Colonia—Wreck in Approach, Light-buoys.

Information, dated 7th July, 1903, has been received from the Commodore on the south-east coast of America of the existence of the wreck of the steamship "Lesbury" in the approach to Colonia situated with Farallon Lighthouse bearing S. 85° E., distant one mile, and the western extremity of the Hornos Islands N. 5° E. The wreck is awash at high river.

Two light-buoys, painted red, and exhibiting red fixed lights, have been moored to mark the position at distances of $1\frac{3}{16}$ miles N. 62° W. and $1\frac{1}{16}$ miles S. 75° W. respectively from Farallon Lighthouse.

Approximate position of Farallon Lighthouse, lat. 34° 28½' S., long. 57° 55½' W.

COUNTY BOROUGH OF BLACKBURN.

Blackburn Corporation Tramways.

BYE-LAWS

Made by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Blackburn, being the Promoters of the Blackburn Corporation Tramways Undertaking, under and in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Tramways Act, 1870, at a Meeting of the Town Council, held in the Council Chamber at the Town Hall in the said Borough, on the sixth day of August, 1903.

Interpretation.

1. Throughout these Bye-laws the word "Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Blackburn, and such other local authority as may for the time being use the tramways of the Corporation; the word "tramways" means the tramway system for the time being worked by the Corporation, whether situate in the Borough of Blackburn, or in the districts of Oswaldtwistle and Church; the word "car" means any carriage or car run upon the tramways for the conveyance of passengers; the word "conductor" means any

officer or servant of the Corporation having the charge of or helping in the charge of a car; and the word "driver" means any officer or servant of the Corporation driving or helping to drive a car.

Extent of Bye-laws.

2. The Bye-laws hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to every car using the tramways.

Entering or leaving Cars.

3. Every person shall enter or depart from a car by the step of the hindermost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise, unless so directed by the conductor.

Terminus.

4. No person shall enter or mount or attempt to enter or mount any car arriving or standing at a terminus, stopping place, or other place, until such passengers as may be upon the car and as desire to alight shall have alighted.

Entering or leaving Car in motion.

5. No person shall enter, board, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, board, mount, or leave, any car whilst in motion.

Smoking.

6. No person shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe, cigar, or cigarette inside any car.

Musical Instruments.

7. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any car, play or perform upon any musical instrument, or distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind, or beg or collect money, alms or subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game or gamble, or deposit remnants of food or fruit in or upon any car.

Obscene or Offensive Language, &c.

8. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language, or conduct himself offensively whilst in or upon any car, or spit, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any car or tramway station, or premises used in connection with the tramway system, or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

Intoxicated Persons.

9. No person who is in a state of intoxication, or affected with any dangerous, contagious, or infectious disorder, shall enter or mount upon any car, and if any such person is found in or upon any car it shall be lawful for the conductor, or any other officer or servant of the Corporation, to immediately remove such person from the car, and if such person shall have paid his fare, he shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of his fare so paid.

Damage to Car.

10. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the seats, cushions, curtains, or linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on any car, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any car. Any person acting in contravention of this Bye-law shall, in addition to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws, be liable for the amount of any damage so done.

Objectionable Persons.

11. No person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a car, soil or injure the seats, linings, or cushions of a car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, and no person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to any passenger, shall be entitled to enter or remain in or upon any car, and may be prevented from
