ORDER OF THE BOARD OF  
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 3RD DECEMBER 1903.)

BRANDON AND DISTRICT (SWINE-FEVER)  
PROHIBITION OF MOVEMENT ORDER  
OF 1903.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by  
virtue and in exercise of the powers in them  
vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894  
to 1903, and of every other power enabling them  
in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered  
as follows:

*Movement of swine into out of or within*  
*Scheduled District.*

1. No swine shall be moved into or out of the  
District described in the Schedule to this Order,  
hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District,  
or be moved along over or across a highway or  
thoroughfare within the Scheduled District; pro-  
vided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed  
to apply to the movement of swine into or out of  
the Scheduled District where they are moved  
through such District by railway from a place  
outside such District to another place outside such
