The following Rules have been signed by the Lord Chancellor:—

YOUTHFUL OFFENDERS.

The Summary Jurisdiction Rules (September', 1903, dated September 14, 1903.

I. The security which a Court of Summary Jurisdiction may, under section 2 of the Youthful Offenders Act, 1901, require a parent or guardian to give for the good behaviour of a child or young person shall be given by way of recognizance; and the forms prescribed by the Summary Jurisdiction Rules, 1886, or forms to the like effect, shall be applicable thereto with such variations as circumstances may require.

II. The Clerk of each Court of Summary Jurisdiction shall within three days from the date of the order send by post to the Inspector of Reformatory and Industrial Schools a copy of each order made by the Court for contribution to the support and maintenance of a child under section 4 or section 6 (1) of the Youthful Offenders Act, 1901, or under sections 25 and 26 of the Reformatory Schools Act, 1866, or under section 40 of the Industrial Schools Act, 1866, or under any local Act relating to Reformatory and Industrial Schools.

III. An order made under section 4 or section 6 of the Youthful Offenders Act, 1901, on a parent or other person legally liable to maintain a child or young person, may be served by any Constable or School Attendance Officer or Agent of His Majesty's Inspector of Reformatory Schools by delivering a copy of such order to the person on whom it is made, or by leaving the same at such person's last known place of abode with some other person for him.

IV. The time within which an application may be made to the Court against an order made under section 4 or section 6 of the Youthful Offenders Act, 1901, on a parent or other person liable to maintain a child or young person shall be one month after service of a copy of the order.

V. The forms in the Schedule hereto, or forms to the like effect, may be used with such variations as circumstances may require for the purposes of the Reformatory Schools Act, 1866, the Reformatory Schools Act, 1893, and the Reformatory Schools Act, 1899, and for the purposes of the Industrial Schools Act, 1866, the Industrial Schools Act Amendment Act, 1880, the Industrial Schools Act, 1894, the Elementary Education Act, 1876, and the Youthful Offenders Act, 1901.

These Rules may be cited as the Summary Jurisdiction Rules (September) 1903; and are in substitution for the Rules made and declared urgent on the 4th January, 1902, and Gazetted on the 7th January following, which latter Rules are hereby annulied.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS on the ninth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eightysix, a Convention (hereinafter called the Berne Convention) with respect to the protection to be given by way of copyright to the authors of literary and artistic works was concluded between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and the foreign countries following, that is to say:—Belgium, Hayti, Switzerland, France, Italy, Germany, Spain, and Tunis.

And whereas on the fifth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, the ratifications of the said Convention were duly exchanged between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and the aforesaid countries.

And whereas by an Order in Council dated the twenty-eighth day of November one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and made under the authority committed to Her late Majesty Queen Victoria by the International Copyright Acts, 1844 to 1886. Her Majesty was pleased to make provision for giving rights of copyright throughout Her Majesty's dominions to the authors of literary and artistic works first produced in any of the said foreign countries (therein referred to as the foreign countries of the Copyright Union) and otherwise giving effect throughout Her Majesty's dominions to the terms of the said Berne Convention, and an English translation of the said Convention was set out in the first schedule to the said Order in Council.

And whereas since the date of the said Order in Council the foreign countries following, namely:—Luxembourg, Monaco, Montenegro, and Norway have acceded to the said Berne Convention, and by Orders in Council dated respectively the tenth day of August one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, the fifteenth day of October one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, the sixteenth day of May one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three; and

the first day of August one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, and made under the authority aforesaid, the provisions of the said Order in Council of the twenty-eighth day of November one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, have been extended to the lastmentioned foreign countries respectively

And whereas an Additional Act to the said Berne Convention was agreed upon between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and the following foreign countries for the purpose of varying the provisions of the said Berne Convention, namely, Germany, Italy, Switzerland, Belgium, Luxembourg, Spain, Monaco, Tunis, France, and Montenegro, and the ratifications of the said Additional Act were on the ninth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, exchanged between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria

and the said foreign countries.

And whereas by an Order in Council dated the seventh day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, and made under the authority aforesaid Her late Majesty Queen Victoria was pleased to make provision for varying the hereinbefore recited Order in Council of the twenty-eighth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and otherwise giving effect to the said Additional Act throughout Her Majesty's dominions so far as regards the foreign countries hereinbefore named as parties to the said Additional Act, and an English translation of the said Additional Act is set forth in the Schedule to the Order in Council now in

And whereas the Republic of Hayti having duly acceded to the said Additional Act, the said Order in Council of the seventh day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, was by Order in Council of the nineteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight,

extended to the said Republic.

