And whereas an Order in Council has been so made in response to a petition from the Council of the Borough of Gateshead and the Right Honourable Aretas Akers-Douglas one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State did accordingly by Warrant under his hand and seal at Whitehall on the twenty-fifth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and three in pursuance of the said section of the said Act appoint William Ellis Hume-Williams Esquire one of His Majesty's Counsel to be a Commissioner to prepare a scheme for determining the boundaries of and for apportioning the Councillors among the wards of the borough of Gateshead the number of such wards having been fixed by the Order of Her late Majesty in Council made on the tenth day of August one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

Now therefore I the said William Ellis Hume-Williams being such Commissioner as aforesaid and in pursuance of the said warrant and appointment hereby declare this to be my scheme for determining the boundaries of the wards of

the Borough of Gateshead and for apportioning the Councillors among the wards so determined. And I hereby fix and determine that the names and the boundaries of the Wards of the borough of Gateshead shall be as follows namely:—

North Ward.

The North Ward shall comprise so much of the borough of Gateshead as is contained within an imaginary line commencing at the boundary of the borough at a point in the River Tyne beneath the centre of the Redheugh Bridge thence by a straight line in a southerly direction to a point in the centre of Redheugh Bridge-road at the south end of the said Redheugh Bridge thence along the centre of Redheugh Bridge-road to a point at the centre of Askew-road opposite the centre of Bank-street thence to and along the centre of Bank-street to a point in the centre of Bensham-road thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Bensham-road to a point in the centre of West-street thence along the centre of West-street to Wellington-street thence along the centre of Wellington-street to a point in the centre of the entrance gateway of the High Level Bridge thence in a straight line to a point in the River Tyne at the borough boundary beneath the centre of the High Level Bridge and thence in a westerly direction along the borough boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.

North-East Ward.

The North-East Ward shall comprise so much of the borough of Gateshead as is contained within an imaginary line commencing from the junction of the borough boundary of the North Ward at a point in the River Tyne beneath the centre of the High Level Bridge thence in an easterly direction along the borough boundary to its eastern extremity thence in a southerly direction along the borough boundary to its intersection with the line of the Newcastle and Sunderland Railway thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of the said railway to a point under the centre of Park-lane Bridge

thence by a vertical line to the centre of Park-lane thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Park-lane to a point in the centre of High-street thence in a northerly direction along the centre of High-street to a point opposite the centre of Jackson-street thence to and along the centre of Jackson-street to the boundary of the North Ward thence in a northerly direction along the boundary of the said North Ward to the point of commencement aforesaid.

North-West Ward.

The North-West Ward shall comprise so much of the borough of Gateshead as is contained within an imaginary line commencing at a point in the River Tyne opposite the centre of the River Team at the north-west corner of the borough boundary thence in an easterly direction along the said boundary to its junction with the North Ward at a point in the River Tyne beneath the centre of the Redheugh Bridge thence in a southerly direction along the boundary of the North Ward to a point under the centre of the bridge over the North Eastern Railway in Redheugh Bridge-road thence by a vertical line to the centre of the said railway thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of that railway to a point under the centre of the railway bridge across Lobley Hill-road thence by a vertical line to the centre of Lobley Hill-road thence in a westerly direction along the centre of that road to a point under the centre of the bridge that carries the roadway across the River Team at the borough boundary thence by a vertical line to the centre of the River Team thence in a north-westerly direction along the borough boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.

Central Ward.

The Central Ward shall comprise so much of the borough of Gateshead as is contained within an imaginary line commencing from a point in the boundary of the North Ward opposite the centre of Bank-street thence in an easterly direction along the boundary of the North Ward to a point in the boundary of the North Ward opposite the centre of West-street thence in a southerly direction along the centre of High West-street to a point opposite the centre of Bewick-road thence to and along the centre of Bewick-road to a point opposite to and in a direct line with the centre of Saint Cuthbert's-place thence to and along the centre of Saint Cuthbert's-place and the footpath that passes along the east side of West View to a point in Bensham-road opposite the centre of the said footpath thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of Bensham-road to the point of commencement aforesaid.

East Central Ward.

The East Central Ward shall comprise so much of the borough of Gateshead as is contained within an imaginary line commencing from a point in the boundary of the Central Ward opposite the centre of Bensham-road thence in an easterly and south-easterly direction along the boundary of the North-East Ward to a point in the centre of the Newcastle and Sunderland Railway opposite to and in a direct line with the centre of Chaucer-street thence along the centre of Chaucer-street to a point in the centre of Sunderland-road thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Sunderland-road to a point opposite the centre of Wordsworth-street thence to and along the centre of Wordsworth-street and Cemetery-road to a point in the centre of High-street opposite the centre of Camilla-street thence to and along the centre of Camilla-street to a point in the centre of High West-street

thence in a northerly direction along the boundary of the Central Ward to the point of commencement aforesaid.

