The KING has been pleased to give and grant unto Brevet Colonel Charles Edward de la Poer Beresford His Majesty's Royal licence and authority that he may accept and wear the Insignia of the Second Class of the Imperial Russian Order of St. Anne, conferred upon him by His Majesty the Emperor of All the Russias, upon the termination of his appointment as Military Attaché to His Majesty's Embassy at St. Petersburg.

FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, pursuant to section 80 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, that he has certified the processes of loading, unloading, moving, and handling goods in, on, or at any dock, wharf, or quay, and the process of loading, unloading, and coaling any ship in any dock, harbour, or canal, to be dangerous, and that he proposes to make regulations to apply to all docks, wharves, quays, and ships.

Copies of the regulations proposed to be made may be obtained at the office of the Chief Inspector of Factories, Home Office, London, and at the local offices of the Inspectors of Factories.

Objections to the draft regulations by or on behalf of any persons affected by the regulations must be sent to the Secretary of State within 40 days from the date of this notice.