And whereas the Empire of Japan having duly acceded to the said Berne Convention and the said Additional Act, the said Orders in Council of the twenty-eighth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and the seventh day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, were by Order in Council of the eighth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, extended to the said

Empire of Japan. And whereas the Principality of Montenegro having duly denounced the said Berne Convention the said Order in Council of the sixteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninetythree, was revoked by an Order in Council of the eighth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, and the provisions of the said Orders in Council of the twenty-eighth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and the seventh day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, have ceased to apply to the said Principality of Montenegro.

And whereas the foreign countries following namely:-Luxembourg, Monaco, Norway, and Japan, together with the foreign countries comprised in the said Order in Council of the twentyeighth day of November one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, now constitute the foreign countries of the Copyright Union within the meaning of the said Order in Council of the twenty-eighth day of November one thousand

eight hundred and eighty-seven.

And whereas it has been intimated to His Majesty's Government that the Government of Denmark have notified the accession of that country to the said Berne Convention and Additional Act so far as regards the Kingdom of Denmark and the Faroe Islands, but excluding Iceland, Greenland, and the Danish Antilles such accession to take effect from the first day of July one thousand nine hundred and three.

And whereas His Majesty in Council is satisfied that the said Government of Denmark has made such provisious as it appears to His Majesty expedient to require for the protection of authors' works first produced in His Majesty's dominions.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council and by virtue of the authority committed to His Majesty by the International Copyright Acts, 1844 to 1886, doth order and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

- 1. From and after the commencement of this Order the hereinbefore recited Orders in Council of the twenty-eighth day of November one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and the seventh day of March one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight shall extend to the Kingdom of Denmark and the Faroe Islands.
- 2. This Order shall come into operation as from the first day of July one thousand nine hundred and three, which date is hereinbefore referred to as the commencement of this Order.
- 3. And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary orders herein accordingly.





hundred and fifty-three, except as follows:-In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said churchyard or the said burial ground, burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

Spratton.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Saint Luke, Spratton, in the county of Northampton; and in the churchyard, except as follows:

In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said churchyard burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin | buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

TETBURY .- Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Saint Mary, Tetbury, in the county of Gloucester; and in the church-

yard, except as follows:-

"Whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council dated the twenty-sixth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and one, to establish regulations for the grant from Naval Funds of Pensions and Allowances to widows and children of non-commissioned officers, petty officers and men of the Royal Navy and Marines and of the Reserve Forces whose deaths are attributable to warlike operations:

"And whereas the Pensions which may be granted under such regulations are at higher rates than the pensious which are granted from the funds of Greenwich Hospital to the widows of Seamen, Marines and other seafaring persons who are killed or drowned on duty in the service of the Crown (other than warlike operations), or on lifeboat service, under authority of an Order in Council of Her late Majesty bearing date the twelfth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three:

"And whereas we deem it advisable that these pensions and allowances shall be granted accord-

ing to an uniform scale:
"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the Pensions which are now granted from the funds of Green-wich Hospital being supplemented from Naval Funds to the extent which may be necessary to raise them as from the first July, one thousand nine hundred and three, to the scale sanctioned by Your Majesty's aforesaid Order in Council of the twenty-sixth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and one:

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have expressed their concurrence in

this proposal:

"We further beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased to approve of the regulations for the grant of Pensions and Allowances from the funds of Greenwich Hospital which are annexed hereto being substituted for those now in force.

REGULATIONS for the Grant of Pensions to Widows, and Allowances to Children, and of Gratuities to Parents and other Relatives of Seamen, Marines, and other Seafaring Persons.

1. Under the second section of Act 46 and 47 Vict., cap. 32, Pensions and Allowances are granted by the Admiralty out of the Funds of Greenwich Hospital to Widows and Children

(a) Non-commissioned officers and petty officers and men of the Royal Navy and Marines killed or drowned in the service of

the Crown, or on lifeboat service; and of
(b) Men of the Royal Naval Volunteers
(i.e., Royal Naval Reserve) killed or drowned in the service of the Crown; and of

(c) Men killed or drowned in the service of the Crown while serving in the Seamen Pensioners' Reserve; and of

(d) Men of the Royal Naval Artillery Volunteer Force killed or drowned in the service of the

Crown.

2. These Pensions and Allowances are granted also to Widows and Children of non-commissioned officers, petty officers or men as aforesaid who die from the effects of any injury or disease when it shall be proved to the satisfaction of the Admiralty:

(a) That the injury or disease was caused by accident on duty in the service of the Crown, and that the man died therefrom

within two years; or

(b) That the injury or disease was caused by extraordinary exposure or exertion on duty minated fatally within two years of being first certified.

3. Pension or Allowance will not be granted when death has been due to a man's own culpable action or negligence, or when the Widow was | following scale :-

5. If a Widow re-marry, her Pension will cease, and she will be eligible to receive a Gratuity equal to one year's pension in full discharge of all claims upon the public bounty. Allowances to children may be continued.

