#### WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County of the Isle of Wight) Order, 1903.

Dated 19th December, 1903.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1902, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of the Isle of Wight, I hereby make the following Order:—

#### Title.

I. This Order may be cited as the Wild Birds Protection (County of the Isle of Wight) Order, 1903. BIRDS.

Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880 shall be extended, so far as concerns the Administrative County of the Isle of Wight, so as to be between the last day of February and the first day of September in any year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of the Isle of Wight to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Cirl Bunting, Common Bunting, Reed Bunting, Chiffchaff, Peregrine Falcon, Spotted Flycatcher, Heron, Kestrel, House Martin, Sand Martin, Raven, Red-backed Shrike, Swallow, Swift, Missel Thrush, Pied Wagtail, Water Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Blackcap Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Goldencrested Wren, Wryneck.

The Cormorant deprived of Protection.

IV. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall not apply within the Administrative County of the Isle of Wight to the Cormorant.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

V. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order does not apply, it shall be unlawful throughout the Administrative County of the Isle of Wight to kill or take any of the Wild Birds mentioned in the schedule of that Act, or added thereto by the Wild Birds Protection Act. 1881, or by Clause III of this Order, except only the Eider Duck, Gannet, Lapwing, Mallard, Pcewit Plover, Snipe, Solan Goose, Summer Snipe, Teal, Widgeon, Wild Duck, and Woodcock.

## All Birds protected on Sundays in certain Areas.

VI. During the period between the 31st day of August in any year and the 1st day of March following, the taking or killing of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited in that part of the Administrative County of the Isle of Wight which lies within the district of the Rural District Council, and outside the several Urban Districts in the said Isle.

#### Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.

VII. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited within the Administrative County of the Isle of Wight:—

Peregrine Falcon, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Nightjar, Owl, Raven.

All Eggs protected within Certain Areas.

VIII. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of any species of Wild Bird is prohibited within the following areas for a period of five years from the date of this Order:—

The Red Cliff and Culver Cliffs, between the west side of the Red Cliff Fort on the west and the point of the Culvers forming the western boundary of Whitecliff Bay on the east, from the sea level to the Government boundary; the whole of the cliffs in the parishes of Freshwater and Totland from the westernmost point of Cave Bay, thence round the coast to Sconce Point, and a hundred yards inland from the top of such cliffs.

Repeal of former Order.

IX. The Order of the 7th August, 1900, is hereby repealed. "

BYE-LAWS made by the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the City of Sheffield, being the Promoters of the Sheffield Corporation Tramways Undertaking, under and in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Tram-ways Act, 1870, at a Meeting of the City Council, held in the Council Chamber, at the Town Hall, in the said city, on Wednesday, the ninth day of December, 1903.

At a monthly meeting of the Council of the city of Sheffield, held at the Council Chamber, in the Town Hall, in Sheffield aforcsaid, on Wednesday, the 9th day of December, 1903, at two o'clock in the afternoon, pursuant to notice duly

given and summonses duly served,

It was resolved:

"That we, the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the City of Sheffield, being the promoters of the Sheffield Corporation Tramways Undertaking, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers to us for that purpose given in and by the 46th Section of the Tramways Act, 1870, and of every other power enabling us in that behalf, make, order, and ordain the following Bye-laws and Regulations for preventing the commission of any nuisance in or upon any carriage, and for regulating the travelling in or upon any such carriage.

Interpretation.

1. Throughout these Bye-laws the word "Corporation" means the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the City of Sheffield; the word "tramways" means the tramway system worked by the Corporation, whether situate within the city of Sheffield, or in any other district; the word "car" means any carriage or car run upon the tramways for the conveyance of passengers; the word "conductor" means any officer or servant of the Corporation having charge of, or helping in the charge of, a car; and the word "driver" means any officer or servant of the Corporation driving or helping to drive a

Entering and Leaving Cars.

2. Except at the terminus, every passenger shall enter or depart from a car by the step of the hindermost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise, unless so directed by the conductor. At the terminus, passengers desiring to leave the car shall do so at the driver's end thereof.

All persons desiring to alight from any car shall do so before any person boards such car for the purpose of travelling thereon, and all persons desiring to board the car shall permit such persons to alight as aforesaid.

Smoking.

3. No person shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe, cigar, or cigarette inside any car, except in a compartment specially set apart for the purpose.

Intoxicated Persons, &c.

4. No person in a state of intoxication, or affected with any dangerous, contagious or infectious disorder shall enter or mount upon any car, and any such person found in or upon any car shall be immediately removed from the car by or under the direction of the conductor.

Offensive Language or Conduct.

