The following Address of the Ministers and Elders of the Church of Scotland convened in General Assembly having been transmitted by His Grace the Lord High Commissioner to the Right Honourable Lord Balfour of Burleigh, K.T., His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, has been by him laid before the King, who was pleased to receive the same very graciously :--To the King's Most Excellent Majesty. May it place Your Majesty.

May it please Your Majesty. We, Your Majesty's faithful and loyal subjects the Ministers and Elders of the Church of Scotland convened in General Assembly, have received with feelings of deepest gratitude Your Majesty's most gracious Letter sent to us through Ilis Grace the Lord High Commissioner.

That our meeting and proceedings are of so much interest to Your Majesty will be a further encouragement for us to labour for the moral and spiritual welfare of the people committed to our charge.

We received with gladness Your Majesty's renewed assurances of your fixed determination to maintain the Church of Scotland as by law established in the full and free enjoyment of its rights and privileges.

If anything were needed to deepen our loyalty it would be found in the confirmation given of these assurances by Your Majesty's joining in our National worship during your residence in the Highlands.

To us as to all Your subjects throughout the Empire Your Majesty's restoration to health, and the great solemnity of the Coronation of Your Majesties caused profound thankfulness and joy.

We beg leave to assure Your Majesty that the recent visit of Your Majesty and our Gracious Queen Alexandra gave unbounded satisfaction to the people of Scotland.

The General Assembly congratulates itself on the appointment of the Right Honourable the Earl of Leven and Melville as Lord High Com-

missioner. His selection by Your Majesty as the representative of the Sovereign is peculiarly acceptable, and our grateful recollections of his uniform courtesy on former occasions make his return amongst us doubly welcome.

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We gratefully accept Your Majesty's generous gift of two thousand pounds and assure Your Majesty that it will be our care to administer it so as to further the ends for which it has been bestowed.

We pray that He by whom Kings reign and Princes decree justice may bestow in rich abundance on Your Majesty, our Gracious Queen Alexandra, and all the members of the Royal House the blessing that cometh from above, that Your Majesty's throne may be established in righteousness, and that You may be long spared in health and happiness to reign over a loyal,

In heatin and nappliess to reign over a trya, prosperous, and religious people. May it please Your Majesty Your Majesty's most faithful and loyal subjects the Ministers and Elders of the Church of Scotland convened in General Assembly.

FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

In pursuance of section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Home Department proposes, at the expiration of 40 days from the publication of this notice, to make an Order under section 40 (4) of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, extending the exceptions in that section which permit young persons to have the meal hours at different times, and to remain during meal times in rooms in which a manufacturing process is being carried on, to male young persons employed in iron and steel foundries in Scotland.

Order made under Section 27 (2) of the Education Act, 1902.

Whereas by Sub-section (2) of Section 27 of the Education Act, 1902 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that the Act shall, except as expressly provided, come into operation on the appointed day, and the appointed day shall be the twenty-sixth day of March, nineteen hundred and three, or such other day, not being more than eighteen months later, as the Board of Education may appoint, and different days may be appointed for different purposes and for different provisions of the Act and for different Councils.

And whereas by Order dated the sixteenth day of March, nineteen hundred and three, the Board of Education have fixed the first day of April, nineteen hundred and three, as the appointed day for the purposes of Sub-section (5)of Section 23 of the Act.

And whereas by Orders dated the twenty-fourth day of March and the twenty-eighth day of April, nineteen hundred and three, the Board of Education have fixed as the appointed day for each of the Councils named in the first. column of the Schedule to this Order for all other purposes and provisions of the Act the day specified in each case in the second column of the said Schedule, or such later day or days

as the Board might for any such purpose or provision for any such Council thereafter appoint.

Now, therefore, the Board of Education, pursuant to the Act and to every other power enabling them in that behalf, hereby appoint as the appointed day for each of the Councils aforesaid for all purposes and provisions of the Act, except for the purposes of Sub-section (5) of Section 23 aforesaid, the day specified in each case in the third column of the Schedule to this Order, or such later day or days as the Board may for any such other purpose or provision for any such Council hereafter appoint.

Statutes of the Distinguished Service Order. EDWARD, R. & I.

EDWARD, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, Sovereign of the Distinguished Service Order, to all to whom these presents shall come, greeting.

Whereas Her late Majesty, Our Beloved Mother, Queen Victoria, by a Warrant under

Her Royal Sign Manual, countersigned by one of Her Principal Secretaries of State, and bearing date at Her Court at Balmoral the sixth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, in the fiftieth year of Her reign, did institute and create a new naval and military order of distinction, to be styled and designated the "Distinguished Service Order."

And whereas by the said Royal Warrant it was, among other things, ordained that the said Order should rank next to, and immediately after, Our Order of the Indian Empire, and that the badge of the Order should have on the reverse Her late Majesty's Imperial and Royal Cypher, V.R.I.

And whereas We have thought fit to signify Our Royal Will and Pleasure that the said Order shall rank next to, and immediately after, Our Royal Victorian Order, and that the badge shall have on the reverse Our Imperial and Royal Cypher, E.R.I.

Now, therefore, We do, by these presents for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, ordain and appoint: Firstly, that the Distinguished Service Order shall rank next to, and immediately after, Our Royal Victorian Order, and that the companions thereof shall, in all places and assemblies whatsoever, have place and precedency next to, and immediately after, the members of Our said Royal Victorian Order, and shall rank among themselves according to the dates of their respective nominations. Secondly, that the badge of the Order, which shall consist of a gold cross, enamelled white, edged gold, having on one side thereof in the centre, within a wreath of laurel, enamelled green, the Imperial Crown in gold, upon a red enamelled ground, and on the reverse, within a similar wreath, and on a similar red ground, Our Imperial and Royal Cypher, E.R.I., shall be suspended from the left breast by a red riband, edged blue, of one inch in width.