South Central Ward.

The South Central Ward shall comprise so much of the borough of Gateshead as is contained within an imaginary line commencing from a point in the boundary of the Central Ward opposite the centre of Coatsworth-road thence in an easterly southerly and easterly direction along the boundaries of the Central and East Central Wards to a point in the centre of High-street opposite the centre of Camilla-street thence in a southerly direction along the centre of the Old Durham-road to a point opposite to the western wall of the Sheriff Hill Pottery thence in a westerly direction to the boundary between two fields numbered respectively 454 and 455 on the $\frac{1}{2500}$ scale Ordnance Map thence in a southerly direction to the northern boundary wall of Musgrave House thence in a westerly direction along the said boundary wall to a point in the centre of the Durham-road opposite the said boundary wall thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Durham-road to a point opposite the northern boundary of Heathfield House thence in a westerly direction along the said northern boundary of Heathfield House to a point in the centre of East Park-road, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of East Park-road to a point opposite the centre of Saltwell View thence to and along Saltwell View to a point opposite the centre of Brinkburn-avenue thence to and along the centre of Brinkburn-avenue and Coatsworth-road to the point of commencement aforesaid.

West Central Ward.

The West Central Ward shall comprise so much of the borough of Gateshead as is contained within an imaginary line commencing from a point in the boundary of the North-West Ward in the centre of Lobley Hill-road immediately below the centre of the Team Valley Railway Bridge thence by a vertical line to the said Team Valley Railway thence in a north-easterly direction along the boundary of the North-West Ward to the boundary of the North Ward thence in a southerly direction along the boundary of the North Ward to the boundary of the Central Ward thence in a westerly southerly and easterly direction along the boundary of the Central Ward to the boundary of the South Central Ward to a point in the centre of Bewick-road opposite the centre of Coatsworth-road thence in a southerly direction along the boundary of the South Central Ward to a point opposite the centre of Whitehall-road thence to and along the centre of Vernon-gardens and Whitehall-road West to a point in the centre of Saltwell-road thence along the centre of Saltwell-road in a north-westerly direction to a point in the centre of Lobley Hill-road opposite the centre of Saltwell-road thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Lobley Hill-road to the point of commencement aforesaid.

East Ward.

The East Ward shall comprise so much of the borough of Gateshead as is contained within an imaginary line commencing at a point in the boundary of the South Central Ward opposite the centre of Camilla-street thence in an easterly and north-easterly direction along the boundary of the East Central Ward to the boundary of the North-East Ward thence in a south-easterly direction along the boundary of the North-East Ward to the borough boundary thence in a southerly direction along the said boundary to the centre of an occupation road leading to Carr's Hill

Quarry thence along the centre of the said occupation road to Carr's Hill-road thence to and along the centre of Carr's Hill-road in a north-westerly direction to a point opposite to the centre of Mill-lane thence to and along the centre of Mill-lane in a south-westerly direction to the boundary of the South Central Ward thence in a northerly direction along the boundary of the South Central Ward to the point of commencement aforesaid.

South Ward.

The South Ward shall comprise so much of the borough of Gateshead as is contained within an imaginary line commencing from a point in the borough boundary in the centre of the River Team opposite the centre of Saltwell Dean Brook thence in an easterly direction along the centre of the said brook to a point in the centre of Saltwell-road thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Saltwell-road to a point opposite the southern boundary of the Saltwell Park thence to and along the southern boundary of Saltwell Park to a point in the centre of East Park-road thence in a northerly direction along the East Park-road to the boundary of the South Central Ward thence in an easterly direction along the south boundaries of the South Central and East Wards to the borough boundary thence in a southerly south-easterly south-westerly north-westerly westerly and northerly direction along the borough boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.

West Ward.

The West Ward shall comprise so much of the borough of Gateshead as is contained within an imaginary line commencing from a point in the south-western boundary of the North-West Ward in the centre of the bridge across the River Team thence in an easterly southerly and easterly direction along the boundaries of the North-West and West Central Wards to a point opposite the centre of Coatsworth-road thence in a southerly direction along the boundary of the South Central Ward to a point in the centre of East Park-road opposite the southern boundary of Saltwell Park thence in a westerly northerly and westerly direction along the boundary of the South Ward to the borough boundary thence in a north-westerly direction along the said borough boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.