· 5. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language or conduct himself offensively whilst in or upon any car, or spit, or commit any nuisance, in or upon or against any car, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

No passenger or any other person shall, while travelling in or upon any car, play or perform upon any musical instrument, or distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind, or beg or collect money, alms or subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game, or gamble, or deposit remnants of food or fruit in or upon any car.

Damage to Car.

6. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil or damage the cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on any car, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage, any

Any person acting in contravention of this Bye-law shall, in addition to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws, be liable to pay the amount of any damage so done.

Objectionable Persons.

7. No person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a car, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, nor any person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to any passenger, shall be entitled to enter or remain in or upon any car, and may be prevented from entering or remaining in or upon any car.

No such person shall enter in or upon any car after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and if any such person be found in or upon any car, he shall, on the request of the conductor, leave such car upon the fare, if pre-viously paid, being returned, and, on his refusal to do so, he shall immediately be removed by or

under the direction of the conductor.

Payment of Fares.

8. Each passenger shall pay to the conductor the fare legally demandable for the journey, or for the stage thereof for which it be demanded.

Tickets.

9. Each passenger, when tickets are issued, shall, as and when requested so to do, show his ticket to the conductor or other servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty, and shall also, when requested so to do by the conductor or other servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty, deliver up his ticket, or in case of failure to produce such ticket, pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

Luggage.

10. No passenger shall bring on to any car any luggage other than his own personal luggage, not exceeding 28 lbs. in weight, and any such personal luggage shall be carried at the responsibility of the passenger, and shall be placed by the passenger in such position on or in the car as shall be directed by the conductor.

11. The conductor may decline to take, and may prevent any person from taking, upon any car any personal or other luggage exceeding 28 lbs. in weight, and any luggage which from its size or otherwise is, in the opinion of the conductor, unsuitable for conveyance in or upon

the car.

Travelling on Steps, &c.

12. No person other than the driver or the conductor of the car, or other servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty, shall travel or ride upon the steps, platforms, outside rails, buffers, or guards of any car.

No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall board a car, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of a car, except straps or other appliances provided inside the car for the convenience of passengers.

13. No person other than the driver or other servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty, shall mount or enter or attempt to mount or enter, or shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any water carriage or other carriage used upon the tramways for any purpose other than the conveyance of passengers.

Full Number of Passengers.

14. When any car contains in the interior thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation, according to the notice thereof attached to the car, is provided in such interior, no person beyond such number shall enter, mount, or remain therein, except by permission of the conductor first obtained.

When any car contains on the outside thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation, according to the notice thereof attached to the car, is provided on such outside, no person beyond such number shall enter, mount,

or remain thereon.

15. The conductor shall have power to prevent any person beyond the number of authorized passengers from entering, mounting, or remaining in or upon any part of a car, and any such person who may have entered or mounted the car shall leave the same immediately upon the request of the conductor, and on his refusal to do so he shall immediately be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

Entering or Leaving Car in Motion.

- 16. No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave, any car whilst
- 17. When a car contains the full number of passengers which it is constructed to carry, or

as provided by Bye-law 14, a notice to that effect. shall, as soon as practicable, be placed in conspicuous letters and in a conspicuous position on the car.

Disabled Cars.

18. If at any time a car becomes disabled, or damaged, or from any cause unable to proceed, all passengers shall, upon the request of the conductor, leave the car, and if such passengers have paid their fares, shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but shall be entitled to continue their journey by the next available car on any section. No person shall, except with the permission of the conductor, mount or enter a disabled or damaged

Cars proceeding to Sheds.

19. No person shall travel upon a car which is proceeding to a shed and is not on its usual route unless permitted so to do by the conductor, and where such person is so permitted, he shall pay the usual fare payable on such route.

Dogs.

20. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any car. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any car in contravention of this Byelaw shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the car immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request, such dog or other animal shall be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

Firearms, &c.

21. No person shall travel in or on any car with loaded firearms, or with any article, instrument, or implement, or any material or substance which may be dangerous or offensive to the passengers.

Interference with Driver or Conductor.

22. No person other than the conductor or driver, or other servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty, shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controller, brakes, lights, trolley cord, or any part of a car, or its equipment, and, except in case emergency or accident, no person other than the conductor, or other servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty, shall signal a car to start or stop.

Obstruction.

23. No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any conductor, driver, or other servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty, upon or in connection with any car or tramway.

Conductors and Drivers to enforce Bye-laws.

24. Every conductor and driver of a car shall, to the best of his ability, enforce these Bye-laws, and prevent any breach thereof.
