

No. 684.—UNITED STATES—ATLANTIC COAST, MASSACHUSETTS.

Cape Cod—Wireless Telegraph Station, Conspicuous Towers.

The United States Government has given notice, dated 8th August, 1903, that a Marconi wireless telegraph station has been established on Cape Cod; the station structure consists of four iron skeleton framework towers, each 360 feet high, rectangularly placed, and situated about $3\frac{2}{10}$ miles N. 3° W. from Nauset Beach Lights.

Approximate position, lat. $41^{\circ} 55\frac{1}{2}'$ N., long. $69^{\circ} 58\frac{1}{2}'$ W.

The towers are the most conspicuous land marks on the coast.

Port Camogli—Light Established.

Lorenzo Marques—Time Signal Altered.

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 268 of 1903:—

Information, dated 27th July, 1903, has been received, through Commander W. P. Lodder, His Majesty's ship "Monarch," at the Cape of Good Hope, that the time ball which has been established at the Port Captain's office, Lorenzo Marques, will, after 1st September, be hoisted at 0h. 55m. and dropped at 1h. 0m. 0s. p.m. standard time of 30th degree of East longitude, or at 1h. 10m. 18s. 3 P.M. Local Mean Time, corresponding to 23h. 0m. 0s. Greenwich Mean Time.

Should this signal be inaccurate, the ball will be hoisted again at half-mast and kept in that position for 10 minutes, no further signal being made on that day.

No. 687.—MEDITERRANEAN—ALGERIA.

Oran Harbour—Works Completed, Buoys Withdrawn.

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 738 of 1901:—

The French Government has given further notice, dated 6th August, 1903, that the harbour works at Oran are completed.

Sainte Therese Jetty now extends about a cable from the coast in a northerly direction and is 150 feet broad, its outer extremity being marked by two temporary red fixed lights shown from poles at each corner. The light buoys exhibiting red lights formerly marking this extremity have been withdrawn.

Jetty du Large. A new lighthouse, having an iron tower on a stone base, has been erected at the head of this jetty, from which the green fixed light is exhibited, in place of the former lighthouse. A green fixed light is also shown from the spur of this jetty opposite Sainte Therese Jetty, in place of the former light buoy exhibiting a green fixed light.

Dzharuulgach Point—Fog Signal Established.

The Russian Government has given further notice, dated 9th August, 1903, that a fog-bell has been established on the gallery of Dzharuulgach Lighthouse, which will during thick or foggy weather be struck twice in quick succession at intervals not exceeding three minutes.

Reidovi Mole (Vorontzovski) Light—Character Altered.

The Russian Government has given notice that, on 14th August, 1903, the character of the Reidovi Molehead (Vorontzovski) light, Odessa, would be altered from fixed white with alternate red and white flashes every minute to a red fixed and flashing light every half minute, the duration of the flash being five seconds. In other respects the lights would not be altered.
