

henceforth arrivals from Egypt supplied with clean bill of health will only be subject to medical observation, ordered by Government decree of December 28, 1889, No. 14,968, against arrivals from Turkey, Greece, and from North Africa.

Should, however, such arrivals have unclean bill of health, the respective vessels will have to be treated according to Government Circular of November 5, 1900, No. 18,835, and respectively of June 23, 1901, No. 7,805.

BOARD OF EDUCATION.

Appointed Day.

Order made under Section 27 (2) of the Education Act, 1902.

Whereas by Sub-section (2) of Section 27 of the Education Act, 1902 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that the Act shall, except as expressly provided, come into operation on the appointed day, and the appointed day shall be the twenty-sixth day of March, nineteen hundred and three, or such other day, not being more than eighteen months later, as the Board of Education may appoint, and different days may be appointed for different purposes and for different provisions of the Act and for different Councils.

And whereas by an Order dated the sixteenth day of March, nineteen hundred and three, the Board of Education have fixed the first day of April, nineteen hundred and three, as the appointed day for the purposes of Sub-section (5) of Section 23 of the Act.

And whereas by an Order dated the twenty-second day of December, nineteen hundred and three, the Board of Education have fixed as the appointed day for each of the Councils of the Counties, County Borough, and Urban District named in the Schedule to this Order for all other purposes and provisions of the Act the first day of February, nineteen hundred and four, or such later day or days as the Board might for any such other purpose or provision for any such Council thereafter appoint.

Now, therefore, the Board of Education, pursuant to the Act and to every other power enabling them in that behalf, hereby appoint as the appointed day for each of the said Councils for all such other purposes and provisions the first day of April, nineteen hundred and four, or such later day or days as the Board may for any

such other purpose or provision for any such Council hereafter appoint.
