The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth chapter seventy-seven, and of the Act of the fifth year of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria (Session two) chapter twenty-six, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date |

the twenty-eighth day of May, in the year one thousand nine hundred and three, in the words 

England in pursuance of the Act of the sixth William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, and of the Act of the fifth year of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria (Session two) chapter twenty-six have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for authorizing certain further additions and improvements at the episcopal residence belonging to the See of Bath and Wells which is situate at Wells in the county of Somerset.

"Whereas the Right Reverend George Wynd-ham now Bishop of the diocese of Bath and Wells is desirous that certain additions and improvements should be made at the said episcopal residence at Wells that is to say, the restoration of the Gatehouse known as the Bishop's Eye leading to the said episcopal residence and has submitted to us the particulars of such proposed improvements and we have signified our general approval of the same.

"And whereas the said Bishop is also desirous and it appears to us to be expedient that towards the cost of effecting the said proposed additions and improvements a sum not exceeding four hundred pounds (being a sum which with certain moneys already borrowed upon the same security under the authority of the Statutes hereinbefore mentioned does not exceed two years' income of the See) should be provided by borrowing the same by way of further mortgage upon the security of all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to the Bishoprick of Bath and Wells.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said George Wyndham Bishop of the said diocese of Bath and Wells (testified by his having affixed his signature and episcopal seal to this scheme) We the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for

England humbly recommend and propose that the said Bishop be authorized to borrow from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne and that the said Governors be empowered to lend under the provisions of the above-mentioned Acts a further sum not exceeding four hundred pounds and that as a security for the same the said Bishop do mortgage all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments and endowments or empluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to his said See to the said Governors by deed for the term of thirty-five years or until the said sum of four hundred pounds or such lesser sum as may be advanced with the interest for the same as hereinafter mentioned and all costs and charges which may attend the recovery thereof shall be fully paid and satisfied and that such principal sum shall be repaid with interest in manner following that is to say during and in respect of the first period of twelve months of the said term computed from the day of the date of the mortgage no part of the said principal sum shall be repayable but the said Bishop or his successors shall yearly at the end of the second period of twelve months so computed and at the end of every such like period of twelve months thereafter pay to the said Governors their successors or assigns one-thirtieth part of the said principal sum of four hundred pounds or of such lesser sum as may be advanced until the whole thereof shall be repaid and shall also at the end of the first and each succeeding period of twelve months computed as aforesaid pay interest at the rate of four pounds per centum per annum on the said principal sum or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid; and that if and when it shall happen that either the principal or the interest directed to be paid as hereinbefore mentioned shall be in arrear and unpaid for the space of forty days after the same shall have become due, it shall and may be lawful for the said Governors their successors and assigns to recover the same and the costs and charges attending the recovery thereof by distress and sale in the like manner as rents may be recovered by landlords or lessors from their tenants by the laws in force at the time of such distress and sale and that such mortgage deed shall be in the form and to the effect to be approved by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners and shall bind as well the said George Wyndham now Bishop of the said diocese of Bath and Wells as every succeeding Bishop of the same diocese until the principal money and interest costs and charges shall have been paid off and discharged.

"And we further recommend and propose that the said sum of four hundred pounds or such lesser sum as may be advanced shall be paid to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners and that the receipt of our Joint Treasurers for the time being indorsed on the said mortgage deed shall be a good and sufficient discharge of the said Governors and their successors for the same who shall not be bound or required to see to the application thereof and that upon the receipt of the said sum of four hundred pounds or such lesser sum as may be advanced the whole or any part or parts thereof shall be applied by us at such time or times and in such manner as shall appear to us to be expedient towards effecting the said proposed additions and improvements at the episcopal residence aforesaid.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in conformity with the provisions of the herein-

named Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Bath and Wells. "We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter fifty and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and twenty-four have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting an exchange of the patronage of the benefice (being a rectory) of Bawdeswell situate in the county of Norfolk and in the benefice (being a rectory) of Wolferton situate in the said county of Norfolk and in the said diocese of Norwich.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Bawdeswell is vested in Your Majesty as part of Your Majesty's private estates.

"And whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Wolferton is vested in the Bishop of Norwich for the time being.

