The Wild Birds Protection (County of the Isle of Wight) Order, 1903.

Dated 19th December, 1903.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1902, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of the Isle of Wight, I hereby make the following Order:—
