The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Balliol College, Oxford, on the 15th day of December, 1903, amending Statute V, Clause 3 (a) of the Statutes of the College, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in 4 (7) he Universities of provisions contained in "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

STATUTE to alter and amend the Statutes framed by the Commissioners appointed under "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877," 40 and 41 Vict., cap. 48, and approved by the Queen in Council on the third day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, in relation to Balliol College in the University of Oxford in the matter of the application of the Tuition Fund created by the said Statutes, such amending Statute being duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose held on the fifteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and three, and passed by the unanimous votes of

those present.

In Statute V, Clause 3 (a) after the words "Tuition Fund" strike out the words "after making provision for the progressive stipends of

the Tutorial Fellows."

After Clause 3 insert the following new clause. "If at any time it shall appear to the Master and Fellows that temporary assistance is required for the instruction of the undergraduate members | of the College which is not provided for in the current annual scheme for the appropriation of the Tuition Fund it shall be lawful for the Master and Fellows to lay a resolution specifying the nature and extent of the assistance required before the Financial Committee, and the Financial such temporary assistance out of the Tuition Fund."

The following Statutes made by the Governing Body of Brasenose College, Oxford, on the 9th day of December, 1903, amending certain of the Statutes of the College, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":-

Alterations in the Statutes of Brasenose College, Oxford, made on December 9, 1903, at a General Meeting specially summoned for the purpose, by a majority of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting on the question, pursuant to the provisions of the

Oxford and Cambridge Act 1877, Section 54. Stat. II. 1. Dele 'Actual' in line 9, and after Fellows add 'as hereinafter defined.'

Dele in line 10 'being at least Stat. III. Dele the whole and substitute:-STATUTE III.

The Fellows.

Part I. General Provisions.

1. The number of Fellows shall be twelve, and Honorary exclusive of Supernumerary Fellows and of the Fellowship held ex officio by the Camden Professor of Ancient History, but subject to such power of increasing the number as hereinafter contained.

2. Save as hereinafter otherwise provided no person shall be eligible to a Fellowship who shall not have passed all the examinations required for the degree of Bachelor in some Faculty in the

University.

3. The precedence of Fellows (including Probationary Fellows) in the College shall be determined according to the priority of their original election to the Fellowship which they for the

time being hold.

4. Every Fellow (including a Probationary Fellow) who shall be elected to or accept a Headship or Fellowship in any other College within the University, other than a Fellowship without emolument, shall thereupon vacate his Fellowship. Provided that it shall nevertheless be lawful for the Camden Professor of Ancient History to hold such Headship.

5. All Fellows shall be entitled to vote in

elections and admissions to Fellowships.

6. The Principal and Fellows may, if they think fit, set apart and allow a sum of money not exceeding 3s. a day for the Principal and each Fellow (including a Probationary Fellow) and also, if they think fit, for each Tutor or Lecturer, not being a Fellow, for the expenses of his dinner on each day when he shall dine at the Common College Dinner, whether in Hall or in some other public room in the College.

7. Whenever there shall be no duly qualified candidate for a vacant Fellowship whom the electors shall judge to be of sufficient merit for election, the election shall be postponed to some

Fellows for the purpose, and every such postponed election shall be held and conducted in the same manner and after the same previous notice as if there had been no postponement.

8. The Principal and Fellows shall not be bound to fill up more than one vacant Fellowship in any year, unless they shall think fit to do so: and they shall have power to postpone the election to any vacant Fellowships, exceeding one, in any year, for any period not exceeding a year, and so

from time to time.

9. If any Fellow shall be guilty of grave immorality or misconduct, or shall contumaciously persist in disobeying any of the Statutes or Bylaws of the College in force for the time being, he may be deprived of his Fellowship by the Visitor after due inquiry held upon the petition of a majority of the Principal and Fellows assembled at a meeting specially called with notice of the business to be transacted thereat. The Principal shall, on the receipt of a requisition signed by not less than three Fellows, call such meeting, giving not less than a fortnight's notice thereof.

Part II. Official Fellows.

 Notice of every intended election to Official Fellowships, and of the number of vacancies to be filled up, shall be given by the Principal in such manner as he shall deem best adapted to secure publicity, thirty days at least before the day of election.

