the Official Receivers for the said Bankruptcy

And whereas by a further Order, dated 1st

(Winding-up) Act, 1890, it was *inter alia* ordered
that Mr. Cecil Mercer should be the Official
Receiver attached to the said Courts for the pur-

shall, in future, be one Official Receiver only for
the Bankruptcy Districts of the said Courts.

Bankruptcy Districts of the County Courts holden
at Northampton, Bedford, and Luton, and in so
far as they relate to the appointment of Mr. Cecil
Mercer, to be an Official Receiver for the said
Districts, but without prejudice to anything done
or suffered under the said Orders.

And it is further ordered that the said Mr.
Alfred Ewen shall become and be the Official
Receiver attached to the said Courts for all the
purposes of the Bankruptcy Acts, 1883 to 1890,
and the Companies (Winding-up) Act, 1890.

This Order shall commence and come into
operation on the 1st day of January, 1904.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Order described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby from and after the commencement of this Order revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not invalidate or make unlawful

anything done under the Order hereby revoked before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the Order hereby revoked before the commencement of this Order.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the thirty-first day of December, nineteen hundred and three.

3. This Order may be cited as the **HYTHE AND DISTRICT (SWINE-FEVER) PROHIBITION OF MOVEMENT REVOCATION ORDER OF 1903.**

**ORDER of the Local Government Board:
District Auditor: Assignment of Duties and
District:—**

**NORTH-EASTERN COUNTIES AUDIT
DISTRICT.**

To John O'Neill, District Auditor;—

To the County Councils of the several Administrative Counties named in the Schedule to this Order, and to the County Council of the Administrative County of Norfolk;—

To the Visiting Committees of any Lunatic Asylums belonging wholly or in part to one or more of the County Councils named in the said Schedule and not belonging in part to any other County Council;—

To the Local Fisheries Committee for the Eastern Sea Fisheries District;—

To the West Riding of Yorkshire Rivers Board;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by Section 4 of the District Auditors Act, 1879, it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act, and may from time to time change wholly or in part such Duties or Districts;

And whereas John O'Neill is a District Auditor duly appointed under the provisions of the Statutes in that behalf:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, hereby certify the appointment to the office of District Auditor of the said John O'Neill (hereinafter referred to as "the District Auditor"), and do Order and Prescribe as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—It shall be the duty of the District Auditor to audit the Accounts of the following Authorities and of their Officers; namely:—

(1.) The County Councils of the several Administrative Councils named in the Schedule to this Order.

(2.) The Visiting Committee of any Lunatic Asylum belonging wholly, or in part, to one or more of the said County Councils, and not belonging in part to any other County Council.

(3.) Any Joint Committee consisting of representatives of two or more of the said County Councils, or of representatives of one or more of the said County Councils and of other persons not being representatives of any other County Council.

(4.) The Local Fisheries Committee for the Eastern Sea Fisheries District.

(5.) The West Riding of Yorkshire Rivers Board.

(6.) Such of the Visiting Committees of Lunatic Asylums or Joint Committees including representatives of the County Council of one or more of the said Counties and representatives of the County Council or Councils of some other County or Counties, as We may by Order hereafter prescribe.

ARTICLE II.—The District Auditor shall audit the said Accounts according to the provisions of the several Statutes and of the Orders issued by competent authority in force for the time being in that behalf, and shall perform all such duties and exercise all such powers in connection with the audit of such Accounts as are prescribed and conferred by the said Statutes and Orders.

ARTICLE III.—The District in which the District Auditor shall act as Auditor, and which We hereby assign to him for the performance of his duties under this Order, shall be termed "The North-Eastern Counties Audit District," and shall, until We otherwise prescribe, comprise the area for the time being subject to the jurisdiction of the County Councils of the several Administrative Counties named in the Schedule to this Order, and the areas within which the Local Fisheries Committee and the Rivers Board mentioned in paragraphs (4) and (5) of Article I

of this Order and any such body as is referred to in paragraph (6) of that Article may exercise authority.

ARTICLE IV.—Any Order in force assigning a District to the District Auditor for the discharge of his duties or prescribing his duties shall, from and after the date upon which this Order shall come into operation, be rescinded, but nothing in this Order shall affect or interfere with the existing duties and powers of the District Auditor as regards any Audit or any matters or proceedings already commenced.

ARTICLE V.—This Order shall come into operation on the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and four.

ORDER of the Local Government Board: (Altering General Accounts Order): Appointment of Stocktaker.

HENDON UNION.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Hendon Union:—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by General Orders of the Poor Law Board dated respectively the 14th day of January, 1867, and the 16th day of February, 1869, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the Hendon Union (amongst others), it is required that certain Accounts relating to the provisions, clothing, and other stores in the Workhouse, when made up and balanced, shall be submitted to the Visiting Committee or to some Member thereof, who shall enter a memorandum at the foot of such Accounts in the form of the Certificate referred to in the said Orders;

And whereas it is expedient to empower the said Guardians to appoint a competent person or persons to examine the stores at the Workhouse and at any House (whatever be its designation or description) which belongs to the Guardians, in which any poor person is lodged and maintained, and to which the Orders hereinbefore mentioned apply, and to perform the other duties hereinafter set forth:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—The Guardians of the Poor of the Hendon Union, as and when they shall think fit to do so, may appoint a competent person or persons to perform the duties of a Stocktaker as hereinafter set forth, and may revoke such

appointment. When any such appointment is made it shall be notified to Us forthwith.

ARTICLE II.—Every such appointment shall be made in the manner prescribed by the Regulations in force for the time being as to the appointment of Officers by the said Guardians, and a person appointed to the office of Stocktaker shall receive such remuneration as may from time to time be assigned to him by the said Guardians.

ARTICLE III.—No person, except with Our consent, shall be appointed to the office of Stocktaker while holding any other office under the Guardians.

ARTICLE IV.—The Stocktaker shall, on the day next after the termination of each quarter, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stores at the Workhouse and at any House such as is hereinbefore described, and compare the said stores with the quantities of stock remaining in store as shown by the entries in the proper columns in the Accounts termed respectively the "Quarterly Balance of the Provisions Account" and the "Quarterly Balance of the Necessaries and Miscellaneous Account."

He shall also, on the day next after the termination of each half-year, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stock of clothing at the Workhouse and House, and compare the same with the balance appearing in the Accounts termed respectively the "Clothing-Materials Receipt and Conversion Account" and the "Clothing Receipt and Expenditure Account."

ARTICLE V.—After making the examination and comparison referred to in Article IV, the Stocktaker, if he find the stock to be correct, shall sign a certificate at the foot of each of the aforesaid Accounts in the following form:—

"Submitted to me this _____ day of _____ 19____, and found to be correct as regards the quantities of stock remaining in store.

"(Signed).....
"Stocktaker."

If he find the stock to be in any respect incorrect, he shall make such alteration in the said certificate as he may deem necessary, specifying the particulars in which he finds the quantities of stock to be incorrectly stated.

ARTICLE VI.—The Master of the Workhouse and of any such House as aforesaid shall, when required by the Stocktaker to do so, on the days and at the times referred to in Article IV, submit to him the stores and Accounts therein mentioned, and render to him such assistance as may be necessary for the purpose of such examination and comparison as aforesaid.

ARTICLE VII.—The Master of the Workhouse and of any such House as aforesaid shall lay each of the said Accounts before the Guardians at their next meeting after the date of the entry therein of any such certificate as aforesaid.

ARTICLE VIII.—So long as a Stocktaker is appointed it shall not be necessary for the Visiting Committee to examine the stores or to enter in any Account the memorandum required by the first above-cited Order.