"And whereas it has been signified to us that it is the desire of Your Majesty and that it is the desire of the Right Reverend John now Bishop of Norwich that the patronage of the said two benefices of Bawdeswell and Wolferton may be rearranged by way of exchange in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas we have made due inquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative value of the said two benefices and of the patronage thereof respectively and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council that the circumstances and present values of the said two benefices and rectories are as set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed.

"Now therefore with the consent of Your Majesty and with the consent of the said John Bishop of Norwich acting as such Bishop (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and has affixed his episcopal seal thereto) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Bawdeswell and the church thereof shall be assigned and transferred from Your Majesty and shall become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said John Bishop of Norwich and his successors in the same bishoprick for ever and that in exchauge for the same the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Wolferton and the church thereof shall in like

manner and upon and from the same date be assigned and transferred from the said John Bishop of Norwich and from his successors in the same bishoprick and shall become and be absolutely vested in Your Majesty as part of Your Majesty's private estates and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by Your Majesty Your heirs and assigns for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and fourteen duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the seventh day of May, in the year one thousand nine hundred and three, in the words and figures following, that is to say :--

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Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine and of the Acts therein mentioned that is to say the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty chapter thirty-nine and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and fourteen have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Saint Stephen, Selly Hill, in the county of Worcester and in the diocese of Worcester.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Stephen, Selly Hill is vested in Edward Gem of Sherwood House, Worcester, in the said county of Worcester Esquire and Thomas Harrison of Highfield, Selly Hill in the said county of Worcester Gentleman as Trustees for the period of their lives and of the life of the survivor of them and afterwards in the vicar or Incumbent for the time being of the vicarage of the new parish of Saint Mary, Selly Oak in the said county of Worcester and in the said diocese of Worcester.

"And whereas the said Edward Gem, the said Thomas Harrison and the Reverend Clement René Sharpe Clerk in Holy Orders, now vicar or Incumbent of the said vicarage of Saint Mary, Selly Oak are desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Stephen, Selly Hill now vested in them as aforesaid should be transferred to and be vested in the Reverend Hanmer William Webb-Peploe, a Prebendary of the Cathedral Church of Saint Paul in London and vicar of the vicarage of Saint Paul, Onslowsquare in the city of Westminster, the Reverend James Hardy Honeyburne, Clerk in Holy Orders and Honorary Canon of Liverpool of Abbotsbury Number 23 Duke-street, Southport, in the county of Lancaster John Henry Buxton of Hunsdon Bury Ware in the county of Hertford Esquire the Reverend John William Diggle, Clerk in Holy Orders of the Rectory, Birmingham in the county of Warwick and Hugh Arthur Nind Smith of Number one Saint Philip's-place Birmingham aforesaid Esquire and their heirs and assigns.

"And whereas the Right Reverend Charles now Bishop of the said diocese of Worcester has executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned in token that such transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary.

"And whereas in consideration of the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of Saint Stephen Selly Hill which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed a sum of five hundred pounds has been paid to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England for the augmentation of the endowment of the said benefice of Saint Stephen Selly Hill and this circumstance will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists that is to say in the new parish of Saint Stephen Selly Hill.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Edward Gem, Thomas Harrison and Clement René Sharpe (in testimony whereof they have respectively signed and sealed this scheme) and with the consent of the said Charles Bishop of the said diocese of Worcester (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal) and with the consent of the said Hanmer William Webb-Peploe, James Hardy Honeyburne, John Henry Buxton, John William Diggle, and Hugh Arthur Nind Smith (in testimony whereof they have respec-tively signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Guzette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Stephen, Selly Hill now vested in them the said Edward Gem and Thomas Harrison for their lives and for the life of the survivor of them and afterwards in the vicar or Incumbent of the said vicarage of Saint Mary, Selly Oak and his successors in perpetuity as aforesaid shall be transferred from them to the said Hanmer William Webb-Peploe, James Hardy Honeyburne, John Henry Buxton, John William Diggle and Hugh Arthur Nind Smith and their heirs and assigns and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Hanmer William Webb-Peploe, James Hardy Honeyburne, John Henry Buxton, John William Diggle and Hugh Arthur Nind Smith and their heirs and assigns for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council : now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law inmediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Worcester. "We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty chapter ninety-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Aldhelm, situate at Tanners End, in the parish of Edmonton, in the county of Middlesex, and in the diocese of London.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said parish of Edmonton and of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Upper Edmonton in the said county and diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such parish and new parish.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said parish of Edmonton and of the said new parish of Upper Edmonton should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Aldhelm situate as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, as such Bishop (in testimouy whereof he has signed and sealed this representation) and with the consent of the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Saint Paul in London; as the patrons of the vicarage of the said parish of Edmonton, and also as the patrons of the vicarage of the said new parish of Upper Edmonton (in testimony whereof they have affixed their common or capitular seal to this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said parish of Edmonton and of the said new parish of Upper Edmonton which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Aldhelm situate at Tanners End in the said parish of Edmonton as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Aldhelm Edmonton.'

