THE GREENWICH HOSPITAL ACTS.

Notice is hereby given that, after the expiration of forty days from the date hereof, it is proposed to submit to His Majesty in Council, in pursuance of the above-mentioned Acts, the draft of an Order in Council approving a Memorial of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, praying sanction to pensions now granted from the funds of Greenwich Hospital being supplemented from Naval Funds to the extent necessary to raise them to the scale sanctioned by Order in Council of 26th September, 1901, and recommending the approval of new regulations for the grant of Pensions and allowances from the funds of Greenwich Hospital.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, a copy of the following Notice relating to quarantine, issued by the Governor of Malta:—

Government Notice. No. 178.

His Excellency the Governor, acting on the advice of the Council of Health, has been pleased to direct that Government Notice No. 158 of the 31st July, 1903, shall be cancelled, and that the following regulations shall henceforth be observed, viz.:—

1. All animals of the species mentioned below intended for importation into these Islands, must be accompanied by certificate from the British

Consular Authority, or, where there is no such authority, from the local Government Authority, stating that no infectious or contagious disease affecting such animals has been officially reported at the places of origin and embarkation, during the three months immediately preceding the date of embarkation.

2. No animals of the species mentioned below shall be allowed to be landed, unless the consignee shall have applied for, and obtained, before shipment, the necessary permission for their importation. Such application shall imply that the consignee has bound himself to abide by any regulations which may be in force on the day of importation, or which may thereafter be issued, and also to pay all fees and expenses usually levied on each animal at the Lazaretto.

3. Vessels arriving at this Island, having on board more than 250 head of cattle (bovine) are to go into the quarantine harbour, and the cattle are to be inspected in the cattle enclosures of the Lazaretto.

4. Vessels which have, or have had, on board animals suffering from any contagious or infectious disease shall be disinfected in such manner as the Superintendent of the Public Health Department may direct. Should such disinfection be objected to, the vessels will be subject to quarantine, pending disinfection, on their return to Malta.

I. Cattle.

[A] Bovine.

5. The importation of bovines from Continental Italy, from Epirus and from Mersina and the other ports in the Vilayet of Adana is prohibited.

6. Bovines imported from the countries mentioned below will be subjected to the restrictions hereunder stated:

From Syria	14 days' observation.
From Southern Russia, Roumania, Bulgaria, and Turkish Ports in the Black Sea	} 10 days' observation.
From Sardinia, Sicily, Tunisia, Algeria, and Morocco	
[B] Ovine.	} 2 days' observation.

7. The importation of ovines from Continental Italy, from Epirus and from Mersina and the other Ports in the Vilayet of Adana is prohibited.

8. Ovines imported from Southern Russia, Roumania, Bulgaria, Sardinia, Sicily, Tunisia, Algeria, and Morocco, will be subjected to 2 days' observation.

II. Equines.

9. Horses, mules, and asses, from all countries will be landed in quarantine, and will be subjected to the mallein test, if it is considered necessary. Such animals will not be released from quarantine before the Veterinary Surgeon declares them healthy.

III. Swine.

10. The importation of Swine from Sicily, from Epirus and from Mersina and the other Ports in the Vilayet of Adana is prohibited.

11. Swine imported from the countries hereunder mentioned is subjected to the following restrictions:

From Southern Russia, Roumania, Bulgaria, Constantinople, Greece, Tunisia, Algeria, and Morocco	} 2 days' observation.

The importation is also forbidden of:

12. Animal of the species mentioned in this Notice arriving from any place, if affected with any disease, in view of which, in the opinion of the Chief Government Medical Officer, their importation might prove detrimental to other animals already in the Island.

13. Wool, hides, skins, horns, bones, and hoofs from Continental Italy, Sicily, and from countries where epidemic diseases are reported.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(DATED 21st AUGUST 1903.)

GOOLE (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1903.

The Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

Premises to which this Order applies.

1.—(1.) This Order shall apply to the premises described in the Schedule hereto, and also to any other premises in the urban district of Goole to which the Order may be applied by a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority of the West Riding of the county of York and served upon the occupier of the premises described in such Notice.

