TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY
BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Monday, the 25th instant, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Acts 40 Vic., cap. 2, and 52 Vic., cap. 6, to the amount of £2,000,000, in replacement of Bills falling due on the 30th instant.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 30th January, 1904, and will be payable at twelve months after date, viz.:—on the 30th January, 1905.

3. *The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for, and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.*

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Tuesday, the 26th instant, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than twelve o'clock, on Saturday, the 30th instant.

6. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

Cape Colonne Light—Temporary Discontinuance of

The Italian Government has given notice, dated 31st December, 1903, that it is intended to change the illuminating apparatus of Cape Colonne Light, and that during the present month for a certain number of nights the light (white fixed) will be discontinued for that purpose.

Mazzara—Light Established.

The Italian Government has given notice that, on December 24th, 1903, an occulting light every fifteen seconds, thus:—light, ten seconds; eclipse, five seconds, would be established at Mazzara; it would be elevated 33 feet above the
