

half or thereabouts to the junction of Plumstead Common-road with Macoma-road and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Macoma-road for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the roadway between the houses known as number 26 and number 28 Macoma-road and leading from Macoma-road to Tuam-road and extending thence south-westward to and along the said roadway for a distance of four chains or thereabouts to its junction with Tuam-road and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Tuam-road for a distance of seven chains and a quarter or thereabouts to its junction with Clay-lane and extending thence south-eastward across Clay-lane to and then along the wall at the backs of the houses and premises on the south-western side of Pendrell-street for a distance of six chains or thereabouts to the south-eastern end of the said wall on the north-western side of Garland-street and extending thence first south-eastward to and then north-eastward along the middle of Garland-street for a distance of ten chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called the Slade (upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Plumstead from the said new parish of Saint Nicholas Plumstead) and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of thirteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Lakedale-road and extending thence northward along the middle of Lakedale-road for a distance of eighteen chains and a half or thereabouts to a point opposite to the wall or fence forming the boundary between Plumstead Common and the house and premises known as number 137 Tewson-road and extending thence north-eastward to and then first north-eastward then northward and then again north-eastward along the wall or fence at the backs of the houses and premises on the eastern side of Tewson-road for a distance of sixteen chains and a quarter or thereabouts to the point where such wall or fence meets the wall or fence at the backs of the houses and premises on the northern side of Tewson-road and extending thence north-westward along the last-mentioned wall or fence for a distance of four chains and a half or thereabouts to the point where such wall or fence meets the wall or fence at the backs of the houses on the eastern side of Lakedale-road and extending thence first southward then westward and then again southward along the last-mentioned wall or fence for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to its southern end upon the northern side of Tewson-road and extending thence first southward to and then westward along the middle of Tewson-road for a distance of one chain or thereabouts to its junction with Lakedale-road and extending thence southward along the middle of Lakedale-road (thereby following the boundary which divides the district chapelry of Saint Paul Plumstead in the said county and diocese from the said new parish of Saint Nicholas Plumstead) for a distance of four chains and a half or thereabouts to the junction of Lakedale-road with Brewery-road and extending thence first south-westward and then north-westward along the middle of Brewery-road (thereby following in parts the last-mentioned boundary and the boundary which divides the said district chapelry of Saint John the Baptist Plumstead from the said new parish of Saint Nicholas Plumstead) for a distance of half a mile or thereabouts to the junction of Brewery-road with Park-road where the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Nicholas Plumstead the said district chapelry of Saint John the Baptist

Plumstead and the said parish of Plumstead all meet at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Rochester.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

WHEREAS by section twenty-six of "The Pluralities Act 1838" after reciting that "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, chapelries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may in some instances with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted "That when with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop or Bishop shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect."
