ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 19TH AUGUST 1903.)

(SWINE-FEVER INFECTED AREA.)

The Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Extension of Limits of Swine-Fever Infected Area.

1. The limits of the Swine-Fever Infected Area declared by Order of the Board dated the thirtieth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and three, are hereby extended so as to comprise the Area described in the Schedule to this Order, and the Area so described is hereby from and after the commencement of this Order declared to be an area infected with swine-fever for the purposes of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-sixth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and three.

An Area comprising the petty sessional divisions of Carnarvon, Bangor, and Conway (except the parish of Llysfaen), the boroughs of Bangor, and Conway (including any detached parts thereof), and the parishes of Llanrhychwyn,

Trefriw, Maenan, and the Abbey, in the administrative county of Carnarvon; and also comprising the borough of Carnarvon.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction consisting of a certain house and premises (known as No. 39, Avenue-road, Regent's Park), which is about to be secured for a term of nine hundred and ninety-nine years from the sixth day of July, in the year one thousand nine hundred and three, as a parsonage or house of residence for the Incumbent of the vicarage of Saint Stephen Portland Town, in the county of Middlesex, and in the diocese of London, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, grant and appropriate out of our common fund to the said vicarage of Saint Stephen, Portland Town, to meet such benefaction, one capital sum of seven hundred pounds, to be applicable towards defraying the cost of acquiring the house and premises above mentioned as a parsonage or house of residence for the said vicarage, and in improving and altering the same house and premises, according to plans and a specification approved or to be approved by us, such capital sum, or the balance thereof unapplied to such purpose, to remain in the meantime in our hands at interest after the rate of two pounds and ten shillings per centum per annum, and such interest to be paid to the Incumbent for the time being of the said vicarage of Saint Stephen, Portland Town.

TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Monday, the 24th instant, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Acts 40 Vic., cap. 2, 52 Vic., cap. 6, and 3 Edw. VII, cap. 32, to the amount of £3,000,000, of which £1,000,000 will be in replacement of Bills falling due on the 30th instant, and £2,000,000 will be an issue under the Act 3 Edw. VII, cap. 32.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000, or £10,000, and will be dated the 29th August, 1903. The Bills for £1,000,000 will be payable at three months after date, viz.:—on the 29th November, 1903. The Bills for £2,000,000 will be payable at six months after date, viz.:—on the 29th February, 1904.

3. The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for, and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.
