#### WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Southampton) Order, 1903.

Dated 15th September, 1903.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1902,

ministrative County of Southampton, I hereby make the following Order:-

#### Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Southampton) Order, 1903."

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

II. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of Southampton to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the Act:

Bustard, Little Bustard, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Baillon's Crake, Little Crake, Spotted Crake, Crossbill, Eagle (all species), Peregrine Falcon, Hen Harrier, Marsh Harrier, Montagu's Harrier, Night Heron, Kestrel. Kite, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Nutcracker, Nuthatch, Osprey, Rose-coloured Pastor, Quail, Raven, Lesser Redpole, Stork, Swallow, Swift, Bearded Tit, Dartford Warbler.

#### The Cormorant and Shag deprived of Protection.

III. The whole of the Administrative County of Southampton is hereby exempted from the operation of the Act of 1880, as to the undermentioned birds :-

Cormorant, Shag.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

IV. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year and the 1st day of March following, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Southampton:

Avocet, Bittern (all species), Great Bustard, Little Bustard, Common Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chough, Crossbill, Stone Curlew, Diver (all species), Eagle (all species), Peregrine Falcon, Goldfinch, Black-necked Grebe (Eared Grebe), Crested Grebe, Red-necked Sclavonian Grebe, Gull (all species), Marsh Harrier, Montagu's Harrier, Hobby, Hoopoe, Kingfisher, Kite, Merlin, Nutcracker, Nuthatch, Oriole, Osprey, Owl (all species), Raven, Lesser Redpole, Black Redstart, Great Grey Shrike, Spoonbill, Tern (all species), Bearded Tit, Dartford Warbler, Woodlark, Woodpecker (all species).

#### All Birds protected on Sundays and on Christmas Day in certain Areas.

V. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year and the 1st day of March iollowing, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays and on Christmas Day is prohibited in the following Petty Sessional Divisions of the County of Southampton:—Alton, Basingstoke, Fareham, Lymington and New Forest, Odiham, Petersfield, Ringwood, Romsey, Southampton, and Wischester. and Winchester

#### Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.

VI. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Southampton:-

Bittern (all species), Common Buzzard, Honey uzzard, Crossbill, Common Curlew, Stone Buzzard, Crossbill, Common Curlew, Stone Curlew, Wild Duck (all species), Goldfinch, Great-crested Grebe, Black - headed Gull, Montagu's Harrier, Marsh Harrier, Common Black - headed and upon application by the Council of the Ad- I Heron, Night Heron, Hobby, Hoopoe, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar, Nuthatch, Oriole, Owl, Quail, Raven, Lesser Redpole, Redshank, Sand-Grouse, Sheldrake, Tern (all species), Dartford Warbler, Woodpecker, and (after April 30th) Lapwing, Peewit, or Green

Joseph Crossfield and Sons Limited, of Warrington, given pursuant to the provisions of the above-mentioned Act, of their intention to construct certain works in and across the River Mersey at Warrington in accordance with plans and sections deposited at this office, a copy of which notice is subjoined.

In pursuance of an Act for better preserving the Navigation of the River Mersey (5 and 6 Vic., cap. 110), we, Joseph Crosfield and Sons Limited, Soap and Chemical Manufacturers, Warrington, hereby give you notice that we propose to construct at or near Warrington, on the south-east bank of the River Mersey, in the township of Walton Inferior, in the county of Chester, in accordance with plans and sections deposited at the office of the Mersey Conservancy

(a.) A wooden jetty supported on piles driven into the bed and banks of the River Mersey and extending for a distance of 40 yards about 18 feet in or over the river beyond the low water mark of ordinary tides and at a height 3 feet above the average high water level of the river.

(b.) A wood or iron upright staging on such jetty 12 feet by 12 feet at the base and 72 feet in height above low water level for the purpose of carrying an iron pipe six inches in diameter with tie rods over the said river at a height above the low water level of the river to the underside of the tie rods of 64 feet.

(c.) A wire cable and telpher line across the river from a building on the north-west bank to other works proposed to be constructed on land on the south-east side of the river at a height above the low water level of the river to the underside of the cable or telpher line of 64 feet. The proposed works will not exclude impede or

interrupt the tidal waters of the river.

The proposed works are required for the transport of goods and materials.

#### ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

(Dated 23rd September 1903.)

FOREIGN ANIMALS (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1903 (No. 3).

The Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Article 1 of the Foreign Animals Order of 1903, which prohibits the landing in Great Britain of animals from certain prohibited countries, shall cease to apply to animals brought from the States of Maine, New Hampshire, Vermont, Massachusetts, Connecticut, and Rhode Island, in the United States of America; and the First Schedule to such Order (Prohibited Countries and Parts of Countries) shall be read and have effect as if the said six States were not included in the list of prohibited countries and parts of countries mentioned in that Schedule.

Prohibition of Swine from the United States of America maintained.

2. Nothing in this Order shall affect the prohibition in the Foreign Animals Order of 1903 of the landing in Great Britain of Swine brought from the United States of America.

#### Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the Foreign Animals (Amendment) Order of 1903 (No. 3).

The driver of a car, on coming in sight of a vehicle standing or travelling on any part of the road so as not to leave sufficient space for the car to pass, shall sound his bell or gong as a warning to the person in charge of such vehicle, and that person shall, with reasonable dispatch, cause such vehicle to be removed so as not to obstruct the

3. No person shall in any way wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic on the tramways, nor shall any driver or conductor needlessly cause interruption to the ordinary road traffic.

4. Every driver, conductor, or other person offending against any of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each offence.

5. These Bye-laws shall come into force on the

1st day of January, 1904.