"We therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Aldhelm Edmouton, being :----

"I. All that portion of the parish of Edmonton in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London which is bounded upon the south and upon the south-west by the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Upper Edmonton, upon the west by the new parish of Winchmore Hill, both in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides that is to say upon the north and upon the east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Winchmore Hill from the parish of Edmonton at the point where Firs-lane is joined by the footpath leading to Edmonton parish church and extending thence first eastward and then north-eastward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of seventy-one chains or thereabouts to its junction with Sweet Briar-lane and extending thence southward along the middle of Sweet Briar-lane for a distance of thirty-four chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Tanners End upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Edmonton from the said new parish of Upper Edmonton.

"II. And also all that portion of the said new parish of Upper Edmonton which is bounded upon the south by the parish of Tottenham, upon the south-west and upon the north-west by the consolidated chapelry of Saint Michael at Bowes, Southgate, both in the said county and diocese upon the north-east partly by the said new parish of Winchmore Hill, and partly by the said parish of Edmonton, and upon the remaining side, that is to say upon the east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Edmonton from the said new parish cf Upper Edmonton at the junction of Wyerhall-10ad with Bull-lane and extending thence southward along the middle of Bull-lane and along the middle of its continuation in the footpath leading to Queen-street for a distance of forty-three chains or thereabouts to the junction of the said footpath with Queen-street upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Upper Edmonton from the said parish of Tottenham.

And whereas the said representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of London.

for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirtyseven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fourteenth day of May, in the year one thousand nine hundred and three, in the words following, that is to say :—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter one hundred and thirteen of the Act of the sixth and seventh years or Her said late Majesty chapter thirty-seven and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and four have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint John Horninglow in the county of Statford and in the diocese of Lichfield.

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said new parish of Saint John Horninglow is a new parish wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said new parish of Saint John Horninglow which is hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district in the manner which is hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship.

"And whereas a sum of four thousand three hundred pounds sterling has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England towards the endowment of the district hereinafter recommended to be constituted and as soon as the said district shall have become a new parish under the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act then of the said new parish and towards the maintenance of the minister or Incumbent thereof for the time being and we have in respect of such sum agreed and have undertaken to provide and pay by equal quarterly payments on the first day of February the first day of May the first day of August and the first day of November in each and every year to such minister or Incumbent as aforesaid when duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the lastly-mentioned Act the sum of one hundred and twenty-nine pounds per annum so long as the said capital sum shall remain in our hands.

"And whereas the said capital sum of four thousand three hundred pounds sterling has been so contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that we should grant out of the common fund created by the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act a capital sum of seven hundred pounds sterling in respect of which there shall be paid by us to the minister or Incumbent for the time being of the said proposed district or new parish when duly licensed as before mentioned a yearly sum of twenty-one pounds and upon the further understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) we should recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council that the whole right of patronage of the said district or new parish and the nomination of the minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas the said grant of seven hundred pounds sterling will after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme be made and secured by an instrument to be executed by us the said Commissioners under our common seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and eleven.

