

# ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 19TH AUGUST 1903.)

(Swine-Fever Infected Area.)

The Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

# Extension of Limits of Swine-Fever Infected Area.

1. The limits of the Swine-Fever Infected Area declared by Order of the Board dated the thirtieth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and three, are hereby extended so as to comprise the Area described in the Schedule to this Order, and the Area so described is hereby from and after the commencement of this Order declared to be an area infected with swine-fever for the purposes of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902.

#### Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-sixth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and three.

Naboska Rock-Non-Existence of.

Notice is hereby given that as the results of numerous searches for the Naboska Rock, to the southward of Quelpart Island, show no indication of its existence, it has been expunged from the

Approximate position, lat. 32° 59′ N., long. 126° 13′ E.

This rock, on which the Russian transport "Naboska" was reported to have been lost in April, 1870, was unsuccessfully searched for by Her Majesty's surveying-vessel "Sylvia" in 1877, when a sounding of 57 fathoms, mud bottom, was the least water obtained anywhere within two miles of the reported position.

Mr. G. C. Anderson, Master of the ship "Conquest," reports having frequently passed in 1875 and 1876, within two miles of the supposed position of this rock, without seeing any indication

of shoal water.

A thorough search was also made in 1885 by Captain Phythian, United States ship "Trenton, and latterly in February, 1903, Captain A. A. Dalweritz, of the American schooner "Forester, reports having passed close to the assigned position of this rock, obtaining at the same time a sounding of 55 fathoms, mud bottom, without seeing any sign of shoal water.

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 229 of 1903:-

The French Government has given further notice that, on 5th August, 1903, the character

of the lights in the entrance to the harbour of Dieppe would be altered in the following manner :-

The white fixed light exhibited at the end of the western pier would be altered to an occulting light every four seconds, thus:—light, three seconds; eclipse, one second; it shows red from the bearing of S. 75° E. to the coast westward of Dieppe, and white in other directions, the white light being visible in clear weather from a distance of 13 miles, and the red 8 miles, the light powers being 590 and 140 candles respectively; in other respects this light remains

#### Tramways.

TOTICE is hereby given, that the Mayor,
Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Darwen did, on the 13th day of August instant, make and pass under their common seal the Byelaws hereunder written and that the same will be forwarded to the Board of Trade, and will come into force and effect on the 1st day of November next, unless the same shall be disallowed by the Board of Trade.

#### DARWEN CORPORATION TRAMWAYS.

BYE-LAWS for regulating the travelling in or upon and for preventing the commission of any nuisance in or upon any carriages using the the Tramways of the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Darwen, made by the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses, acting by the Town Council as the owners, promoters, and workers of the said Tramways under the powers conferred upon them by section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870, and section 25 of the Darwen Corporation Act, 1899.

Definition. For the purpose of these Bye-laws the term "Corporation" shall mean the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Darwen; the term "tramways" shall mean the tramways within the Borough of Darwen or any of them; the term "carriage" shall mean any car or carriage using the tramways; and the terms "driver" and "conductor" shall respectively mean the driver and conductor or other person having charge of the car.

Entering Carriages. 1. No person, not being a servant of the Company, shall enter or depart from a carriage except by the hindmost or conductor's platform, unless requested so to do by the conductor or driver.

Smoking.

2. No person shall smoke inside any carriage.

Spitting.

3. No person shall spit in or upon any carriage.

Playing Instruments.

4. No person shall, whilst travelling in or upon any carriage, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

Intoxication.

5. No person, in a state of intoxication, shall enter or mount upon any carriage, and, if any person is found in or upon any carriage, he shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

Offensive Language.

6. No person shall swear or use obscene language whilst in or upon any carriage, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any carriage or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

Damaging Carriages.

7. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice in or on the carriage, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage. Any person acting in contravention to this Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations in addition to the liability to pay the amount of the

damage done.

8. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a carriage, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in the interior of any carriage, and may be prevented from entering the interior of any carriage, and shall not enter the interior of any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and, if found in the interior of any carriage, shall, on the request of the conductor, leave the interior of the carriage upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

Fares.

- 9. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor the fare legally demanded for the
- 10. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required to do so to the conductor or any duly authorized servant of the Company, and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

Artisans.

11. No person, not being an artisan, mechanic or daily labourer within the true intent and meaning of the Darwen Corporation Act, 1899, and the Acts incorporated therewith, shall use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers.

Mode of Travelling.

12. No person, not being a servant, shall travel on any engine running upon the tramways, or on the steps or platforms of any carriage, or stand either on the roof or in the interior, or sit on the outside rail or on the roof of any carriage.

Number of Passengers.

13. When any carriage contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to contain, no additional person shall enter, mount, or remain

in or on any such carriage when warned by the conductor not to do so.

Entering or leaving Carriage in motion.

14. No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave, any carriage whilst in motion.

Dogs and Animals.

15. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in the interior of any carriage, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal is offensive or an annoyance to any passenger shall the same be allowed on the outside of any carriage. No person shall take a dog or other animal on any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken or being on any carriage in breach of this Bye-law shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the carriage immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

Firearms.

16. No person shall travel in or on any carriage with loaded firearms, or with any combustible or dangerous substance or material.

Obstructing Officers.

17. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with the tramways or any carriage thereon.

Enforcing Bye-laws.

18. The conductor of each carriage shall enforce or prevent the breach of these Bye-laws and Regulations to the best of his ability.

