PASSPORTS IN THE SOUDAN.

*Foreign Office,
October 23, 1903.*

His Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received from His Majesty's Representative at Cairo a Despatch, transmitting a copy of the following Regulations with respect to the formalities to be observed by persons travelling in the Soudan:—

“Passports and Reporting (Europeans and Foreigners).

“These regulations cancel all those previously issued on this subject, i.e., notices published in Sudan Gazette No. 19, dated 19th January, 1901, No. 27 dated 1st September, 1901, and No. 35 dated 1st May, 1902:—

“(1) It is hereby notified that in future passports will be required from Europeans and Foreigners desiring to enter the Sudan.

“Applications for passports must be made in person to the Sudan Agent, War Office, Cairo; to the Mudir, Wadi Halfa; or to the Mudir, Suakin.

“The applicant must state the object for which he desires to enter the country, and produce satisfactory testimonials or recommendations from Consuls or from persons of established standing or authority either in Egypt or the Sudan. Passports must be produced whenever required by Sudan Government Officials.

“(2) Europeans and Foreigners proceeding south of Khartoum or into Kordofan must obtain special passes from the office of the Civil Secretary, Khartoum, through the official from whom they obtained their passport.

“(3) All Europeans and Foreigners travelling in the Sudan are required to report their arrival personally or in writing to the Mudir at the Head-quarters of the Province, stating their address, occupation, and probable length of stay. Through travellers to Khartoum need only register in that town, either at the Mudiria or at the Hotel.

“(4) Passports are not required by officials of the Sudan, Egyptian, or Uganda Governments, or by persons who enter the Sudan under arrangements made by any recognized Tourist Agency.”

FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

Isle of Man to Wit.

BY THE LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section 2 of "The Cattle Diseases Prevention Act, 1903," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor by, and with the advice and consent of two members of the Council, to make such orders as may seem necessary for prohibiting the importation of dogs into this Isle.

And whereas the infectious disease commonly called Rabies, prevails among dogs in places other than Great Britain, Ireland, and the Channel Islands, beyond this Isle.

Now I, the said Lieutenant-Governor do, with the advice and consent of two members of the Council, and in the exercise of the powers given by the said Act, hereby order—

1.—That no dog shall be imported or removed into this Isle except from Great Britain, Ireland, and the Channel Islands.

Detention of Dogs on Vessels in Port.

2.—(1) Every dog to which this order applies shall at all times while on board a vessel in any port of this Island be

(a) Secured to some part of the vessel so as to render it impossible for such dog to bite any person or animal, but not so as to prevent such dog from breathing freely or lapping water; or

(b) Confined in an enclosed part of the vessel from which the dog cannot escape.

(2) If any dog to which this article applies shall die or be lost from a vessel in any port in this Isle, the person in charge of the dog shall forthwith give notice of such death or loss to the clerk to the Local Authority of the district in which such port is situate.

Offences.

3.—(1) If a dog is landed in contravention of this order, the owner, and the charterer, and the master of the vessel from which it is landed, and the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the landing, and the person landing the same, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been landed in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed to have offended against this order.

(2) If a dog is not secured or confined as required by this order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the master of any vessel on board which any dog is or has been carried to this Island shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed to have offended against this order.

(3) If any person with a view to unlawfully defeat or evade this order, allows a dog to stray, he shall be deemed to have offended against this order.

(4) If the owner or person in charge of a dog fails to do anything which by this order he is required to do, he shall be deemed to have offended against this order.

Interpretation.

4.—In this order, unless the context otherwise requires, "Master" includes a person having the charge or command of a vessel.

Other terms have the same meaning as in "The Cattle Diseases Prevention Acts, 1865 to 1903."

Commencement.

5.—This order shall come into operation on the first day of November, one thousand nine hundred and three.

Short Title.

6.—This order may be cited as "The Importation of Dogs Order, 1903."