(2.) This Order shall cease to apply to any premises upon service on the occupier thereof of a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the said Local Authority.

Restriction on Movement of Swine from or to Premises to which this Order applies.

2. Swine shall not, except as expressly authorized by this Order, be moved from or to any premises to which this Order applies.

Movement of Swine for Immediate Slaughter.

3.—(1.) Swine (not being in a Swine-Fever Infected Place and their movement not being prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board) may be moved from any premises to which this Order applies in a suitable vehicle to a slaughter-house situate in the urban district of Goole, for the purpose of immediate slaughter with a Movement Licence of the Local Authority, which Licence shall be in force for not more than two days inclusive of the day of issue and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the swine to be moved, and the name or description of the place or premises from which and the slaughter-house to which the swine are to be moved.

(2.) The swine shall, before the movement is commenced, be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.

(3.) The swine moved under this Article shall be accompanied by the Licence required by this Article, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and shall be slaughtered after their arrival at the slaughter-house without unnecessary delay.

Cleansing and Disinfection of Vehicle used for Movement of Swine.

4.—(1.) Any vehicle which has been used for the conveyance of swine under the preceding Article, shall immediately after each occasion of such use be cleansed and disinfected by and at

the expense of the owner of the vehicle as follows :

- (i.) The floor of the vehicle and all other parts thereof with which the swine, or their droppings, have come in contact shall be scraped and swept, and the scrapings and sweepings, and all dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter shall be effectually removed therefrom ; then
- (ii.) The same parts of the vehicle shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water ; then
- (iii.) The same parts of the vehicle shall have applied to them a coating of limewash, or a solution of carbolic acid consisting of one part of carbolic acid and twenty parts of water.

(2.) The scrapings and sweepings, and the dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter removed under this Article shall forthwith be well mixed with quicklime, and be effectually removed from contact with swine.

Movement of Swine to Premises to which this Order applies.

5.—(1.) Swine may be moved to any premises to which this Order applies with a Movement Licence of the Local Authority, which Licence shall be in force for not more than four days inclusive of the day of issue and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the swine to be moved, and the name or description of the place or premises from which and the place and premises to which the swine are to be moved, and shall only be granted on a Declaration of the owner of the swine or of his agent authorized in writing for this purpose to the following effect—

- (a.) that the swine to be moved have been on the premises from which they are to be moved for a period of at least twenty-eight days immediately before the granting of the Licence, and that no other pig has been brought on to those premises within such period ; and
- (b.) that the swine are not affected with swine-fever, and have not during the period of twenty-eight days as aforesaid been in any way exposed to the infection of swine-fever ; and
- (c.) that the swine are not in a Swine-Fever Infected Place and their movement is not prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of a Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

(2.) The swine moved under this Article shall be accompanied by the Licence and Declaration required by this Article, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay.

Saving for Regulations of Local Authority.

6. Movement of swine under this Order is subject to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board for prohibiting or regulating the movement of swine into or within the District of the Local Authority, but nothing in any such Regulation shall permit the movement of swine in contravention of this Order.

Movement of Swine by Licence of Board.

7. Notwithstanding anything in this Order, a Licence for the movement of swine may be granted

by an Inspector of the Board, but such Licence will only be granted where the Board, after inquiry, are satisfied that exceptional circumstances render the granting thereof necessary or expedient.

Granting of Movement Licences.

8.—(1.) The Local Authority may appoint fit and proper persons for the purpose of granting, subject to the provisions of this Article, Movement Licences for the purposes of this Order.

(2.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the swine to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the swine, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughter-house from or to which the swine are to be moved, or by any individual member of an executive Committee or Sub-Committee of the Local Authority.

Delivery of Declarations.

9.—(1.) A Licence granted under this Order for the movement of swine to any premises to which this Order applies is not available except when accompanied by the Declaration on which it is granted.

(2.) The person granting such Licence under this Order shall for the identification of the Declaration produced to him mark the same by signing his name thereon with the date of the production thereof to him.