And I the said Commissioner in further pursuance of the terms of the said Warrant and for the purposes aforesaid do hereby assign and apportion all the existing Councillors of the said borough of Gateshead among the Wards as hereinbefore determined in manner following that is to say:—

To the North Ward three Councillors namely: Councillors Kershaw Ford and Peacock.

To the North-East Ward three Councillors namely: Councillors Daley Dowson and Finn.

To the North-West Ward three Councillors namely: Councillors Foster, Thubron and J. G. Wood.

To the Central Ward three Councillors namely: Councillors Brennan Corking and James Wood.

To the East Central Ward three Councillors namely: Councillors Carr Chipchase and Hodkin.

To the South Central Ward three Councillors namely: Councillors Laws Wardill and Willson.

To the West Central Ward three Councillors namely: Councillors Affleck Cox and Gillies.

To the East Ward three Councillors namely: Councillors Costelloe Coxon and Watson.

To the South Ward three Councillors namely: Councillors Elliott Muse and Temperley.

To the West Ward three Councillors namely: Councillors Gilhespy Gowland and Todd.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth chapter seventy-seven, of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Her said late Majesty chapter sixty-three have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme with respect to the Archdeaconry of Manchester in the diocese of Manchester, and to some of the Rural Deaneries within such Archdeaconry.

"Whereas by an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-sixth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three and published in the London Gazette on the fourth day of July in the same year certain re-arrangements of the Rural Deaneries of the said Archdeaconry of Manchester were effected.

"And whereas it has been represented to us by the Right Reverend James Bishop of Manchester that the arrangements which are hereinafter recommended and proposed with respect to the Rural Deanery of Eccles and the Rural Deanery of Salford both in the said Archdeaconry of Manchester, are desirable and should be carried into effect and we are of opinion that the same may be properly carried into effect.

"And whereas the said arrangements involve the transfer of three cures from the said Rural Deanery of Eccles to the said Rural Deanery of Salford.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said James Bishop of Manchester (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and episcopal seal to this scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any assurance in the law other than

such duly gazetted Order the cures of Saint James Hope Saint John the Evangelist Pendlebury and Saint Luke Weaste shall be transferred from the said Rural Deanery of Eccles and shall become and be part of the said Rural Deanery of Salford and the said Rural Deanery of Eccles and the said Rural Deanery of Salford shall respectively comprise and consist of the parishes cures and churches the names of which are set down in numbered order under the name of such Rural Deaneries respectively in the Schedule to this scheme annexed and each of the said parishes or cures or churches shall belong to and be and form part of the Rural Deanery and Archdeaconry under the names of which it is set down as aforesaid and shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Rural Dean of the Rural Deanery and of the Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry under which it is so set down as aforesaid and shall not belong to or be a part of any other Rural Deanery or Archdeaconry nor be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of any other Rural Dean or Archdeacon.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid or any of them by virtue of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third chapter one hundred and thirty-four of the Act of the second and third years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter forty-nine of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty chapter sixty and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty chapter fifty-five have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Thomas situate at Telford Park in the new parish (sometime chapelry district) of Christ Church Streatham in the county of Surrey and in the diocese of Rochester.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Thomas situate at Telford Park as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward Stuart Bishop of the said diocese of Rochester (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent that it would in our opinion be expedient that all that part of the said new parish of Christ Church Streatham which is described in the schedule hereunder written all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Thomas situate at Telford Park as aforesaid and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Thomas Telford Park.'

"And with the like consent of the said Edward Stuart Bishop of the said diocese of Rochester (testified as aforesaid) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published and that marriages baptisms churchings and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint Thomas situate at Telford Park as aforesaid and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being. Provided always that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We therefore humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"Whereas the whole advowson or perpetual right of and presentation to each of the said two benefices of Saint Mary in Stockport and Saint Thomas in Stockport is vested for an estate in fee simple free of incumbrances in the Reverend William Symonds Clerk in Holy Orders one of the Honorary Canons of the Cathedral Church of Chester and also the present rector or Incumbent of the said benefice of Saint Mary in Stockport.

"And whereas the said William Symonds as such patron and rector as aforesaid has represented to us and we are of opinion that it is desirable that additional provision should be made for the cure of souls within the said parish of Saint Thomas in Stockport by means of that apportionment of the incomes of the said two benefices which is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas the said benefice of Saint Mary in Stockport is as hereinbefore mentioned full of a Clerk and the said benefice of Saint Thomas in Stockport is also full of a Clerk.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Francis John Bishop of Chester as Bishop of the diocese within which each of the said two benefices is situate (in testimony whereof the said Francis John Bishop of Chester has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal) and with the consent of the said William Symonds as such patron as aforesaid of each of the said two benefices and also as such rector or Incumbent as aforesaid of the said benefice of Saint Mary in Stockport (in testimony whereof the said William Symonds

has signed and sealed this scheme) and with the consent of the Reverend Henry Sewell Clerk in Holy Orders as the rector or Incumbent of Saint Thomas in Stockport (in testimony whereof the said Henry Sewell has signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same the following arrangements shall be made.

