The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

W HEREAS by section twenty-six of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, " chapelries and other places or districts may be "separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may in "some instances with advantage be annexed to "parishes or districts to which they are con-"tiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for "ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted "That when with respect to his "own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop "of the Province, or when the Bishop of any "diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop "that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or "district within the diocese of such Archbishop, " or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may "be, may be advantageously separated from any " parish or mother church, and either be consti-"tuted a separate benefice by itself or be united "to any other parish to which it may be more " conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining "tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, "parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a "separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-"parochial place may with advantage be annexed "to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be " constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical

" purposes; and the said Archbishop or Bishop "shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme " cf such Bishop to be transmitted to the said " Archbishop for his consideration) describing the " mode in which it appears to him that the " alteration may best be effected, and how the " changes consequent on such alteration in respect " to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, " rent charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates " and payments, and in respect to patronage and " rights to pews, may be made with justice to " all parties interested; and if the patron or " patrons of the benefice or benefices to be " affected by such alteration shall consent in " writing under his or their hands to such " scheme, or to such modification thereof as the " said Archbishop may approve, and the said " Archbishop shall, on full consideration and " inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or " modification thereof, and shall certify the same " and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to " His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for " His Majesty in Council, to make an Order for " carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, " as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas by section 8 of the Church Building Act, 1839, it is, amongst other things, further enacted, "That when by any Order of "His Majesty in Council, as aforesaid, a separate "parish for ecclesiastical purposes is constituted, "the same shall, on registration thereof, and "with the consent in writing of the Incumbent "or Incumbents of the benefice or benefices to be "thereby affected, become a perpetual curacy "and benefice, and the minister thereof duly "nominated and licensed thereto, and his suc-"cessors, shall be a body politic and corporate, "with perpetual succession, and may receive and "take to himself and his successors all such "lands, tenements, tithes, rent charges, and "hereditaments as shall be granted unto him or "them, and such perpetual curate shall thence-"forth have, within the limits of the district "parish formed under the Church Building Acts,

" such Order as aforesaid." And whereas the Right Reverend Alwyne, Lord Bishop of Ely, hath made a representation in writing, to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows :

"I Alwyne by Divine permission Bishop of

Ely do hereby represent to your Grace. "There is in my diocese of Ely and the county of Bedford the rectory or benefice of Campton with the chapelry of Shefford.

"There are also in my said diocese and the said county of Bedford the rectory or benefice of Clifton and the vicarage or benefice of Southill both of which are contiguous to the said chapelry of Shefford.

"The population of Campton is four hundred and thirty-seven with church accommodation for three hundred persons, of Shefford eight hundred and seventy-four with church accommodation for five hundred, of Clifton one thousand two hundred and sixty-three with church accommodation for four hundred and forty-five.

"Sir Algernon Osborn Baronet of Chicksands Priory Shefford is the patron of the benefice of Campton-with-Shefford, the Reverend Henry Hugh Miles of 10 Albany-road St. Leonards-on-Sea is the patron of the benefice of Clifton, Samuel Whitbread Esquire of Southill Park Biggleswade is the patron of Southill. "The Reverend George Montagu Osborn is

the Incumbent of Campton-with-Shefford, the Reverend John Pycock is the Incumbent of Clifton, the Revered John Alexander Guillebaud is the Incumbent of Southill.

"The benefice of Campton-with-Shefford is of the annual value of two hundred and seventysix pounds or thereabouts, the benefice of Clifton is of the annual value of three hundred and three pounds or thereabouts, the benefice of Southill is of the annual value of two hundred and twenty-

five pounds or thereabouts. "It is proposed to separate the whole of the chapelry of Shefford from Campton and to annex to such chapelry (1) a certain district from the contiguous parish of Clifton (2) a certain district from the contiguous parish of Southill (3) a certain district of the contiguous extra-parochial place of Shefford Hardwick which is also in my diocese and the county of Bedford which said three districts are severally hereinafter described.

"The chapelry of Shefford has a church of its The several portions or districts proposed own. to be severed from Ulifton, Southill and Shefford Hardwick are in close proximity to Shefford Church and the residents there are in the habit of attending Shefford Church. Shefford is too large and too important a place to be merely a chapel of ease to Campton and its severance from Campton and the annexation thereto of the several portions or districts before referred to will make a convenient new parish.

"The population of the proposed new parish will be one thousand four hundred or thereabouts.

"The income of the Incumbent of such new parish or beuefice will be provided by a charge of sixty pounds a year on the endowments of the rectory of Campton, fifty pounds a year on the endowments of Clifton and by the raising of a capital sum sufficient to provide a further twenty pounds that is to say one hundred and

of parishioners will it is hoped provide twenty pounds a year more.

"It therefore appears to me that under the provisions of the Pluralities Act 1838 the said chapelry of Shefford and the several portions or districts hereinbefore described of the parishes of Clifton and Southill and of the extra-parochial place of Shefford Hardwick may advantageously be respectively separated from the said several parishes to which they now belong and be united and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes so as to form a separate parish or benefice and in pursuance of the twenty-sixth section of the said Act I have prepared the following scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alterations may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithes rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested which scheme has the consent thereto of Sir Algernon Osborn Baronet as the patron of Campton with Shefford of the Reverend Henry Hugb Miles as the patron of Clifton and of Samuel Whitbread Esquire as the patron of Southill and of the Reverend George Montagu Osborn, the Reverend John Pycock and the Reverend John Alexander Guillebaud respectively as the Incumbents of the said several parishes of Campton with Shefford, Clifton, and Southill, and I do hereby represent the same to your Grace in order that if your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such scheme you may certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to His Majesty in Council for an Order in Council for carrying the same into effect.

