TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Monday, the 28th instant, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Acts 40 Vic., cap. 2, and 52 Vic., cap. 6, to the amount of £1,000,000, in replacement of Bills falling due on the 4th October.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 3rd October, 1903, and will be payable at three months after date, viz.:—on the 3rd January, 1904.

3. *The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for, and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.*

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Tuesday, the 29th instant, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than twelve o'clock, on Saturday, the 3rd proximo.

6. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

INCOME TAX.

REGISTRATION OF BIRTHS AND DEATHS.

Notice is hereby given, that in pursuance of the provisions of the twenty-first section of an Act passed in the thirty-eighth year of the reign of Her late Majesty, intitled "The Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874," I, William Cospatrick Dunbar, C.B., Registrar-General of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in England, have, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, ordered and declared that, on and after the first day of October next, in order that the three Sub-Districts of Depwade Registration District may be made respectively co-extensive with the three Relief Districts of Depwade Poor Law Union, as recently created, the Registration District shall be redivided into three Sub-Districts constituted as follows:—(1) A Sub-District to be called and known as Harleston Sub-District, and to consist of the Civil Parishes of Alburgh, Billington, Brockdish, Denton, Dickleburgh, Earsham, Needham, Pulham St. Mary Magdalene, Pulham St. Mary the Virgin, Redenhall with Harleston, Rushall, Starston, Thorpe Abbots, Tivetshall St. Margaret, Tivetshall St. Mary, and Wortwell; (2) a Sub-District to be called and known as Diss Sub-District, and to consist of the Civil Parishes of Bressingham, Burston, Diss, Fersfield, Gissing, Roydon, Scole, Shelfanger, Shimpling, Thelveton, and Winfarthing; (3) a Sub-District to be called and known as Stratton Sub-District, and to consist of the Civil Parishes of Ashwellthorpe, Aslactou, Bunwell, Carleton Rode, Forncett St. Mary, Forncett St. Peter, Fritton, Fundenball, Hapton, Hardwick, Hempnall, Morningthorpe, Moulton St. Michael, Shelton, Stratton St. Mary, Stratton St. Michael, Tacolneston, Tasburgh, Tharston, Tibeuham, and Wacton.—Witness my hand this twenty-first day of September, one thousand nine hundred and three.

NOTICES TO MARINERS.

No. 753.—AUSTRALIA—VICTORIA.

*Port Phillip, South Channel—Gas Buoy
Established; Shoal Found.*

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 432 of 1903:—

The Government of the State of Victoria has given notice, dated 20th July, 1903, that on 27th July, 1903, a gas buoy, showing a red fixed light, will be established in a depth of 33 feet to mark the shoals near the line of the leading lights. From it the eastern flagstaff of the Quarantine Station bears S. 30° W., distant 11 cables, and Point King S. 40° E.

Also, of the existence of a shoal, with 23 feet of water over it, situated in the South channel of Port Phillip, with the east flagstaff of the Quarantine Station bearing S. 9° W., distant 8 cables, and Point King S. 54° E.

Vessels drawing more than 24 feet of water should leave the line of lights when about a mile from this buoy, passing southward of it at a distance of about half a cable, afterwards returning to the line of lights.

Approximate position, Quarantine east flagstaff, lat. 38° 19' S., long. 144° 42' E.