2. The number of Official Fellows shall not exceed nine or be less than eight. They shall be elected by the Principal and Fellows, with or without examination as the Principal and Fellows may think fit; but no one shall be elected without examination, unless at a stated General Meeting, or at a special meeting summoned with notice of

the business to be transacted thereat.

- 3. The election to Official Fellowships shall be in the first instance for a term not exceeding ten years, provided that the person elected be during that period ready and willing to serve the College in such one of the following offices, namely, those of Vice-Principal, Bursar, Tutor, or Lecturer (in this Statute called 'the College offices'), as the Principal and Fellows may from time to time allot to him, and to conform to the Bylaws for the time being in force in respect of such office.
- 4. An Official Fellow, who shall be actually serving the College in any one of the College offices, shall be capable of re-election at the close of the last year but one of the term for which he was originally elected, by a majority of the Principal and Fellows, exclusive of the person to be re-elected. Such re-election may be for any period not exceeding ten years, and so from time to time, except that an Official Fellow who has held his Fellowship for thirty years shall in no case be capable of re-election for more than five years, and so from time to time. Any Fellow re-elected under this clause shall hold his Fellowship conditionally upon his being ready and willing to serve the College in one of the offices aforesaid.
- 5. The Principal and Fellows may, in case of serious but temporary illness, or for such other special cause as may in their judgment form a reasonable ground for such indulgence, grant to an Official Fellow such a dispensation from the obligations of the last two clauses as may seem to them consistent with the interests of the
- 6. Any Official Fellow who shall have served the College continuously in that capacity for a period of not less than seven years shall be entitled to claim leave of absence for one or other day, to be fixed by the Principal and more Terms, but for a period not exceeding in

all twelve calendar months, provided (1) that he gives notice to the Principal of his intention to claim such leave of absence at least six months beforehand; and (2) that the Principal and Fellows (exclusive of the applicant) decide on a vote by a majority consisting of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting that such an absence would not at the time proposed be against the interests of the College. Leave of absence shall not under this clause be granted to any one Fellow more than once in any one period of seven years, nor to more than one Fellow for one and the same period. A Fellow to whom leave of absence may be granted under this clause shall retain the full emoluments of his Fellowship, but shall not be entitled as of right to any portion of his other emoluments.

It shall be lawful for leave of absence to be granted under this clause, although during such absence there be less than four Official Fellows residing within the College walls or in a contiguous house as hereinafter mentioned, and although the applicant be the chief disciplinary officer

7. There shall always be one Official Fellow in Holy Orders of the Church of England. Fellow shall hold his Fellowship by the same tenure as that of other Official Fellows, except that, in addition to the obligations of other Official Fellows, it shall be his especial duty to undertake the performance of the Chapel Services prescribed by the Statutes or Bylaws in force for the time being, and to take such part in the Theological instruction of the Undergraduate or other Members of the College as may be required of him by the Principal and Fellows; and if he being, at the time of his election, not in Priest's Orders, shall fail to take Priest's Orders within one year from the date of his election, or if he shall at any time fail to take such part in the Chapel Services or Theological instruction as may be assigned to him by the Principal and Fellows, he shall vacate his Fellowship.

Provided that the Principal and Fellows may, in case of sickness, or for any other very urgent cause, allow any such Fellow to postpone the taking of Priest's Orders for a period not exceeding twelve calendar months.

Not more than one Fellowship in the College shall at any time be held under the conditions of

tenure prescribed in this clause.

8. A graduated scale of pensions for Official Fellows shall be arranged by the Principal and · Fellows, and shall be subject to alteration by them from time to time, with due regard to existing interests. Every Official Fellow shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be entitled at any time after he shall have served the College as an Official Fellow for the full term of thirty years to resign his Fellowship, and to take the highest rate of pension allowed by such scale. Save as hereinafter provided, no pension shall be assigned to any term of service of less than twenty years' duration, and no pension shall exceed £400 a year in amount. When the term of service of any Official Fellow shall have reached twenty years, the Principal and Fellows shall have power to grant to him, if not reelected, at the end of any term for which he holds his Fellowship, a pension not exceeding £250, with an addition not exceeding £15 for every additional year of service beyond twenty years. It shall also be in the power of the Principal and Fellows, if they shall think fit, to grant a similar pension to any Official Fellow, who shall voluntarily retire, after having served the College as an Official Fellow for not less than

twenty years. All payments in respect of any pension in this Statute authorized shall be made clear of income tax.