"The District Chapelry of Ystalyfera being :----"All that part of the parish of Llanguicke, otherwise Llangiwg, in the county of Glamorgan, and in the diocese of Saint David's, which is bounded upon the south-east by the parish of Cilybebyll, in the said county of Glamorgan, and in the diocese of Llandaff, upon the east and upon the north-east by the parish of Ystradgynlais, in the county of Brecknock, and in the said diocese of Saint David's, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-west and upon the south-west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Ystradgynlais from the said parish of Llan-guicke, otherwise Llangiwg, at a point in the middle of the roadway or footpath leading from Gwys Railway Station to Pen-rhiw-fawr, at or near the south-western end of the bridge which carries such roadway or footpath across the river called Afon Twrch, and extending thence southwestward along the middle of the said roadway or footpath for a distance of twenty-six chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading to Gors-y-garanod, and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of twenty chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading L S

to the houses called Llwyncelyn and Bryn-haul, aud extending thence south-westward and in a straight line for a distance of forty-eight chains or thereabouts to the point where the stream flowing through Gors-y-garanod Wood and the stream which flows past the said house called Llwyncelyn, join to form the stream which flows through Cwm-du, and extending thence first south-westward and then south-eastward along the middle of the said stream which flows through Cwm-du for a distance of three miles and thirty-six chains or thereabouts to the junction of such stream with the River Tawe, and extending thence southward along the middle of the River Tawe for a distance of twenty chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said parish of Llanguicke, otherwise Llangiwg, from the said parish of Cilybebyll."

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And whereas the said representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council : now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Saint David's. *A. The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THEREAS by the Coroners Act, 1844, it is W (amongst other things) enacted that when and as often as it shall seem expedient to the Justices of any County that such County should be divided into two or more districts for the purposes of that Act, or that any alteration should be made of any division theretofore made under that Act, it shall be lawful for the said Justices in General or Quarter Sessions assembled to resolve that a petition shall be presented to His Majesty, praying that such division or alteration be made, and thereupon to adjourn the further consideration of such petition until notice thereof shall be given to the Coroner or Coroners of such County as thereinafter provided. And that the Clerk of the Peace shall give notice of any such resolution to every Coroner for such County, and of the time when the petition will be taken by the said Justices into consideration, and the Justices shall confer with every such Coroner who shall attend the meeting of the Justices for that purpose touching such petition, having due regard to the size and nature of each proposed district, the number of the inhabitants, the nature of their employment, and such other circumstances as shall appear to the Justices fit to be considered in carrying into execution the provisions of the said Act; and such petition, with a description of the several proposed districts and of the boundaries thereof, with the reasons upon which the petition is founded, shall be certified to His Majesty under the hands and seals of two or more of the Justices present when such petition shall be agreed to, and the Ulerk of the Peace for such County shall forthwith give or send a true copy of such petition certified under his hand to every Coroner for such County. And that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, if He shall think fit, with the advice of His Privy Council, after taking into consideration any such petition, and also any petition which may be presented to Him by any Coroner of the same County concerning such proposed division or alteration, or whenever it shall seem fit to His Majesty to direct the issue of a Writ de Coronatore Eligendo for the purpose of authorizing the election of an additional Coroner above the number of those who have been theretofore customarily elected in such County, to order that such County shall be divided into such and so many districts for the purposes of the said Act as to His Majesty, with the advice aforesaid, shall seem expedient, and to give a name to each of such districts, and every such Order shall be published in the London Gazette.

And whereas by the Local Government Act, 1888, the powers and business of the said Justices in respect of the matters aforesaid in each County were transferred to the Council of such County.

And whereas by the Yorkshire Coroners Act 1897 it is enacted that, for all the purposes of the Coroners Acts 1844, 1860, 1887 and 1892, the Ridings of Yorkshire shall respectively be separate counties and the County Council of each Riding shall, to the exclusion of any other authority, be the County Authority for all the purposes of those Acts.

And whereas by an Order in Council made the twenty-sixth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, under the provisions of the hereinbefore first recited Act such parts of the County of York as were not excepted by the operation of the 27th Section of the hereinbefore first recited Act were divided into ten districts for Coroners' purposes and for the purposes of the said Act, which said districts were named respectively the York District, the Selby District, the Doncaster District, the Rotherham District, the Wakefield District, the Halifax District, the Craven District, the Northern District, the Pickering District, and the East Riding District, and comprised respectively the several places named and set forth in the Schedule to the said Order in Council.

