For the purposes of the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 and 1888, and of the Electric Lighting (Scotland) Act, 1890, and all Provisional Orders and Licences made and issued thereunder, the

Board of Trade approve of the pattern and construction of the meter (hereinafter described) for the measurement of electrical energy when supplied on the constant potential alternating current system, namely :-

Order made under Section 27 (2) of the Education Act, 1902.

Whereas by Sub-section (2) of Section 27 of the Education Act, 1902 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that the Act shall, except as expressly provided, come into operation on the appointed day, and the appointed day shall be the twenty-sixth day of March, nineteen hundred and three, or such other day, not being more than eighteen months later, as the Board of Education may appoint, and different days may be appointed for different purposes and for different provisions of the Act and for different Councils.

And whereas by Order dated the sixteenth day of March, nineteen hundred and three, the Board of Education have fixed the first day of April, nineteen hundred and three, as the appointed day for the purposes of Sub-section (5)of Section 23 of the Act.

And whereas by Order dated the fifteenth day of May, nineteen hundred and three, the Board of Education have fixed as the appointed day for the Council of the borough of Ryde for all other purposes and provisions of the Act, the first day of July, nineteen hundred and three, or such later day or days as the Board might for any such purpose or provision for the said Council thereafter appoint.

Now, therefore, the Board of Education, pursuant to the Act and to every other power enabling them in that behalf, hereby appoint as the appointed day for the Council of the said borough of Ryde for all purposes and provisions of the Act, except for the purposes of Subsection (5) of Section 23 aforesaid, the thirtieth day of September, nineteen hundred and three, or such later day or days as the Board may for any such other purpose or provision for the said Council hereafter appoint.

After the animals shall have been landed the said vessel shall, if instructions to such effect be given by an Inspector of the Board, proceed to sea for a preliminary cleansing and disinfection of the parts of the vessel used for animals, subject to such supervision as the Board may require, and in accordance with any instructions given by an Inspector of the Board.
