

District without unnecessary delay and without the swine being untrucked or rebooked within such District.

*Local Authority to enforce Order.*

2. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

*Offences.*

3.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If any person with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order allows a pig to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

*Short Title.*

4. This Order may be cited as the BRANDON AND DISTRICT (SWINE-FEVER) PROHIBITION OF MOVEMENT ORDER OF 1903.

Any market, fair, or sale, of fat swine which may be held in the borough of Burton-upon-Trent between the ninth and twenty-fourth days of December, nineteen hundred and three (including both such days), with a licence of the Local

Authority of the said borough shall be exempt from the conditions specified in Article 5 (1.) of the Markets and Fairs (Swine-Fever) Order of 1896, but nothing in this Order shall authorise any movement of swine out of the said borough.