And whereas by a further Order in Council dated the third day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, and made under the same provisious as amended by the Local Government Act 1888, and subject to the same exceptions as the said last-mentioned Order of the twenty-sixth day of April one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, the County of York was divided into fifteen districts for Coroner's purposes and for the purposes of the said first recited Act, which said districts were named respectively the York Coroner's District, and (in the West Riding of the said County) the Selby Coroner's District, the Bishopthorpe Coroner's District, the Doucaster Coroner's Coroner's District, District, the Rotherham Coroner's District, the Wakefield Coroner's District, the Halifax Coroner's District, the Craven Coroner's District, the Kirby Malzeard Coroner's District, and (in the North Riding of the said County) the Northern Coroner's District, the Flaxton Coroner's District, the Pickering Coroner's District, and (in the East Riding of the said County) the East Riding Coroner's District, the Escrick Coroner's District and the Bubwith Coroner's District, which said Districts respectively comprised the places set forth in the Schedule to the said Order in Council.

And whereas a petition dated the twentyeighth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and three, was presented to His Majesty by the County Council of the North Riding of Yorkshire praying that upon the next avoidance of the office of Coroner of the Northern Coroner's District, the Coroners' Districts in the North Riding of Yorkshire might be altered so that such parts of the North Riding of Yorkshire as were not

excepted by the operation of the twenty-seventh section of the hereinbefore first recited Act, might be divided into three districts for Coroners' purposes to be named respectively-

1. The Northern Coroner's District. 2. The Flaxton Coroner's District.

3. The Pickering Coroner's District.

And whereas the said petition with a description of the said proposed districts and of the boundaries thereof, with the reasons upon which the said petition is founded, has been duly certi-

fied to His Majesty. And whereas all the provisions in that behalf of the hereinbefore first-recited Act have been duly complied with.

And whereas John Stamford Walton, one of His Majesty's Coroners for the county of York has petitioned His Majesty that the parish or place of High Worsall be included amongst the parishes and places in the Northern Coroner's District.

And whereas no other Coroner for the said county has presented a petition to His Majesty.

And whereas His Majesty has, with the advice of His Privy Council, taken into consideration the petition of the said County Council and also the petition of the said John Stamford Walton, and is minded to make such alteration as aforesaid.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased to order, direct, and declare, as it is 

of Coroner of the Northern Coroner's District aforesaid, the Coroners' Districts in the North Riding of Yorkshire shall be divided into three districts for Coroners' purposes, and for the purposes of the Coroners Act 1844.

2. That the said three districts shall be named respectively :-

(i) The Northern Coroner's District

(ii) The Flaxton Coroner's District

(iii) The Pickering Coroner's District;

and that the said districts shall respectively comprise the several parishes and places named and set forth in the Schedule hereto.

3. That this Order shall be published in the London Gazette. A. W. FitzRoy.

In the said burial-ground in any grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place the burial may be allowed, at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground, of the body of any person for whom, or of any member of a family for which, such grave has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place with the exclusive right of burial therein.

with the exclusive right of burial therein. CRUCKTON.—Forthwith and entirely in the Church of Saint Thomas, Uruckton, in the civil parish of Pontesbury, and in the churchyard.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representations, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, on the first day of August next:

The following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, &c., of the Urban District Council of Bromley, and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882:—

Corporations Act, 1882:---Whereas by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882," it is enacted that where a Petition for a Charter of Incorporation is referred to the Committee of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and it is proposed by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Act to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter, the said Committee of Council may settle a scheme for the purposes in the said Act named, and containing such provisions as are in the said Act particularized.

And whereas certain inhabitant householders of the Urban District of Bromley, in the county of Kent, in the month of April, one thousand nine hundred and two, did present to His Most Gracious Majesty King Edward VII a Petition praying for the grant of a Charter of Incorporation.

And whereas the said Petition for a Charter was referred to the Committee of Council, and it was proposed by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter.

And whereas in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven "The Local Government Act, 1858," came into force in the Parish of Bromley in the said County, and the said Parish of Bromley became a district within the meaning of such Act, under the jurisdiction of the Bromley Local Board.

And whereas on the twenty-first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventyfour, the Local Board became the Burial Board for the Parish of Bromley, except such parts as were comprised within the Ecclesiastical Districts of Holy Trinity, Bromley Common, St. Mary's Plaistow, and St. Luke's Bromley Common.

And whereas on the twenty-first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, certain freehold land was conveyed to the Bromley Local Board as the said Burial Board for the purpose of a burial ground for the said District.

