

HORFIELD CERTIFIED INEBRIATE REFORMATORY.

New Certificate.

The Right Honourable Aretas Akers-Douglas, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, has this day granted a new Certificate to the Horfield Inebriate Reformatory in the county

of Gloucester, which Institution will continue to be used as a Discharging House.

The number of females to be detained under the new Certificate is not to exceed 20. No person is to be admitted except by transfer from another reformatory, nor until such person is within six months of absolute discharge, or discharge on licence; and no inmate is to be detained for a longer period than six months.