9. If any Official Fellow shall be permanently disabled, by bodily or mental incapacity, from discharging the duties of his office, the Principal and Fellows may, if in their judgment his circumstances require it, grant to him for such time and on such conditions as they may think fit, a pension or allowance which shall in no case exceed £150 per annum for a Fellow whose term of service is under fifteen years, and £200 for a Fellow whose term of service is over fifteen and under twenty years.

10. Any Official Fellow whose term of service shall have reached twenty-five years may, at the discretion of the Principal and Fellows to be exercised at any time after the termination of such twenty-five years, on one year's notice, either be retired on the pension corresponding to his term of service, or may be elected a Supernumerary Fellow as hereinafter provided.

11. For the purposes of clauses 8, 9, and 10, the term of service of an Official Fellow shall mean the period which has elapsed since his original election as an Official Fellow, save as

hereinafter provided.

12. Every Official Fellow shall be bound to reside during the usual College Terms within the University, and (if so required by the Principal and Fellows) in the College, except during temporary leave of absence granted by the Principal and Fellows. There shall always be four Official Fellows at least, of whom three at least shall be unmarried, and one shall be the chief disciplinary officer, residing within the College walls, or in houses provided by the Principal and Fellows contiguous to the College buildings.

13. Any Official Fellow who shall be instituted to, or otherwise be put in possession of, an Ecclesiastical Benefice with cure of souls other than a benefice in the gift of the College, shall vacate his Fellowship on the expiration of nine months from his presentation, or collation, or otherwise acquiring a title to such benefice, unless an application by him for leave to retain his Fellowship shall, prior to the acquisition of such title, have been sanctioned by the Principal

and Fellows and also by the Visitor.

No application shall be considered by the Principal and Fellows except at a meeting held in full Term and specially called with notice of the business to be transacted thereat, the votes at such meeting being taken by secret ballot. The consent of the Principal and Fellows shall only be given by a majority of two-thirds of the votes of those present (exclusive of the applicant) at such meeting, the Principal's vote being counted as two votes, and shall in no case be given unless it appear to the required majority that the holding of such benefice is not incompatible with the full discharge by the applicant of his duties to the College as Official Fellow or otherwise.

Any Official Fellow who shall be presented to a benefice in the gift of the College shall retain his Fellowship for one year and six months from the last avoidance of such benefice, and no longer, unless the Principal and Fellows by such majority at such meeting and under such conditions as aforesaid, and also the Visitor, shall grant leave to the Fellow to retain his Fellowship notwithstanding such presentation.

No person shall be eligible to an Official

No person shall be eligible to an Official Fellowship who shall be in possession of any

Ecclesiastical Benefice.

14. If any Official Fellow shall, without the consent of the Principal and Fellows, accept any office, or undertake any employment which is in

discharge of his duties to the College, he shall

thereupon vacate his Fellowship.

An Official Fellow shall vacate his Fellowship on marriage, unless an application by him for leave to retain his Fellowship after marriage shall previously to such marriage have been sanctioned by the Principal and Fellows in accordance with the following conditions:

(a) Such sanction shall be given only by a majority of at least two-thirds of the votes of the Principal and Fellows (exclusive of the applicant) present and voting, the Principal's vote being counted as two votes, such votes being taken by secret ballot either at a stated General Meeting or at a meeting held in full Term, of which at least thirty days' notice shall have been given.

(b) No such sanction shall be given unless at the time there shall be at least four Official Fellows, of whom three shall be unmarried, resident in College, or in some house provided by the Principal and Fellows contiguous to the College buildings, without reckoning the applicant, or unless the applicant shall be ready and willing to reside in the College, or in some house

so contiguous to the College as aforesaid.

16. The stipend of an Official Fellow shall be £200 a year. In addition to such stipend, every Official Fellow while holding any of the College offices shall receive out of the general revenues of the College in respect of his services in any of the said offices £100 per annum, together with such share of the tuition fund as may be assigned to him under the provisions hereinafter contained. All payments under this clause shall be made clear of income tax.

17. Every Official Fellow shall be entitled to rooms rent free.

Non-Official Fellowships. Part III.