" Alwyne Ely."

And whereas the said scheme drawn up by the said Bishop of Ely, and the Consents referred to in the said Representation, are as follows :-

" SCHEME.

"There shall be separated from the said benefice of Campton with Shefford the chapelry of Shefford the boundaries of which are well known and defined and it is proposed on such separation from the parish of Campton of the whole of the chapelry of Shefford to annex there-to from the parish of Clifton. "1. That part or district of the said parish of

Clifton which lies to the north and west of an imaginary line drawn from the boundary mark indicated on the Ordnance Sheet as 'B. M. 163.5 on 'Hoo Hill' at the north-western corner of the field numbered 220 and thence along the northern side or hedge of the said field thence along the west side or hedge of field numbered 205 and thence northward along the Olifton-road to a point in the middle of the said road due south of the point where the northern boundary line or hedge of field No. 153 on the said Ordnance Sheet meets the brook which forms the boundary between the parishes of Clifton and Southill and thence from the said point in the middle of the road due north to the said parish boundary at the point indicated on such boundary and coloured pink on the plan hereto annexed.

"2. From the parish of Southill that part or district of the said parish of Southill which lies to the west of an imaginary line (from the point where the course of the 'River Ivel Navigation' and the parish boundary begin to follow the same line westward) drawn first north then west and then north again following the eastern boundary of field No. 79 to the road leading from Shefford to Stanford and thence westward along the said thirty pounds per annum. Fees and contributions I road to the eastern angle in the middle of the said road of the boundary between Southill and Shefford Hardwick and coloured yellow on the plan hereto annexed.

"3. From the extra-parochial place of Shefford Hardwick that portion or district of the said extraparochial place of Shefford Hardwick which lies to the south of an imaginary line drawn along the middle of the road leading from Shefford to Bedford from the centre of North Bridge to the point where the road to the west at 'B.M. 136.8' leads to 'Old Sand Pit' and thence along the last-mentioned road under the railway and along the footpath due west to the parish boundary and coloured brown on the plan hereto annexed.

"The said chapelry of Shefford together with the several adjoining districts to be separated from the several parishes and extra-parochial place respectively of Clifton, Southill and Shefford Hardwick shall be united and annexed each to the other so as together to form a separate parish and benefice.

"The Incumbent to be appointed instituted and inducted to the said separate parish and benefice so formed and his successors shall have the exclusive cure of souls within the limits of the said separate parish and benefice and the said parish and benefice shall be subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the parish of Campton.

"The inhabitants of the said chapelry of Shefford and also the inhabitants of the said separated portions of Clifton, Southill and Shefford Hardwick shall be entitled to equal rights and accommodation in the chapel at Shefford which shall be the church of the said separate parish and benefice and they shall not be entitled to accommodation in any other church or chapel.

"All fees offerings and payments for churchings marriages and burials and ecclesiastical offices solemnized and performed within the said church of the said separate parish and benefice and all such other ecclesiastical dues offerings and emoluments usually payable to the Incumbent of a benefice as shall arise or become payable within or in respect of the said separate parish and benefice shall belong to the Incumbent for the time being of the said separate parish or benefice.

"As and from the date of the creation of the separate parish and benefice the tithes glebe lauds and other endowments of the said benefice of Campton shall be and remain charged with the payment to the Incumbent of the said separate parish and benefice of an annual sum of sixty pounds and the tithes glebe lands and other endowments of the said benefice of Clifton with the payment of an annual sum of fifty pounds such sums to be payable in half-yearly instalments on the first of January and first of July in each year. If and whenever there shall be default in payment the Bishop may after twenty-If and whenever there shall be one days' notice put the benefice of the defaulting Incumbent under sequestration until the amount of any payment or payments due or to become due during the continuance of the sequestration shall have been received and paid.

"The patronage of the said separate parish and benefice shall belong to and be exercised by the Archdeacon of Bedford and the rectors of Campton and Clifton for the time being.

"Given under my hand this twenty-fifth day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and three.

"We the undersigned Randall Thomas, Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury do hereby report to Your Majesty in Council.

"That the Right Reverend Alwyne Bishop of Ely has represented unto us (amongst other things)

"That there are in the county of Bedford and his diocese of Ely the benefice (being a rectory) of Campton with the chapelry of Shefford, the beuefice (being a rectory) of Clifton, and the benefice (being a vicarage) of Southill and the extra-parochial place of Shefford Hardwick.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the said Act the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him the proposed alterations may best be effected and how the changes consequent upon such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested, which scheme together with the consents thereto in writing of Sir Algernon Osborn, Baronet, the patron or person entitled to present to the said benefice of Campton with Shefford in case the same were now vacant, the Reverend George Montagu Osborn the present Incumbent of the same benefice the Reverend Henry Hugh Miles the patron or person entitled to present to the said benefice of Clifton in case the same were now vacant the Reverend John Pycock the present Incumbent of the same benefice Samuel Whitbread Esquire, the patron or person entitled to present to the benefice of Southill in case the same were now vacant and the Reverend John Alexander Guillebaud the present Incumbent of the same benefice has been transmitted to us by the said Lord Bishop for our consideration.

"The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the consents above referred to are hereunto annexed.

"And we the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the said Pluralities Act 1838 certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying the said scheme into effect."