"I. That as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall have been published in the London Gazette all those portions of the present endowments belonging to the said benefice of Saint Mary in Stockport which are specified in the first part of the schedule to this scheme appended shall be transferred from the said benefice of Saint Mary in Stockport to the said benefice of Saint Thomas in Stockport and shall as from the day aforesaid be annexed thereto and form part of the endowments of the lastly-mentioned benefice and,

"II. That as from the same day the annual payment amounting to eighty-seven pounds which is referred to in the second part of the said schedule shall cease and determine and shall no longer be payable by the rector or Incumbent of the said benefice of Saint Mary in Stockport to the rector or Incumbent of the said benefice of Saint Thomas in Stockport.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE referred to in the foregoing Scheme.

"(A) All and singular the freehold rents amounting in the aggregate to one hundred pounds eleven shillings and five pence per annum arising or payable in respect of certain property in the parish of Saint Mary in Stockport in the county of Chester being the whole of the freehold rents which were secured to the benefice of Saint Mary in Stockport by the undermentioned deeds, that is to say:—

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by section twenty-six of the Pluralities Act 1838 after reciting that "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, chapelries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may in some instances with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for

"ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted "That when with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church, and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop or Bishop shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas the Right Reverend John, Lord Bishop of Salisbury, hath pursuant to the enactment aforesaid, represented to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

"To the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Father in God, Randall Thomas by Divine Providence Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury Primate of All England and Metropolitan.

"I, John by Divine Permission Bishop of Salisbury do in pursuance of the twenty-sixth section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, hereby represent to your Grace as follows :—

"1. There is in the county of Dorset and my diocese of Salisbury the vicarage of Bradpole the parish whereof contains a population of one thousand seven hundred. The net annual value of the said benefice is one hundred and sixty-nine pounds or thereabouts.

"2. There is also in the said county and diocese the rectory of Bridport the parish whereof contains a population of three thousand seven hundred and fifty. The net annual value of this benefice is two hundred and twenty-nine pounds or thereabouts.

"3. A certain district of the said parish of Bradpole containing the consecrated chapel of ease of Saint Andrew, Bradpole, lies at a distance of one mile and a quarter from the parish church of Bradpole and of just over three-quarters of a mile from the parish church of Bridport.

"The said district, which is within the civil parish of Bridport consists of the whole of the southern portion of the said ecclesiastical parish of Bradpole west of the eastern municipal boundary of Bridport and south of Coneygar-lane or road the northern boundary of the said district being from the River Brit on the west along the northern fence of a field numbered 186 on the Ordnance Survey map, the whole length of Coneygar-lane or road to the Bradpole-road along the centre of Bradpole-road towards Bradpole for two hundred and sixty feet and from thence in a straight line to and along the northern fence of a field numbered 266 on the said map to the River Asker. The district contains a population of seven hundred. There is no permanent income belonging to the said chapel of ease.

"4. It appears to me that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act, the following alteration may advantageously be made, viz. :—

"The separation of the said district of Saint Andrew Bradpole from the said parish of Bradpole and its annexation to the said contiguous parish of Bridport.

"5. The benefice of Bradpole is in the patronage of the Lord Chancellor of Great Britain.

"6. The benefice of Bridport is in the patronage of the Bishop for the time being of the diocese of Salisbury.

"7. The Reverend Henry Cromwell Beckwith Field is the present Incumbent of the benefice of Bradpole. The Reverend Henry Richard William Farrer is the present Incumbent of the benefice of Bridport.

"8. Pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the first-mentioned Act I the said Bishop have drawn up a scheme in writing annexed to this representation describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent thereon in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithes rent charges and other ecclesiastical

dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested.

"And I do hereby submit the same to your Grace together with the consents in writing of the said patrons and Incumbents to the intent that if your Grace shall on full consideration and inquiry be satisfied with such scheme, you may certify the same and such consents by your report to His Majesty in Council.

"John Sarum."

And whereas the said scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the consents referred to in the said representation are as follows :—

"SCHEME.

"That the district of Saint Andrew Bradpole hereinbefore referred to shall be separated from the parish of Bradpole aforesaid and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the said contiguous parish of Bridport.