1. There shall always be three Non-Official Fellowships among the total number of twelve Fellowships, and if at any time there shall be only eight Official Fellows, the Principal and Fellows may at their option elect to the vacancy pro hac vice either an Official or a Non-Official Fellow.

2. Non-Official Fellowships shall be either Professorial or Research Fellowships, and may be of either class or all of one class. Provided that the Principal and Fellows may on any vacancy in a Research Fellowship elect thereto a Professorial Fellow, and on any vacancy in a Professorial Fellowship may elect thereto a Research Fellow.

3. The Principal and Fellows may elect to a Professorial Fellowship any Professor or Reader within the University, or the Head of any University Department, or the Librarian of any University Institution, or an assistant Librarian of the Bodleian Library, or any other person whose work or office subserves any University purpose.

4. Persons may be elected to Professorial Fellowships without public notice of the vacancy, and without having passed the examinations required by the University for the degree of

Bachelor in any Faculty.

5. No election shall be made to a Professorial Fellowship except by a majority of two-thirds of the votes of the Principal and Fellows present at a meeting specially called with notice of the business to be transacted thereat.

6. Every Professorial Fellow shall be entitled to hold his Fellowship for the term of seven years, with power nevertheless for the Principal and Fellows from time to time (if in their discretion they by the same majority and at such meeting as aforesaid think fit) to re-elect him.

judgment incompatible with the full | Any such re-election shall be made not less than twelve calendar months and not more than fifteen calendar months before the end of the current term of the Fellowship.

> 7. Every Professorial Fellow shall be entitled to receive as the emolument of his Fellowship the sum of £200 per annum, clear of income tax, but without any other allowance save as in this

Statute provided.

8. Every Professorial Fellow shall hold his Fellowship so long only as he shall hold the office and perform the functions by reason whereof he was elected.

9. The Research Fellowships shall be awarded for the encouragement of study or research in some definite department of learning already recognized, or in the judgment of the Principal and Fellows worthy of being recognized, by the University, and no election shall be made to such Fellowships save by such majority and at such meeting as mentioned in clause 5 hereof.

10. The Principal and Fellows may elect to Research Fellowships any person who, having passed all the examinations required by the University for the degree of Bachelor in any Faculty, shall undertake to perform some literary or scientific work in the University or (under the direction of the College or the University)

11. Persons may be elected to Research Fellowships with or without public notice of the vacancy and with or without examination, but in no case without having previously submitted to the Principal and Fellows definite and satisfactory evidence of study or research in the branch of learning for which the Fellowship is offered.

12. Every Research Fellow shall be entitled to hold his Fellowship for the term of seven years, with power for the Principal and Fellows to determine his Fellowship at any time if in their judgment the Fellow shall cease to pursue satisfactorily the work for which the Fellowship was awarded, and in any case the Fellow shall submit to them one calendar month before the end of the third year of his Fellowship definite and satisfactory evidence of his continuous application to such work and of the results obtained.

13. Every Research Fellow shall be entitled to receive as the emolument of his Fellowship the sum of £200 per annum, clear of income tax, but without any other allowance save as in this Statute provided, and shall remain a Probationer Fellow for one year from the day of his election.

A Probationer Fellow shall not be entitled to take any part in the government of the College or the administration of its property, but shall receive the same emoluments as if he were an Actual Fellow. Upon the expiration of his year of probation he shall be admitted an Actual Fellow if found fit in the judgment of the Principal and Fellows to be a Fellow of the

14. If any Research Fellow shall accept any office or undertake any employment which in the judgment of the Principal and Fellows is incompatible with the fulfilment of the purpose of his

Fellowship he shall vacate the same.

15. The Principal and Fellows may, if in their discretion they think fit, allow any Non-Official Fellow to occupy rooms in College rent free, but shall in no case make such allowance unless they consider that special reasons exist which make such course expedient in the interests of the College

Part IV. Additional Fellowships.

1. If at any time the Principal and Fellows consider that the corporate revenues are sufficient for the purpose, they may, by such majority and at such meeting as mentioned in clause 5,

Part III hereof, establish out of such revenues any additional Professorial or Research Fellowship or Fellowships or any additional Fellowship or Fellowships (hereinafter called "Special Fellowships") of a kind not authorized by these Statutes, but solely regulated as to mode of election, tenure, duration, emoluments and other matters by such conditions as the Principal and Fellows may prescribe.

