ELLAND FAIR.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that by Memorial dated the 7th August 1903, a representation

has been duly made to him by the Elland Urban District Council that a Fair is annually held at Elland, commencing on the first Monday after the 12th August, and continuing throughout the week, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that such Fair should in future be confined to the first three days of the week, beginning on the Monday after the 12th August in each year.

On the 19th day of October, 1903, the Secretary of State will take such representation into consideration, and any person who may desire to object to the proposed limitation of the period during which the Fair has hitherto been held, should intimate his objections to the Secretary of State before that day.