6. Pensions and Allowances are tenable subject to good behaviour, and are granted at the discretion of the Admiralty. They cannot be claimed as a right. Any assignment, sale, or contract relating to a Pension or Allowance is void.

7. If a Mother die, or children be removed from a Mother's control on account of her misconduct (see paragraph 6), the allowances in respect of the Children may be paid at twice the normal rates (see paragraph 4); or provision may be made for the maintenance of the Children in a benevolent institution.

8. If a Widow be in receipt of parish relief, in respect either of herself or her family, the payment of the Pension and Allowance may be suspended. In no case will the Pension or Allowance

be paid to the parish authorities.

9. Widows will be required to make a declaration quarterly or whenever it may be considered necessary, before a duly authorized person, as to their continued widowhood, and of any particulars required in reference to their families. (Forms for this purpose will be supplied.)

10. Boys above 14 and girls above 16 will, as a rule, be ineligible for Allowances.

11. If the claim of a Widow to a Pension be not established before her death, the amount of the Pension to which she would have been entitled if living will not be allowed to her re-

12. These Regulations apply only from the first July, one thousand nine hundred and three.

13. In the event of men specified in paragraphs 1 and 2 not leaving Widows or Children, but leaving Parents or other Relatives dependent upon them, Gratuities not exceeding one year's full wages may be given at the discretion of the Admiralty to such Parents or Relatives, provided \[

the total expenditure in such Gratuities shall not exceed in any one year the sum of five hundred pounds.

Note.—Widows of Coast Guard Men entitled to Civil Pensions are excepted from these Regulations.

And whereas the provisions of section one of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

HEREAS it is expedient to amend the provisions of the Southern Rhodesia Order in Council, 1898.

Now therefore His Majesty by and with the

advice of His Privy Council is pleased to order

and it is hereby ordered as follows:

1. This Order may be cited as the Southern Rhodesia Order in Council, 1903, and shall be read and construed as one with the Southern Rhodesia Order in Council 1898, hereinafter referred to as the principal Order.

2. Articles seventeen, twenty-three, thirtytwo, forty, and forty-one of the principal Order are hereby revoked as and from the commencement of this Order, but without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder and the following provisions are hereby substituted for each of the said Articles, respectively:teen (A.) (1) There shall be in Southern Rhodesia a legislative body to be styled "the Legislative Council" composed of the Administrator, the Resident Commissioner, and fourteen other members, of whom seven, hereinafter referred to as "nominated members" shall be appointed by the Company, with the approval of a Secretary of State, and seven shall be elected by the registered voters in the manner hereiuafter provided. Provided that the proceedings of the Council shall not be invalid on account of any vacancies therein.

(2.) Notwithstanding anything contained in the principal Order, the High Commissioner may from time to time, with the previous approval of a Secretary of State by proclamation alter and amend any provision of this Order or of the principal Order relating to the constitution of the Legislative Council if the said Council shall resolve that such alteration and amendment be made, provided that any resolution of the Legislative Council which recommends that the numbers of the nominated and elected members respectively of the said Council shall be unequal shall be passed by a majority of not less than three-fourths of the members of the whole Legislative Council as constituted at the date of any such resolution.

(3.) The nominated members of the Legislative Council shall take precedence of the elected members. The Company, with the approval of a Secretary of State, shall determine the precedence of the nominated members amongst The elected members shall rank themselves. among themselves in order of the date of their election, and two or more members elected on the same day shall rank in the alphabetical order

of their names.

(B.) Until the expiration of their term of office by effluxion of time unless the Council be sooner dissolved, the existing elected members for Mashonaland shall continue to hold their seats in the Council as representatives of the electoral district containing the district of Salisbury, and the existing elected members for Matabeleland shall continue to hold their seats as representatives of the electoral district con-

taining the district of Bulawayo.
23. The Administrator shall preside at the meetings of the Legislative Council, and in his absence such other member of the Council as may be appointed in writing by the Administrator

shall preside.

32.—(1.) Questions arising in the Legislative Council, or in any Committee of the Legislative Council, shall be decided by a majority of votes of the members present other than the Adminis trator and the Resident Commissioner.

(2.) In the event of an equality of votes on any question arising in the Legislative Council, the Administrator shall have a casting vote. Any member appointed by the Administrator to preside in his absence at a meeting of the Council shall have a casting vote when presiding, as well

as an original vote.

(3.) In the event of an equality of votes arising on any question in a Committee of the Legislative Council (a) when the Administrator is present, the Chairman of the Council in Committee shall have an original vote only, and the Administrator shall have a casting vote. (b) When the Ad-ministrator is absent, the Chairman of the Council in Committee shall have a casting vote as well as an original vote.