2. No Special Fellowship shall be established unless it subserve some University purpose, and in no case shall the emoluments attached thereto exceed £200 per annum, clear of income tax, but exclusive of any dinner allowance.

3. There shall never be subsisting more than six Additional Fellowships.

4. At any time upon the occurrence of a vacancy in any additional Fellowship, the Principal and Fellows may, if having regard to the financial position of the College they think fit, either (a) suspend such Fellowship either permanently or for a limited period, or (β) elect thereto a Fellow of any of the three kinds provided for in this part. Provided that no Special or Professorial Fellowship established under this part may be suspended or treated as a Research Fellowship unless the intention of the Principal and Fellows to so suspend or treat it shall have been communicated to the Vice-Chancellor for the information of the Hebdomadal Council, and unless the sanction of the Visitor shall have been given after consideration of any representations which the Hebdomadal Council may judge it expedient to make in the interests of the University.

Part V. Supernumerary Fellowships.

- 1. Any Official Fellow whose term of service shall have reached 25 years may, in lieu of being retired on the pension hereinbefore mentioned, by a special vote of the Principal and Fellows and with his own consent, be elected to a Fellowship with a stipend of £250, clear of income tax, payable out of the pension fund, but without any other (save the dinner) allowance.
- 2. There shall never be subsisting more than two Fellowships under clause 1 hereof.
- 3. A person elected under clause 1 hereof shall hold his Fellowship for life.
- 4. The Principal and Fellows may elect to a Fellowship any former member of the Governing Body who has served the College in one of the following offices, namely, those of Principal, Vice-Principal, Bursar, or Tutor, but there shall never be more than one Fellowship subsisting under this clause.
- 5. No election shall take place under the preceding clause except by such majority and at such meeting as mentioned in clause 5, Part III
- 6. Every person elected to a Fellowship under clause 4 hereof shall be entitled to receive as the emoluments of his Fellowship the sum of £50 per annum, clear of income tax, but without any other (save the dinner) allowance, and shall be entitled to hold his Fellowship for the term of seven years, with power for the Principal and Fellows from time to time (if in their discretion they by the same majority and at such meeting as aforesaid think fit) to re-elect him. Provided that if any Fellow elected under this clause shall be in receipt of any pension from the College no such sum of £50 per annum shall be payable.
- 7. Any person elected under this Part shall be reckoned a Supernumerary Fellow, and not counted in ascertaining the total number of twelve Fellows or the number of additional Fellows.

Part VI. Honorary Fellows.

The Principal and Fellows may, at any stated General Meeting, elect distinguished persons who are or have been members of the College to Honorary Fellowships within the College. Persons so elected shall be termed Honorary Fellows, and shall not be members of the Governing Body, or receive any emolument as Fellows, but may enjoy such other privileges and advantages as the Principal and Fellows shall from time to time determine. Honorary Fellows shall not be counted among the Fellows of the College. The conditions of eligibility to and tenure of Honorary Fellowships, and the mode of election thereof, to be determined by the Principal and Fellows from time to time.

The provisions contained in Statute III with regard to Non-Official Fellowships shall not be regarded as obligatory save as and when vacancies occur in Fellowships which were subsisting on the said 9th day of December, 1903, and to which, having regard to these Statutes, Non-Official Fellows ought to be elected. Provided that on any vacancy occurring in the Fellowships subsisting at such date under the clauses known before the said amendments of the said 9th day of December, 1903, as clauses 4, 19a, and 29. 2. of Statute III, the said Fellowships shall respectively be deemed to be permanently 'suspended.'

Amend Stat. XVII. Dele the whole, and sub-

stitute-

'In construing these Statutes, the words "the Principal and Fellows" shall mean the Principal and Fellows other than Probationary and Honorary Fellows, and the words "Fellows" and "Fellow," unless the contrary clearly appears, Fellows or a Fellow other than Probationary and Honorary Fellows

· The following Statutes, made on the seventh day of December, one thousand nine hundred and three (and sealed on the twelfth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and three), by the Governing Body of Trinity College, Cambridge, amending certain of the Statutes of the College, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act,

STATUTES to alter and amend the Statutes of Trinity College in the University of Cambridge which amending Statutes were duly made at a College Meeting being a meeting of the Governing Body of the College specially summoned for this purpose and held on the seventh day of December one thousand nine hundred and three and having been passed at such meeting by the votes of more than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting are now submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