And whereas on the fourth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and two, certain freehold land was conveyed to the Urban District Council of Bromley as the burial board aforesaid for the purpose of an additional burial ground.

And whereas a table of fees chargeable by such Burial Board was approved and allowed by Her late Majesty's Secretary of State for the Home Department on the fifth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, and the same is now in force within the Urban District of Bromley.

And whereas by several indentures dated respectively the tenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, the ninth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, the fourth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, and the twenty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, certain pleasure grounds, known as "Martin's Hill," "Queen's Mead," "Whitehall," and the "White Hart Field" (now known as "Queen's Garden"), were conveyed to the Bromley Local Board and the Urban District Council of Bromley respectively for the purposes in the said deeds contained.

And whereas in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two certain land formerly used as a gravel pit came into the possession of the Bromley Local Board, and was by the said Board transformed into a pleasure ground, and is now known as "Oakley-road" Pleasure Ground, and the same is now vested in the Urban District Council of Bromley.

And whereas under the provisions of the West Kent Main Sewerage Act, 1875, section fifty-one, and by Articles of Agreement dated the fourth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, and made between the West Kent Main Sewerage Board and the Bromley Local Board the said Bromley Local Board became a constituent authority for the purposes of the said Act (and the Acts amending the said Act) and entitled to send three members to represent them on the Board thereby created.

And whereas by a Provisional Order of the Local Government Bcard, made on the twentyninth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, and confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (Brentford Union, &c.) Act, 1881, as amended by the Provisional Order of the Local Government Board made on the twenty-fourth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, and confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 9) Act, 1896, the Bromley Local Board, as the Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of Bromley, were included in an united district to be called the Bromley and Beckenham Joint Hospital District. And whereas the said Bromley Local Board were entitled to be represented on such Joint Board by the Chairman of the said Bromley Local Board (now the Urban District Council) and two elective Members.

1. The "Infectious Disease (Prevention) Act, 1890," on the twenty-fifth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety.

- 2. The "Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890," with the exception of parts 1 and 4 of that Act, on the sixth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety.
- 3. The "Public Libraries Act, 1892," and took the poll required by the said Act on the fourteenth day of May, one thousand eight. hundred and ninety-two.

and the same are now in force within the urban district of Bromley.

And whereas by a Provisional Order of the Board of Trade, being the Bromley (Kent) Electric Lighting Order, 1891, made under the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 and 1888, and confirmed by the Electric Lighting Orders Confirmation (No. 5) Act, 1891, the Bromley Local Board were empowered to supply electrical energy within the urban district of Bromley for all public and private purposes as defined by the Electric Lighting Act, 1882, and for such purpose to acquire and use lands subject to the limitations therein specified.

And whereas on the second day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, the said Urban District Council transferred the said Provisional Order to the Bromley (Kent) Electric Light and Power Company Limited for the term therein mentioned subject to the right of the said Urban District Council to determine the same within six months after the expiration of any period of seven years from that date, and such transfer was approved by the Board of Trade on the ninth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight.

And whereas under the provisions of "The Local Government Act, 1858," and Acts amend-ing the same, the Local Board for the District of Bromley, acting as the Urban Sanitary Authority, and the Urban District Council of Bromley, respectively from time to time made bye-laws for the better government of the District, viz., for the prevention of danger from whirligigs and swings and from the use of firearms in shooting galleries (seventh July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one); with respect to telegraph and other wires (sixteenth February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two); with respect to slaughter-houses (twenty-eighth September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven); with respect to (1) the prevention of nuisances arising from snow, filth, &c., and the keeping of animals, and (2) with respect to the removal or carriage through the streets of any fœcal or offensive or noxious matter or liquid (ninth November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven); with respect to common lodging-houses (ninth November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven); with respect to the cleansing of earth closets, privies, ash-pits and cesspools (twenty-ninth March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight); with respect to new streets and buildings (nineteenth July, one thousand eight hundred and ninetyeight); with respect to the Whitehall Pleasure Ground (nineteenth June, one thousand nine hundred); with respect to the Public Pleasure Grounds known respectively as "Martin's Hill" Pleasure Ground, the "Queen's Mead" Pleasure Ground, the "Oakley-road" Pleasure Ground and the "White Hart Field" Pleasure Ground (now called Queen's Garden) (fifteenth January, one thousand nine hundred and one), all of which were duly allowed by the Local Government Board and the same are now in force in the Urban District of Bromley.

