The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated September 26, from His Majesty's Representative at Trieste, enclosing the following translation of a Circular issued by the Imperial and Royal Marine Board at Trieste, respecting preventive measures against infection by plague to goods imported from Marseilles:—

By decree of September 19th, 1903 (B.L.J. No. 190), issued by the Imperial and Royal Ministries of the Interior, of Commerce, and Finance, in conjunction with the Royal Hungarian Government and according to the International Sanitary Convention and to the Sanitary Regulations of March 19th, 1897 (B.L.J. No. 13 ex 1901), the importation and transit of the following goods and articles is prohibited and respectively restricted from the town and port of Marseilles:—

(1.) Of used body linen clothes, of old clothing (personal effects), old bed clothing, when such articles are forwarded as personal baggage or household effects in consequence of change of residence, they are subject upon passing the frontier to special regulations and treatment by the sanitary Police.

(2.) Of rags and tatters, not excluding rags compressed by hydraulic power which are packed in bales as articles of commerce.

(3.) Of used sackings, carpets, and used embroideries.

(4.) Of raw and unprepared hides, of untanned hides.

(5.) Of animal substances raw unprepared, nails, hoofs, horse-hair, hair, raw silk and wool.

(6.) Of human hair.

Permission will be granted for transit of the goods and articles enumerated if such goods are so packed to exclude during the voyage any contact whatsoever, and if it is proved that importation and transit is allowed in the neighbouring Foreign territory of transit and respectively of importation.

The present order comes into force on the day that it is received respectively by the Custom House Offices and by the Marine Sanitary Offices.

This is issued for information and guidance with the observation that the above-mentioned goods, as in general those that would be considered suspect from a sanitary point of view which could be introduced into the Austrian Monarchy during the time that the present decree is in force, will be sent to the nearest Lazaretto at the expense of the parties, and there they will be subjected by the Authorities either to destruction, or to disinfection according to the case, without taking into consideration the damage of the goods, and this will be done at the expense of the parties without granting any compensation.

And whereas the Churchwardens of the said Parish pursuant to a Resolution of the Vestry, at a Meeting on Friday, the 17th day of April, 1903, have applied to Us, the Local Government Board, for an Order putting in force in the said Parish so much of the Vestries Act, 1850, as relates to the appointment of a Vestry Clerk:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—So much of the Vestries Act, 1850, as relates to the appointment of a Vestry Clerk shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said Parish of South Lynn or All Saints.

ARTICLE II.—It shall be the duty of the Vestry Clerk for the time being appointed for the said parish—

To give notice of and attend the Meetings of Vestry and Committees appointed thereat.

To summon and attend Meetings of the Churchwardens and Overseers, when required, and to enter the minutes thereof respectively.

To keep the Account of all Charity Monies which the Churchwardens or Overseers are authorized or are accustomed to distribute.

To keep the Vestry Books and the Parish deeds and documents, and to give copies of and extracts from the same to any person entitled thereto, such person paying for the same at the rate of Fourpence for every Seventy-two words or figures, and to permit any person or persons rated to the relief of the Poor of the said Parish, at all reasonable times, to inspect the same or any of them, on pain of dismissal for neglecting to give such copies, or permit such inspection.

To make out, when required by the Vestry, the Church Rate, and procure the same to be signed and completed, and to retain the custody thereof.

To advise the Churchwardens and Overseers as to the recovery of arrears of rates.

To keep and make out the Accounts of the Churchwardens, and to present such Accounts to the Vestry or other legal authority, to be passed, and to examine the Church Rate Collectors' Accounts and returns of arrears.

To assist the Overseers in making out their Accounts (whenever required by them) and, subject to the Rules and Regulations of the Local Government Board, to examine from time to time the Accounts of the Assistant Overseers or Collectors of Poor Rates and their returns of arrears.

To assist the Churchwardens or Overseers in preparing and making out all other Parochial Assessments, and Accounts, and in examining the Accounts of the Collectors of such Assessments.

To make all returns required of the Churchwardens or of the Overseers by law or proper authority.

To advise the Churchwardens and Overseers in all the duties of their office; and also to perform such other duties and services of a like nature as the Local Government Board, from time to time, at the request of the Churchwardens or Overseers or otherwise shall prescribe and direct to be performed by such Vestry Clerk.

ARTICLE III.—The Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said Parish shall pay to the person for the time being appointed to the office of Vestry Clerk under the authority of this Order a salary at the rate of Five Pounds and Five Shillings per annum, or such other remuneration for the performance of the duties of that office as We may from time to time direct or approve.

ARTICLE IV.—Such remuneration, in the case of an annual salary, shall be considered as accruing from day to day, and be apportionable in respect of time accordingly, in pursuance of the provisions of the Apportionment Act, 1870, and shall be paid quarterly, on the usual Quarter Days in each year, namely, Midsummer Day, Michaelmas Day, Christmas Day, and Lady Day.
