BOARD OF EDUCATION.

Appointed Day.

Order made under Section 27 (2) of the Education Act, 1902.

Whereas by Sub-section (2) of Section 27 of the Education Act, 1902 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that the Act shall, except as expressly provided, come into operation on the appointed day, and the appointed day shall be the twenty-sixth day of March, nineteen hundred and three, or such other day, not being more than eighteen months later, as the Board of Education may appoint, and different days may be appointed for different purposes and for different provisions of the Act and for different Councils.

And whereas by an Order dated the sixteenth day of March, nineteen hundred and three, the Board of Education have fixed the first day of April, nineteen hundred and three, as the appointed day for the purposes of Sub-section (5) of section 23 of the Act.

And whereas by an Order dated the thirty-first day of July, nineteen hundred and three, the Board of Education have fixed as the appointed day for the Councils of the Boroughs of Chichester and King's Lynn for all other purposes and provisions of the Act the first day of September, nineteen hundred and three, or such later day or days as the Board might for any such other purpose or provision for either of the said Councils thereafter appoint.

Now, therefore, the Board of Education, pursuant to the Act and to every other power enabling them in that behalf, hereby appoint as the appointed day for each of the said Councils for all such other purposes and provisions the first day of October, nineteen hundred and three, or such later day or days as the Board may, for any such other purpose or provision, for either of the said Councils hereafter appoint.

LIGHT RAILWAYS ACT, 1896.

Southend-on-Sea and District Light Railways (Extensions) Order.

The Light Railway Commissioners have submitted to the Board of Trade, for confirmation under the above-mentioned Act, an Order made by them for the construction of Light Railways in the county of Essex, in the borough of Southend-on-Sea and the urban district of Shoeburyness.