40. No Ordinance, vote, resolution or question, the object or effect of which may be to dispose of or charge any part of the Revenues of Southern Rhodesia, or to revoke, alter or vary any such disposition or charge, shall be proposed except by the Administrator acting on the instructions of the Company, or by his authority in writing previously obtained.

41. The Administrator shall submit to the Legislative Council in each year, such an estimate as he may think necessary of the whole expenditure, not already fixed, which is intended to be incurred for services within Southern Rhodesia, together with an Estimate of the Revenue of Southern Rhodesia for the financial year then next ensuing, and shall transmit to the High Commissioner and to the Company at the earliest opportunity an Ordinance providing for the service of that year. Provided that emoluments of the Administrator, members of the Executive Council, and of such nominated members of the Legislative Council as are not members of the Executive Council, Judges of the High Court, Magistrates, Native Commissioners, and Assistant Native Commissioners shall be deemed to be reserved, and shall not be subjected to the vote of the Legislative Council.

3. This Order shall be published in the Gazette, and commence and come into operation on a day to be fixed by the High Commissioner, and the High Commissioner shall give directions for the publication of this Order at such place, and in such manner, and for such time or times as he thinks proper for giving due publicity thereto.

4. His Majesty may from time to time revoke,

alter add to or amend this Order.

ILKESTON CORPORATION TRAMWAYS. Bye-laws for regulating travelling in or upon Carriages on the Tramways.

OTICE is hereby given, that the following Bye-laws and Regulations were made by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Ilkeston, in the county of Derby, with respect to the tramways and tramcars of the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses (hereinafter designated the Corporation), under the powers of the Tramways Act, 1870, on the 6th day of October, 1903:

For the purpose of these Bye-laws the term "Corporation" shall mean the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Ilkeston; the term "trainways" shall mean the tramways authorized by the Ilkeston Corporation Tramways Order, 1899, or any of those tramways; the term "carriage" shall mean any car or carriage using the tramways; and the terms "driver" and "conductor" shall respectively mean the driver and conductor or other person having charge of the car.

1. No person not being a servant of the Tramways Department shall enter or depart from a carriage except by the hindmost or conductor's platform.

2. No person shall smoke inside any carriage, nor on the roof, except at the back of the trolley

standard.

3. No person shall, whilst travelling in or upon any carriage, play or perform upon any musical instrument, or shout, sing, or cause any other

disturbance.

4. No person in a state of intoxication shall enter or mount upon any carriage, and if any such person is found in or upon any carriage, he shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

5. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any carriage, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any carriage, or wilfully interfere with the

comfort of any passenger.

6. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any number, plate, printed or other notice in or on the carriage, or break, or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage. Any person acting in contravention to this Regulation shall be liable to the ponalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of the damage done.

7. A person whose dress or clothing might in the opinion of the conductor of a carriage, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who in the opinion of the conductor might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in or upon any carriage, and may be prevented from entering in or upon any carriage, and shall not enter in or upon any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and if found in or upon any carriage shall, on the request of the conductor, leave the carriage upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

S. Each passenger shall upon demand pay to the conductor or other duly authorized officer of the Corporation the fare legally demandable for

the journey.

9. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any), when required to do so, to the conductor or any duly authorized servant of the Corporation, and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

10. No person, not being a servant, shall travel on the steps or platforms of any carriage, or stand either on the roof or in the interior, or sit on the outside rail on the roof of any carriage, and any person so doing shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

11. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or mount any carriage, and no person shall hold by or hang to any part of any carriage, or travel thereby otherwise than

on a seat provided for passengers.

12. When any carriage contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to contain, no additional person shall enter, mount,

or remain in or on any such carriage when warned by the conductor not to do so.

13. No person shall enter or mount, or attempt to enter or mount, any carriage arriving or standing at a terminus or stopping place until such passengers as may be upon the carriage, and as desire to dismount, shall have had a reasonable opportunity of doing so.

14. No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount or leave, any carriage whilst in motion.

15. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artizans, mechanics, and daily labourers) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform, and not in the interior or on the roof of

any carriage.

16. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in the interior of any carriage, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal is offensive or an annoyance to any passenger shall the same be allowed on the outside of any carriage. No person shall take a dog or other animal on any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken, or being on any carriage in breach of this Bye-law, shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the carriage immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by, or under the direction of, the conductor.

17. No person shall travel in or on any carriage with loaded firearms, or with any combustible or dangerous substance or material.

18. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with the tramways, or any carriage thereon.

19. The conductor of each carriage shall enforce or prevent the breach of these Bye-laws and Regulations to the best of his ability.

20. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of the above Bye-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding 40s. for each offence.

21. The Corporation shall cause to be placed, and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each carriage, a printed copy of these Byelaws.

22. These Bye-laws shall come into force on the twenty-first day of December, 1903.