(3.) The person granting such Licence shall deliver the Declaration produced to him, when so marked, with the Licence, to the person receiving the Licence from him.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

10.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

11. The provisions of this Order, except where it is otherwise provided, shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

12.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, or of the conditions of a Movement Licence thereunder, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If a pig is not marked as required by this Order, the owner, consignee, or other person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and

defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of this Order in respect of the cleansing and disinfection of any vehicle used for the movement of swine, the owner, or other person for the time being in charge of the vehicle, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If any person, with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any pig as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5.) If a pig is not slaughtered as required by this Order, the person to whom the Licence is granted, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person failing to cause the same to be so slaughtered, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(6.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

13. In this Order—

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture:

“Swine-Fever Infected Place” means a place for the time being declared to be infected with swine-fever under any Order of the Board:

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

Commencement.

14. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-eighth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and three.

Short Title.

15. This Order may be cited as the GOOLE (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1903.

SCHEDULE.

BYE-LAWS

Made by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the County Borough of West Ham, being the Promoters of the Tramways in the County Borough of West Ham, with respect to such Tramways, pursuant to the powers conferred upon them by the Tramways Act, 1870.

Interpretation.

1. Throughout these Bye-laws the word "Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen, and

Burgesses of the County Borough of West Ham, and shall include any lessees or persons for the time being working the tramway system herein-after referred to; the word "tramways" means the tramway system worked by the Corporation, whether situate in the County Borough of West Ham, or worked by the Corporation as lessees; the word "car" means any carriage or car run by the Corporation upon the tramways for the conveyance of passengers, or any cart, wagon, or other vehicle used in the management or repair of the tramways; the word "conductor" means any officer or servant of the Corporation having charge of or helping in the charge of a car, and the word "driver" means any officer or servant of the Corporation driving or assisting to drive a car.

Penalty.

2. Any person infringing any of the following Bye-laws shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding (40s.) forty shillings, and in case of a continuing offence to a penalty of not exceeding ten shillings, in addition to the first-mentioned penalty, for every day during which such offence continues.

Offensive Language or Conduct.

3. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language, or conduct himself offensively whilst in or upon any car, or spit, or commit any nuisance, in or upon, or against any car or tramway station, or premises used in connection with the tramway system, or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger. No person shall sing or play or perform upon any musical instrument, or distribute advertisements, pamphlets, notices, handbills, or tracts of any kind, or eat food or fruit, or beg or collect money, alms, or subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game, or gamble, or paste notices or handbills, or deposit remnants of food or fruit in or upon any car.

Objectionable Persons.

4. Any person who is in a state of intoxication, or who from that or any other cause is, in the opinion of the conductor, unfit to be a passenger on a car, shall not be allowed to board or enter upon any car, and if any such person be found in or upon any car, he or she shall be requested by the conductor to leave the car, failing which, it shall be lawful for the conductor or any other officer or servant of the Corporation to remove such person from the car. Any person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor, soil or injure the linings or cushions of a car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in or upon a car.

Dogs, Birds, &c.

5. No person shall take a dog or other animal or any bird or fowl into or upon any car. Any dog or other animal, bird or fowl taken into or found in or upon any car, shall be removed by the person in charge thereof from the car immediately upon request by the conductor.

Damaging Cars.

6. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the seats, cushions, curtains, or linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on any car, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage any car. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable, in addition to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws, for the amount of any damage so done.

Smoking.

7. No person shall smoke or carry lighted pipes, cigars, or cigarettes in or upon any car;

except on such seats outside the car, or in any compartment of the car specially set apart for persons smoking or desirous of so doing.

Payment of Fares.

8. Each passenger shall before leaving the car, or immediately upon demand by the conductor, if such demand shall be first made, pay to the conductor the fare legally payable for his or her journey and obtain a ticket therefor. Any person leaving a car shall be deemed to have completed his or her journey.

No child under five years of age who is sitting on the lap of a passenger shall be liable to pay a fare, provided that this provision shall apply only to one such child accompanying any one passenger; the full ordinary fare shall be paid for any additional child, irrespective of age, accompanying such passenger.

Tickets.

