## LIGHT RAILWAYS ACT, 1896.

Bath Electric Tramways (Light Railway Extensions) Order.

The Light Railway Commissioners have submitted to the Board of Trade, for confirmation under the above-mentioned Act, an Order made by them for the construction of Light Railways in the city of Bath, in the county of Somerset (being extensions and deviations of the existing and authorized undertaking of Bath Electric Tramways Limited), and the abandonment of the construction of certain other Light Railways already authorized in the same city.

Any objections to the confirmation of the Order should be addressed to the Assistant-Secretary (Railway Department), Board of Trade, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W., and must be lodged with the Board on or before the 3rd September, 1903. These should be accompanied by copies of any clauses or amendments that may be desired to remove the objections, and copies of such objections and clauses or amendments should at the same time be sent to one of the Promoters' Agents named below.

The Civil Service Commissioners, with the consent of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and in pursuance of the Order in Council of the 29th March, 1879, as amended by Clause 21 of the Order in Council of the 29th November, 1898, hereby give notice, that persons who were actually appointed before the 1st of July, 1903, to the undermentioned pensionable situations in the Royal Ordnance Factories, and the Army Ordnance Department (including the Inspection Department and the Army Clothing Department), shall be exempt from the payment of fees in respect of Certificates of Qualification hereafter issued for those situations, viz.:—The situations of Chief Civil Clerk, or Civil Clerk, Army Ordnance Department, Woolwich Arsenal; Principal Foreman Writer; Foreman Writer; Head Writer (including Writers occupying the position of head clerks in the various minor establishments and the special assistant to the War Department Chemist).
