the purposes of Sub-section (5) of Section 23 of the Act.

And whereas by Order dated the fifteenth day of May, nineteen hundred and three, the Board of Education have fixed as the appointed day for the Council of the borough of Ryde for all other purposes and provisions of the Act, the first day of July, nineteen hundred and three, or such later day or days as the Board might for any such purpose or provision for the said Council thereafter appoint.

Now, therefore, the Board of Education, pursuant to the Act and to every other power enabling them in that behalf, hereby appoint as the appointed day for the Council of the said borough of Ryde for all purposes and provisions of the Act, except for the purposes of Sub-section (5) of Section 23 aforesaid, the thirtieth day of September, nineteen hundred and three, or such later day or days as the Board may for any such other purpose or provision for the said Council hereafter appoint.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 16TH MAY 1903.)

The Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Foreign Animals (Amendment) Order of 1903 (No. 2), animals now being brought in the Vessel described in the Schedule hereto from the country of the Argentine Republic or from Uruguay may be landed at the Liverpool (Birkenhead) Foreign Animals Wharf in accordance with the provisions of this Order and not otherwise.

4. The animals shall not be landed except with the permission of an Inspector of the Board, which permission will only be given where the Inspector is satisfied that sufficient lairage and other accommodation is available for the landing and slaughter of the animals in accordance with the provisions of this Order; and provided the animals are, if so required by an Inspector of the Board, previously transhipped into vessels approved for such purpose by the Inspector.

5. The animals shall only be landed at such part of the Wharf as an Inspector of the Board may direct, and when landed shall be driven by lairage-men to such lairs within the limits of the Wharf as may be specially approved for that purpose by an Inspector of the Board.

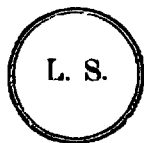

After such examination as may be required by an Inspector of the Board, the animals shall either be immediately slaughtered in the lairs in which they then are, or they may, with the permission of an Inspector of the Board, be forthwith moved to a slaughter-house specially approved for that purpose by an Inspector of the Board and there immediately slaughtered.

RETURN of OUTBREAKS of SWINE-FEVER for the Week ended 16th May, 1903.