9. Each passenger shall, immediately upon demand, produce and hand his or her ticket to any officer or servant of the Corporation, and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his or her ticket or pay the fare for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

Tickets shall not be transferable and shall be available only by the car on which they are issued.

Interference with or Obstruction to Conductor, Driver, or other Servant.

10. No person other than the conductor or driver shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controllers, breaks, lights, ventilators, trolley cord, or any part of a car, or its equipment or any switch or point connected with the tramway track, or any frog-rope or other appliance or attachment to the equipment of the tramways, or signal a car to start.

No passenger or other person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty upon or in any car or tramway of the Corporation.

Luggage.

11. The conductor may decline to take in or upon a car, any luggage which, from its size or otherwise, is not, in his opinion, suitable for conveyance in or upon such car. Any personal luggage carried by passengers shall be at the entire risk of the owner, and shall be placed in such part of the car as the conductor may direct. No package or luggage of any description, unaccompanied by a passenger, shall be conveyed upon any car, except under any regulations or restrictions which the Corporation may adopt.

Entering full Cars.

12. When any car, or the inside or outside of a car, or any compartment of a car contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to carry, no additional person shall enter, board, or remain in or upon any such car or portion of such car. The conductor shall not permit any person beyond the licensed number of passengers to enter, board, or remain in or upon any part of a car. All such persons shall leave the car immediately upon the request of the conductor.

Disabled Cars.

13. If at any time a car becomes disabled, or in any way injured, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon the request of the conductor, leave the same, and if such passengers have paid their fares, shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid. No person shall, except with the leave of the conductor, enter a disabled or injured car.

The Corporation shall not be bound to complete any journey in any specific time.

Cars proceeding to Sheds.

14. No person shall travel upon a car which is proceeding to a shed or is not on its usual route unless permitted so to do by the conductor, and where such person is so permitted, he shall pay the usual fare payable on such route.

Travelling on Steps, &c.

15. No person, not being an officer or servant of the Corporation, shall travel or ride on the steps, platforms, outside rails, buffers, or guards of any car, and no person, not being an officer or servant of the Corporation, shall stand either on the platforms or on the outside or in the interior of any car, except in accordance with the regulations of the Corporation exhibited upon such car, and subject to the direction of the conductor.

No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or board a car, and no person shall hold on or hang on by or to any part of a car.

Firearms, &c.

16. No person shall travel in or on any car with firearms, glass, or dangerous or offensive articles, instruments, tools, or implements, provided that nothing contained in this Bye-law shall apply to persons in the Naval, Military, Reserve, or Auxiliary Forces, travelling in uniform, carrying unloaded firearms.

Entering and leaving Cars.

17. Every person shall enter or depart from a car by the step of the hindmost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise, unless so directed by the conductor.

All persons desiring to alight from any car shall do so before any person boards the car for the purpose of travelling thereon, and all persons desiring to board the car shall permit such persons to alight as aforesaid.

Entering a Car when in motion.

18. No person shall enter, board, or leave, or attempt to enter, board, or leave any car whilst in motion.

Persons suffering from Disease not to travel on Cars.

19. No person afflicted with any infectious or contagious disease shall board, enter, or travel on any car, or attempt so to do. And no driver or conductor shall suffer or permit any such person so to do.

Power to remove Passengers committing offence.

20. Any person who shall commit, whilst on any car, any legal offence, or any breach of these Bye-laws, shall, in addition to being liable to a penalty, be liable to be immediately removed from the car, and, if such person shall have paid his fare, shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of his fare so paid.

Obstruction.

21. All persons in charge of carts, carriages, or other vehicles, or of animals travelling or being driven on or over, or standing on any part of any road or street in which the tramways are laid, shall, on any car approaching, take or drive them out of the way of the car with all despatch, so as to keep the tramway clear for the use of the car. The person in charge of any vehicle or animal who shall not as soon as possible after the driver of any car has sounded his gong or blown his whistle, drive or take such vehicle or animal off the tramway rails, so as to allow the car to proceed, shall be liable to the penalty hereinbefore provided.

No person or persons shall, by joining in any meeting, crowd, or procession, obstruct any car.
