#### FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

In pursuance of section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Home Department proposes, at the expiration of 40 days from the publication of this notice, to make an Order under sub-section (2) of section 3 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, modifying the proportion of cubic feet of space to be provided for each person employed in Underground Bakehouses and in Bakehouses where work is carried on at night by artificial light other than electric light. The proportion for underground bakehouses is fixed by the draft at 500 cubic feet, and for the other class of bakehouses at 400 cubic feet.