We the Master Fellows and Scholars of Trinity College in the University of Cambridge in exercise of the powers given to us by the fifty-fourth section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1877 do hereby alter and amend the existing Statutes of our said College in the manner following:

By repealing Statute XXVIII intituled "The Vice-Master" and substituting therefor the following Statute to form an amended Statute

XXVIII. The Vice-Master.

1. There shall be elected by the College Meeting from among the Fellows of the College a Vice-Master. The first such election shall be made at the Annual College Meeting next after the approval of this Statute by His Majesty in Council. The Vice-Master then elected shall hold office until the next College Meeting for the election of members of Council and thereafter the election shall be made in each alternate year at the same College Meeting as the election of members of Council. Provided that until the Annual College Meeting next after the approval of this Statute by His Majesty in Council the Vice-Master shall be elected by the Council as heretofore, and the tenure of office of the Vice-Master for the time being shall determine at the said last-mentioned Annual College Meeting.

2. Every casual vacancy in the office of Vice-Master shall be filled up as soon as conveniently may be and in any case within three calendar months by the election at an Annual College Meeting or at a Special College Meeting of a Vice-Master who shall hold office for the remainder of the term for which his prede-

cessor was elected.

3. The election of a Vice-Master shall be made in accordance with such regulations as the College Meeting shall from time to time

approve.

4. It shall be the duty of the Vice-Master to attend under the Master to the good government of the Fellows Scholars students officers and servants of the College, to enforce the observance of the Statutes, to act as the Master's deputy in his absence, and to perform such other acts as are prescribed by these Statutes or by any College order. He shall not be absent from College during term at the same time with the Master except for grave cause to be approved by the Council.

5. During any vacancy in the office of Vice-Master, and during any absence of the Vice-Master from Cambridge, the senior in residence of the Fellows who are members of Council but if there be none such in residence then the senior Fellow in residence shall act as Vice-

6. The Vice-Master shall make in the presence of the Council a declaration that he will discharge the duties of his office faithfully and according to the Statutes.

By repealing section 1 of Statute XXIX intituled "The Deans" and substituting therefor the following section to form an amended section 1 of that Statute.

1. There shall be elected annually from among the Fellows of the College two Deans. Their duty shall be to superintend the conduct and behaviour of the members of the College in statu pupillari.

By repealing section 1 of Statute XXXI intituled "Elections of Annual Officers" and substituting therefor the following section to form an amended section 1 of that Statute.

 The Deans and the Bursars shall be respectively elected annually by the Council on such

day or days and at such hour and place as the Council shall determine, and for the purpose of any such election nine members shall be a quorum to constitute a meeting of Council. The Master shall be present at all such elec-

tions unless prevented by grave cause.

By adding at the end of section 2 of Statute
XLI intituled "The College Meeting" the follow-

ing words.

Provided that in the case of a Special College Meeting summoned for the purpose of electing a Vice-Master or a member of Council to fill a casual vacancy twenty-one days' notice shall be sufficient notwithstanding that the whole or any part of such twenty-one days may fall within a University vacation. Provided also that at a Special College Meeting summoned with less than twenty-one days' notice exclusive of any University vacation no business shall be transacted except the election of a Vice-Master or a member of Council.

By adding after section 3 of the said Statute XLI the following section to form section 3a of

that Statute.

3a. The election of a Vice-Master or of a member of Council to fill a casual vacancy shall be made at the next College Meeting after the vacancy becomes known to the Master and may be made without notice, provided that notice shall be given as far as each case permits. Provided that in case the election of a Vice-Master causes a vacancy in the number of elective members of Council such vacancy shall be filled up at the same meeting.

By repealing section 7 of Statute XLII intituled "The Council" and substituting therefor the following section to form an amended

section 7 of that Statute.

7. The Council shall include as ex officio members the Master the Vice-Master the Senior Tutor the Senior Bursar being a Fellow and the Junior Bursar being a Fellow. If either of the Bursars be not a Fellow he shall not be an ex officio member of Council but unless elected a member shall be an assessor only without a vote. For all cases of discipline and questions affecting the discipline of the College, and for all questions affecting the celebration of divine service in the College Chapel the Senior Dean if not a member of Council shall be an assessor without a vote. Provided that until the Annual College Meeting next after the approval of this Statute by His Majesty in Council the Senior Dean shall and the Vice-Master shall not be an ex officio member of Council.