"The said district is delineated and described on the plan annexed hereto and is thereon coloured pink.

"That the Incumbent of the benefice of Bridport shall have the sole and exclusive cure of souls within the said district so annexed to Bridport.

"That the inhabitants of such district shall cease to be entitled to accommodation in the parish church of Bradpole and for all ecclesiastical purposes shall be regarded as parishioners of Bridport except nevertheless any person or persons possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in the said parish church of Bradpole and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

"That marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials shall be solemnized and performed in the parish church of Bridport for the inhabitants of the said district and all fees dues ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments arising from the said district shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the benefice of Bridport.

"That the whole of the vicarial tithe rent-charge arising from land in the said district heretofore forming part of the endowment of the said benefice of Bradpole and payable to and received by the vicar of the said benefice, amounting in gross according to the commuted value to forty-three pounds four shillings and six pence, the particulars whereof are set out in the schedule annexed hereto, shall in future form part of and be annexed to the endowment of the said benefice of Bridport, and shall be payable to and received by the rector for the time being of the said benefice of Bridport.

"That no other alteration shall be made in the emoluments of the said benefices.

"That no alteration shall be made in the patronage of the said benefices.

We then melted the said Gold coins so taken out and weighed, into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard Gold Trial Plate produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Act, and we found that the amount of variation thereof from the Standard of Fineness specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act was plus one ten-thousandth (or +0001), and that, therefore, the said metal was within the prescribed remedy as to fineness. We weighed the residue of the said Gold coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to Weight. BRAINTREE UNION.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Braintree Union:—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by General Orders of the Poor Law Board dated respectively the 14th day of January, 1867, and the 16th day of February, 1869, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the Braintree Union (amongst others), it is required that certain Accounts relating to the provisions, clothing, and other stores in the Workhouse, when made up and balanced, shall be submitted to the Visiting Committee or to some Member thereof, who shall enter a memorandum at the foot of such Accounts in the form of the Certificate referred to in the said Orders;

And whereas it is expedient to empower the said Guardians to appoint a competent person or persons to examine the stores at the Workhouse belonging to the said Union, and to perform the other duties hereinafter set forth:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—The Guardians of the Poor of the Braintree Union, as and when they shall think fit to do so, may appoint a competent person or persons to perform the duties of a Stocktaker as hereinafter set forth, and may revoke such appointment. When any such appointment is made it shall be notified to Us forthwith.

ARTICLE II.—Every such appointment shall be made in the manner prescribed by the Regulations in force for the time being as to the appointment of Officers by the said Guardians, and a person appointed to the office of Stocktaker shall receive such remuneration as may from time to time be assigned to him by the said Guardians.

ARTICLE III.—No person, except with Our consent, shall be appointed to the office of Stocktaker while holding any other office under the Guardians.

ARTICLE IV.—The Stocktaker shall, on the day next after the termination of each quarter, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stores at the Workhouse, and compare the same with the quantities of stock remaining in store as shown by the entries in the proper columns in the Accounts termed respectively the "Quarterly Balance of the Provisions Account" and the "Quarterly

Balance of the Necessaries and Miscellaneous Account."

He shall also, on the day next after the termination of each half-year, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stock of clothing at the Workhouse and compare the same with the balance appearing in the Accounts termed respectively the "Clothing Materials Receipt and Conversion Account" and the "Clothing Receipt and Expenditure Account."

ARTICLE V.—After making the examination and comparison referred to in Article IV, the Stocktaker, if he find the stock to be correct, shall sign a certificate at the foot of each of the aforesaid Accounts in the following form:—

"Submitted to me this _____ day of _____ 19____, and found to be correct as regards the quantities of stock remaining in store.

"(Signed).....
"Stocktaker."

If he find the stock to be in any respect incorrect, he shall make such alteration in the said certificate as he may deem necessary, specifying the particulars in which he finds the quantities of stock to be incorrectly stated.

ARTICLE VI.—The Master of the Workhouse shall, when required by the Stocktaker to do so, on the days and at the times referred to in Article IV, submit to him the stores and Accounts therein mentioned, and render to him such assistance as may be necessary for the purpose of such examination and comparison as aforesaid.

ARTICLE VII.—The Master of the Workhouse shall lay each of the said Accounts before the Guardians at their next meeting after the date of the entry therein of any such certificate as aforesaid.

ARTICLE VIII.—So long as a Stocktaker is appointed it shall not be necessary for the Visiting Committee to examine the stores or to enter in any Account the memorandum required by the first above-cited Order.
