

cation in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Bawdeswell and the church thereof shall be assigned and transferred from Your Majesty and shall become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said John Bishop of Norwich and his successors in the same bishoprick for ever and that in exchange for the same the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Wolferton and the church thereof shall in like

manner and upon and from the same date be assigned and transferred from the said John Bishop of Norwich and from his successors in the same bishoprick and shall become and be absolutely vested in Your Majesty as part of Your Majesty's private estates and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by Your Majesty Your heirs and assigns for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and fourteen duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the seventh day of May, in the year one thousand nine hundred and three, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty

Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine and of the Acts therein mentioned that is to say the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty chapter thirty-nine and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and fourteen have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Saint Stephen, Selly Hill, in the county of Worcester and in the diocese of Worcester.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Stephen, Selly Hill is vested in Edward Gem of Sherwood House, Worcester, in the said county of Worcester Esquire and Thomas Harrison of Highfield, Selly Hill in the said county of Worcester Gentleman as Trustees for the period of their lives and of the life of the survivor of them and afterwards in the vicar or Incumbent for the time being of the vicarage of the new parish of Saint Mary, Selly Oak in the said county of Worcester and in the said diocese of Worcester.

"And whereas the said Edward Gem, the said Thomas Harrison and the Reverend Clement René Sharpe Clerk in Holy Orders, now vicar or Incumbent of the said vicarage of Saint Mary, Selly Oak are desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Stephen, Selly Hill now vested in them as aforesaid should be transferred to and be vested in the Reverend Hamer William Webb-Peploe, a Prebendary of the Cathedral Church of Saint Paul in London and vicar of the vicarage of Saint Paul, Onslow-square in the city of Westminster, the Reverend