By repealing section 11 of the said Statute XLII and substituting therefor the following section to form an amended section 11 of that

Statute.

11. Every casual vacancy in the number of elective members of Council whether caused by an elective member becoming an ex officio member or otherwise shall be filled up as soon as conveniently may be and in any case within three calendar months by the election at an Annual College Meeting or at a Special College Meeting of a member of Council who shall hold office for the remainder of the term of office of the elective member who may occasion the vacancy.

By repealing section 8 of Statute XLIX intituled "Distribution of Revenues" and substituting therefor the following section to form

an amended section 8 of that Statute.

8. In lieu of the former payments to the Poor Men on the foundation of King Henry VIII and on the foundation of Thomas Allen respectively the several yearly sums of £150 and £10 payable in accordance with the provisions of the Statute in that behalf hereinafter contained.

By repealing Statute LIV intituled "The Tuition Fund" and substituting therefor the following Statute to form an amended Statute

LIV.-The Tuition Fund.

1. The Council shall fix from time to time the tuition fees to be paid to the Tuition Fund by the Students of the College and by other persons in respect of education or examinations provided by the College.
2. This fund shall be applied under the

direction of the Council:

(i) To the payment (subject to the provisions hereinbefore contained as to the payments to he made to a Praelector) of the Tutors and other educational officers of the College and if the Council think fit.

(ii) To the payment of the whole or any portion of the fees incurred by Students of the College in respect of examinations provided by other Colleges or of education provided by them or by the University and if the Council

(iii) To the payment of the whole or any portion of the current expenses of the College Lectures or of the College examinations other than those for Scholarships and Fellowships.

(iv) To the payment of such part of the sum payable by the College to the University under the Statute in that behalf hereinbefore contained as shall be charged on the Fund under the provisions of the said Statute.

3. The Council shall have power to reserve a balance out of this Fund.

By repealing section 1 of Statute LXI intituled "Scholarships at Cambridge and Stevenage Schools" and substituting therefor the following section to form an amended section 1 of that Statute.

 In lieu of the payments formerly made to the Poor Men on the foundation of King Henry VIII the yearly sum of £150 out of the income of the College shall be applied as

follows :-

(i) To the maintenance of scholarships of such value and tenable for such periods as the Council shall from time to time determine for poor scholars at the Perse School for Boys, the Perse School for Girls, and such other secondary schools in Cambridge as may from time to time be determined by a resolution passed at a College Meeting by the votes of a majority of the persons present and voting on such resolution.

(ii) To the granting of exhibitions to enable poor persons educated at such schools as aforesaid to study at the University or at the Colleges of Girton or Newnham.

(iii) The balance not applied in any year to the purposes hereinbefore mentioned shall be paid into a separate fund to be called King Henry VIII's Fund which shall be applied from time to time at the discretion of the Council to the provision of additional scholarships or exhibitions in connection with such schools as aforesaid or to the making of grants for any other charitable purposes educational or otherwise in the town of Cambridge.

By repealing section 3 of the said Statute LXI and substituting therefor the following section to form an amended section 3 of that Statute.

3. Subject to the foregoing provisions the Council shall have power to make regulations

from time to time for determining all matters relating to any or all of the several payments above mentioned.

The Wild Birds Protection (County of Montgomery) Order, 1904.

Dated 28th January, 1904.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1902, and upon application by the County Council of the Administrative County of Montgomery, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Montgomery) Order, 1904."

Birds.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

II. During the period between the 31st day of July in any year and the 2nd day of March following, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Montgomery:—

Common Buzzard, Goldfinch, Heron, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kite, Owl, Redpole, Siskin. Exclusion from the operation of the Act of 1880. III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall not apply within the Administrative County of Montgomery to the House Sparrow.

Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.

IV. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited within the Administrative County of Montgomery:—

Common Buzzard, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kite,

Owl.

If a ship has been disinfected at Bushire (the only port which possesses a stove) it will not be subject to disinfection at Basra, if it has not touched another port after leaving Bushire.

Circular No. 180 concerning rat destruction in Turkish ports, remains in force and in its application the Persian ports are now to be treated as "ports indemnes."