And whereas under the provisions of the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1886, and the Dairies, Cow Sheds and Milk Shops Order of 1885, of section 21 of the Public Health Act, 1875, the Urban District Council of Bromley on the first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, and the tenth day of April, one thousand nine hundred, respectively made regulations (1) with respect to dairies, cow sheds and milk shops, and (2) as to the mode in which communications between drains and public sewers are to be made, and the same are now in force within the Urban District of Bromley.

And whereas by the Technical Instruction Act. 1889, the Bromley Local Board became the Local Authority under the said Act. And whereas prior to the passing of the said Act a School of Science and Art had been erected by public subscription. And whereas such School was on the twenty-eighth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, transferred by the Trustees and Managers thereof to the Bromley Local Board, and the same is now vested in and maintained by the Urban District Council of Bromley.

And whereas under and by virtue of "The Local Government Act, 1894," the Local Board for the District of Bromley became the Urban District Council for the Urban District of Bromley, and the Parish of Bromley was then and is now co-extensive with the Urban District of Bromley.

And whereas by an Order of the Kent County Council, dated the nineteenth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and two, a portion of the boundary between the Urban District of Bromley and the Urban District of Beckenham was re-arranged, and such Order was confirmed by the Local Government Board on the twentieth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and two.

And whereas by Orders made by the Local Government Board on the sixth and nineteenth days of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, and the seventeenth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and one respectively, under the provisions of section 33 of "The Local Government Act, 1894," (1) the powers and duties of appointing and revoking the appointment of Assistant Overseer, (2) the powers and duties of appointing Overseers, and (3) certain powers of a Vestry, were conferred on the Urban District Council of Bromley, and the same are now in force therein.

And whereas by the Metropolis Water Act, 1902, the Urban District Council of Bromley, being situate within the area of supply of the Company of Proprietors of the Kent Water Works, the said Council is entitled to elect four members to the Joint Committee for appointing a Member of the Water Board as provided in Schedule III, clause 9 (II) of the said recited Act.

And whereas the Education Act, 1902, will have come into force in the District of Bromley at the date of the commencement of this Scheme and the Urban District Council of Bromley will then be the Local Education Authority for the said district.

And whereas by an Order of the High Court of Justice, Chancery Division, dated the fourteenth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and two, and made in an action "1891, D. No. 211. In the matter of the estate of Emily Dowling deceased Between Alexander Nelson Radcliffe and Francis Reynolds Yonge Radcliffe plaintiffs and George Frederick Prescott and His Majesty's Attorney-General defendants" a scheme was sanctioned by Mr. Justice Swinfen Eady in reference to certain property situate in the High-street, Bromley, and known as "Neelgherries," and which property had been bequeathed by the said Emily Dowling by her

Will dated the thirteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, to the Trustees thereof for the benefit of the inhabitants of the Parish of Bromley. And by the said Order and Scheme it was directed that the Bromley Urban District Council should be the Governing Body of the Technical and Industrial Institute which by such scheme was directed to be provided and that the Trustees of the said will should convey the said property to the Bromley Urban District Council. And whereas a conveyance of the said property was duly executed by the said Trustees on the seventh day of April, one thousand nine hundred and three. And whereas by the said Order and scheme it was further provided that the said Trustees should invest certain sums in the said Order and scheme specified, and should pay the income arising therefrom to the said Urban District Council for the purpose of such Institution.

And whereas this scheme before being settled by the Committee of Council was referred for consideration to the Home Office the Local Government Board and the Board of Education.

And whereas it is expedient that a scheme should be made and settled containing the provisions hereinafter set forth.

Now therefore pursuant to "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882," and every other power enabling them in that behalf the Committee of Council have settled a scheme containing the provisions herein, and do hereby direct order and declare as follows:—

# Short Title.

This scheme may be cited for all purposes as "The Borough of Bromley Scheme 1903."

