17. No Fellow whose Fellowship was subsisting on the 9th day of December, 1903, shall be affected or prejudiced by clause 3 of Part I, Stat. III.

18. Any Feliow elected under the provisions contained in the clauses known before the amendments made on the said 9th day of December, 1903, as clauses 4, 19 (a) and 29 (2) respectively of Statute III, and whose Fellowship was subsisting on such date, shall be deemed to be in possession thereof and to hold the same under the powers and provisions and with and subject to the rights and conditions attaching to such Fellowship under these Statutes as they existed

immediately before such amendments.

19. The provisions contained in Statute III with regard to Non-Official Fellowships shall not be regarded as obligatory save as and when vacancies occur in Fellowships which were subsisting on the said 9th day of December, 1903, and to which, having regard to these Statutes, Non-Official Fellows ought to be elected. Provided that on any vacancy occurring in the Fellowships subsisting at such date under the clauses known before the said amendments of the said 9th day of December, 1903, as clauses 4, 19a, and 29. 2. of Statute III, the said Fellowships shall respectively be deemed to be permanently 'suspended.'

Amend Stat. XVII. Dele the whole, and sub-

stitute-

'In construing these Statutes, the words "the Principal and Fellows" shall mean the Principal and Fellows other than Probationary and Honorary Fellows, and the words "Fellows" and "Fellow," unless the contrary clearly appears, Fellows or a Fellow other than Probationary and Honorary Fellows

· The following Statutes, made on the seventh day of December, one thousand nine hundred and three (and sealed on the twelfth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and three), by the Governing Body of Trinity College, Cambridge, amending certain of the Statutes of the College, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act,

STATUTES to alter and amend the Statutes of Trinity College in the University of Cambridge which amending Statutes were duly made at a College Meeting being a meeting of the Governing Body of the College specially summoned for this purpose and held on the seventh day of December one thousand nine hundred and three and having been passed at such meeting by the votes of more than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting are now submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

We the Master Fellows and Scholars of Trinity College in the University of Cambridge in exercise of the powers given to us by the fifty-fourth section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1877 do hereby alter and amend the existing Statutes of our said College in the manner following:

By repealing Statute XXVIII intituled "The Vice-Master" and substituting therefor the following Statute to form an amended Statute

XXVIII. The Vice-Master.

1. There shall be elected by the College Meeting from among the Fellows of the College a Vice-Master. The first such election shall be made at the Annual College Meeting next after the approval of this Statute by His Majesty in Council. The Vice-Master then elected shall hold office until the next College Meeting for the election of members of Council and thereafter the election shall be made in each alternate year at the same College Meeting as the election of members of Council. Provided that until the Annual College Meeting next after the approval of this Statute by His Majesty in Council the Vice-Master shall be elected by the Council as heretofore, and the tenure of office of the Vice-Master for the time being shall determine at the said last-mentioned Annual College Meeting.

2. Every casual vacancy in the office of Vice-Master shall be filled up as soon as conveniently may be and in any case within three calendar months by the election at an Annual College Meeting or at a Special College Meeting of a Vice-Master who shall hold office for the remainder of the term for which his prede-

cessor was elected.

3. The election of a Vice-Master shall be made in accordance with such regulations as the College Meeting shall from time to time

approve.

4. It shall be the duty of the Vice-Master to attend under the Master to the good government of the Fellows Scholars students officers and servants of the College, to enforce the observance of the Statutes, to act as the Master's deputy in his absence, and to perform such other acts as are prescribed by these Statutes or by any College order. He shall not be absent from College during term at the same time with the Master except for grave cause to be approved by the Council.

5. During any vacancy in the office of Vice-Master, and during any absence of the Vice-Master from Cambridge, the senior in residence of the Fellows who are members of Council but if there be none such in residence then the senior Fellow in residence shall act as Vice-

6. The Vice-Master shall make in the presence of the Council a declaration that he will discharge the duties of his office faithfully and according to the Statutes.

By repealing section 1 of Statute XXIX intituled "The Deans" and substituting therefor the following section to form an amended section 1 of that Statute.

1. There shall be elected annually from among the Fellows of the College two Deans. Their duty shall be to superintend the conduct and behaviour of the members of the College in statu pupillari.

By repealing section 1 of Statute XXXI intituled "Elections of Annual Officers" and substituting therefor the following section to form an amended section 1 of that Statute.

 The Deans and the Bursars shall be respectively elected annually by the Council on such
