

"That the inhabitants of the said portion of the benefice of Clydach so to be separated therefrom and united to the benefice of Llanguicke shall be exonerated from all liability (if any exists) to repair the parish church of Clydach or any other church or chapel now or hereafter to be erected belonging to the said benefice of Clydach and such inhabitants of such separated portion shall be entitled to accommodation in the parish church of Llanguicke but shall cease to be entitled to accommodation in the parish church of Clydach.

" CONSENTS.

"I John Lord Bishop of Saint Davids as the patron in right of my See entitled to present or nominate to the benefice of Clydach in the county of Glamorgan on the next vacancy thereof and also as patron in the same right entitled to present to the benefice of Llanguicke in the said county of Glamorgan.

"And I the Right Honourable Arthur James Balfour First Lord Commissioner of the Treasury representing the Crown, being the patron entitled to the alternative presentation or nomination to the said benefice of Clydach.

"And I the Reverend David Williams the Incumbent of the said benefice of Clydach.

"And I the Reverend James Griffiths the Incumbent of the said benefice of Llanguicke.

"Do hereby signify to your Grace our consent to the scheme above proposed for separating the said portion of the benefice of Clydach from that benefice and uniting the same to the adjoining benefice of Llanguicke for ecclesiastical purposes.

"As witness our respective hands this thirty-first day of March one thousand nine hundred and three.

And whereas the said scheme hath been transmitted by the said Bishop to the said Archbishop for his consideration :

And whereas the said Archbishop being satisfied with the said scheme hath certified the same and the consents aforesaid to His Majesty in Council by his report dated the seventh day of April, one thousand nine hundred and three, which said report is in the words and figures following :—

"We the undersigned Randall Thomas Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury do hereby report to your Majesty in Council,

"That the Right Reverend John Bishop of Saint Davids has represented unto us (amongst other things)—

"That there are in the county of Glamorgan and his diocese of Saint Davids the benefice (being a vicarage) of Llanguicke and the benefice (being a perpetual curacy) of Saint John Clydach.

"That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that a certain portion of the said parish of Clydach the boundaries whereof are more particularly described in the scheme and plan hereunto annexed, may be advantageously separated from the said parish of Clydach and annexed to the contiguous parish of Llanguicke for ecclesiastical purposes only under the provisions of the Pluralities Act 1838.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the said Act the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him that the proposed alteration may best be effected and how the changes consequent upon such alteration in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes,

rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested, which scheme together with the consents thereto in writing of the said Lord Bishop being the patron or person entitled to collate to the said benefice of Clydach in case the same were now vacant and the Right Honourable Arthur James Balfour First Lord Commissioner of the Treasury representing the Crown being the patron or person entitled to the alternative presentation or nomination to the said benefice of Clydach and the Reverend David Williams the present Incumbent of the same benefice the said Lord Bishop being the patron or person entitled to collate to the said benefice of Llanguicke in case the same were now vacant and the Reverend James Griffiths the present Incumbent of the same benefice has been transmitted to us by the said Lord Bishop for our consideration.

"The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the consents before referred to are hereunto annexed.

"And we the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the said Pluralities Act 1838 certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying the said scheme into effect.

WHEREAS by section twenty-six of the Pluralities Act 1838 after reciting that "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, chapelries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may in some instances with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted "That when with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church, and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop or Bishop shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration)
