#### FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

In pursuance of section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Home Department proposes, at the expiration of 40 days from the publication of this notice, to make an Order under sub-section (2) of section 3 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, modifying the proportion of cubic feet of space to be provided for each person employed in Underground Bakehouses and in Bakehouses where work is carried on at night by artificial light other than electric light. The proportion for underground bakehouses is fixed by the draft at 500 cubic feet, and for the other class of bakehouses at 400 cubic feet.

And whereas by an Order dated the fifteenth day of May, nineteen hundred and three, the Board of Education have fixed as the appointed day for the Council of the County Borough of Bradford for all other purposes and provisions of the Act the ninth day of November, nineteen hundred and three, or such later day, or days as. the Board might for any such other purpose or provision for the said Council thereafter appoint.

Now, therefore, the Board of Education, pursuant to the Act and to every other power enabling them in that behalf, hereby appoint as the appointed day for the said Council for all such other purposes and provisions the first day of December, nineteen hundred and three, or such later day or days as the Board may for any such other purpose or provision for the said Council hereafter appoint.