# Commencement of Scheme.

This scheme when confirmed shall be deemed to have come into operation on the day of the first meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough created by the said Charter and this scheme shall be construed and applied as if it had been dated and confirmed by Parliament or Order in Council on the day before the day of the said first meeting and everything thereunder shall be done and had accordingly. This date is herein referred to as "the commencement of this Scheme." So far as may be necessary this Scheme shall operate retrospectively.

The Municipal Borough created by the said Charter shall from and after the commencement of this Scheme be placed and thenceforward be under the jurisdiction of the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Bromley acting by the Council of the Borough as the Sanitary Authority for the said borough.

# Dissolution of Urban District Council.

The Urban District Council of Bromley and their powers, privileges, duties, rights, obligations and liabilities shall continue and be deemed to have continued to exist until the commencement of this scheme, unaffected in any manner whatsoever by the grant of the said charter or the creation of the said borough, and immediately from and after the commencement of this scheme the Urban District Council of Bromley shall be and the same are hereby abolished and shall thenceforth be dissolved and cease to exist.

# Transfer of Jurisdiction, Powers, Rights, Property, &c.

All the jurisdictions, powers, duties, and property vested in or possessed by the Urban District Council of Bromley, or by any person or body in trust for them or any of their members as such (and not otherwise dealt with, or transferred by or under any part of this Scheme) shall vest in the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Bromley, and shall be held and applied for sanitary and other municipal and public purposes of the said Borough.

All duties and liabilities which, immediately before the commencement of this Scheme, attached to and were enforceable against the Urban District Council of Bromley, or their property, shall attach to and be enforceable against the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Bromley and their property.

Any investigations.legal proceedings, or remedy, in respect of any debt, liability, penalty or forfeiture due to or incurred by or on behalf of the Urban District Council of Bromley before the commencement of this Scheme, may be continued, prosecuted and enforced by or against the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Bromley.

The term "property" in this Scheme means and includes all property, real and personal, and all things in action, and all rights of common and commonable rights, and rights to toll, and all franchises, privileges and rights, and all charters, records, deeds, books, and documents, and all rights and claims to relief, and all rights to avoid contracts or otherwise, and includes any estate or interest, legal or equitable, in or in respect of

any property so defined. The District Fund and the General District Rate of the said Borough shall take the place of, and be substituted for, the District Fund and General District Rate of the Urban District Council of Bromley, and all sums of money respectively payable to, from, or out of, and all liabilities charged upon or attaching to the lastmentioned District Fund and General District Rate of the Urban District, shall be charged upon the District Fund and General District Rate of the Borough.

All the rights, interests, powers, property, obligations and liabilities whatsoever of the District Council acting as the Urban Sanitary Authority of the district of Bromley, by virtue of the following Acts, namely, "The Public Health Act, 1875," "The Infectious Disease (Prevention) Act, 1890," "The Public Health Acts Amendment Act 1890," "The Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890," "The Public Libraries Act, 1892," and any Act amending or extending the same, and any local or general Act for purposes the same or similar to those of the aforesaid Acts, shall be transferred to, vested in, devolve upon, and be exercisable by and shall be enforceable against the Corporation.

The Town Clerk of the borough shall be substituted for and perform the duties of the Clerk to the District Council.

### SWINE-FEVER INFECTED AREAS.

The following Areas are now Areas Infected with Swine-Fever under the above-mentioned Acts :---

- Cumberland.—An Area comprising the petty sessional divisions of Allerdale Below Derwent, Keswick, Derwent (including its detached part), Maryport, and Workington, and the parishes of Harrington, Distington, Parton, Moresby, Hensingham, Weddicar, Arlecdon, Salter and Eskett, and Lamplugh, in the administrative county of Cumberland; and also comprising the boroughs of Whitehaven and Workington (27 Moy, 1903).
- Gloucestershire.—An Area comprising the petty sessional divisions of Cirencester (except the parishes of Winstone, Syde. Brimpsfield, Elkstone, Colesborne, and Rendcomb), Stroud (except the parishes of Miserden, Cranham, Painswick, Pitchcombe, and Whiteshill), Nails-

worth, and Tctbury (except the parish of Didmarton), and the parish of King's Stanl-y, in the administrative county of Gloucester (15 May, 1903).

Isle of Wight.—An Area comprising the administrative county of the Isle of Wight, including the boroughs of Newport and Ryde (4 June, 1903).
