The KING has been pleased, by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing date the 29th September, 1903, to declare that Marcia Amelia Mary, Countess of Yarborough, in her own right Baroness Conyers (wife of Charles Alfred Worsley, Earl of Yarborough, one of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council), the elder of the two daughters and co-heirs of Sackville George Lane-Fox, Baron Conyers, deceased, is and shall be Baroness Fauconberg; and to give, grant, and confirm the ancient Barony of Fauconberg to the said Marcia Amelia Mary, Countess of Yarborough, Baroness Conyers: to have and to hold the said Barony, together with all the rights, privileges, pre-eminences, immunities, and advantages, and the place and precedence due and belonging thereto, to her and to the heirs of her body lawfully begotten and to be begotten, in as full and ample a manner as William Nevill, Lord Fauconberg, or any of his ancestors, held and enjoyed the same.

The KING has been pleased, by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing date the 29th September, 1903, to declare that Violet Ida Evelyn, Countess of Powis (wife of George Charles, Earl of Powis), the younger of the two daughters and co-heirs of Sackville George Lane-Fox, Baron Conyers, deceased, is and shall be Baroness Darcy (de Knayth); and to give, grant, and confirm the ancient Barony of Darcy (de Knayth) to the said Violet Ida Evelyn, Countess of Powis: to have and to hold the said Barony, together with all the rights, privileges, pre-eminences, immunities, and advantages, and the place and precedence due and belonging thereto, to her and to the heirs of her body lawfully

begotten and to be begotten, in as full and ample a manner as Philip, 6th Baron Darcy, or any of his ancestors, held and enjoyed the same.