Penalty.

19. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of the above Bye-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding 40s. for each offence, and not exceeding for any continuing offence 10s. for every day during which the offence continues.

Copy of Bye-laws.

20. The Corporation shall cause to be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each carriage a printed copy of these Bye-

#### BOROUGH OF IPSWICH.

Ipswich Corporation Tramways.

OTICE is hereby given, that the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Ipswich, under and in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Ipswich Corporation Tramways Act, 1900, and the Acts incorporated therewith, did at a meeting of the Town Council, held on the twelfth day of August, 1903, make the following Bye-laws.

#### BYE-LAWS.

Interpretation.

1. Throughout these Bye-laws the word "Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Ipswich; the word "tramways" means the tramway system worked by the Corporation, situate within the borough of Ipswich; the word "car" means any carriage or car run upon the tramways for the conveyance of passengers; the word "conductor" means any officer or servant of the Corporation having charge of, or helping in the charge of, a car; and the word "driver" means any officer or servant of the Corporation driving, or helping to drive, a car.

Entering and leaving Cars.

2. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a car by the step of the hindermost or conductor's platform on the near side of the car only, and not otherwise, unless so directed by the conductor.

Persons being upon and desiring to alight from any car, shall do so before any person desiring to enter shall board such car for the purpose of travelling thereon, and all persons desiring to enter the car shall permit such persons to alight as aforesaid.

3. No person shall under any circumstances be permitted to enter or stand upon or depart from a car by means of the platform thereof occupied by the driver.

4. No person shall be permitted to stand upon the hindermost or rear platform of the car, except when in the act of entering or departing there-

from.

Smoking.

5. No person shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe, cigar, or cigarette inside any car.

Intoxicated Persons, &c.

6. No person in a state of intoxication, or affected with any dangerous, contagious, or infectious disorder shall enter or mount upon any car, and any such person found in or upon any car, shall be immediately removed from the car by or under the direction of the conductor, or other authorized servant of the Corporation.

Offensive Language or Conduct.

7. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language, or conduct himself offensively whilst in or upon any car, or spit, or commit any nuisance, in or upon, or against any car, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

No passenger or any other person shall, while travelling in or upon any car, play or perform upon any musical instrument, or distribute advertisements, or tracts of any kind, or beg or collect money, alms or subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game, or gamble, or deposit remnants of food or fruit in or upon any car.

Damage to Car.

8. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the fittings or decorations, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on any car, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage, any car.

Any person acting in contravention of this Bye-law shall, in addition to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws, be liable to pay the

amount of any damage so done.

Objectionable Persons.

9. No person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a car, soil or injure the fittings or decorations of the car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, nor any person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to any

passenger, shall be entitled to enter or remain in or upon any car, and may be prevented from entering or remaining in or upon any car.

No such person shall enter in or upon any car after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, or other authorized servant of the Corporation, and if any such person be found in or upon any car, he shall, on the request of the conductor, or other authorized servant of the Corporation, leave such car, upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned, and on his refusal to do so, he shall immediately be removed by or under the direction of the conductor, or other authorized servant of the Corporation.

#### Payment of Fares.

10. Each passenger shall upon demand, pay to the conductor, or other authorized servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty, the fare legally demandable for the journey, or for the stage thereof for which it be demanded.

#### Tickets.

11. Each passenger shall, as and when requested so to do, show his ticket to the conductor or other authorized servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty, and shall also, when requested so to do by the conductor or other authorized servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty, deliver up his ticket, or, in case of failure to produce such ticket, pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

Luggage.

12. No passenger shall bring on to any car any luggage other than his own personal luggage, not exceeding 28 lbs. in weight, and any such personal luggage shall be carried at the responsibility of the passenger, and shall be placed by the passenger in such position on or in the car as shall be directed by the conductor.

13. The conductor may decline to take, and may prevent any person from taking upon any car, any personal luggage exceeding 28 lbs. in weight, and any luggage which from its size or otherwise is, in the opinion of the conductor, unsuitable for conveyance in or upon the car, or would interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

Travelling on Steps, &c.

14. No person other than the driver or the conductor of a car, or other servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty, shall travel or ride upon the steps, platforms, outside rails, buffers, or guards of any car.

No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall board a car, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of a car, except by or to the straps or other appliances provided inside the car for the convenience of passengers.

law shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the car immediately upon request by the conductor, or other authorized servant of the Corporation, and in default of compliance with such request, may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor or other authorized servant of the Corpora-

Firearms, &c.

22. No person shall travel in or on any car with loaded firearms, or with any article, instrument, or implement, or any material or substance which may be dangerous or offensive to the passengers.

Interference with Driver or Conductor.

23. No person other than the conductor or driver, or other authorized servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty, shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controller, brakes, lights, ventilators, trolley cord, or any part of a car, or its equipment, and no person other than the conductor, or other authorized servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty shall signal a car to start or

Obstruction.

24. No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any conductor, driver, or other servant of the Corporation, acting in the performance of his duty, upon or in connection with any car or tramway.

Conductors and Drivers to enforce Bye-laws. 25. Every conductor and driver of a car shall, to the best of his ability, enforce these Bye-laws, and prevent any breach thereof.

Penalty.

26. Any person offending against, or committing a breach of, any of these Bye-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

Operation.

27. These Bye-laws shall come into force on Thursday, the fifteenth day of October, 1903.
