#### WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County Borough of West Bromwich) Order, 1904.

Dated 6th February, 1904.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1902, and upon application by the Council of the County Borough of West Bromwich, I hereby make the following Order:—

#### Title.

I. This Order may be cited as the Wild Birds Protection (County Borough of West Bromwich) Order, 1904.

#### BIRDS.

#### Close Time extended.

II. The period during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall be extended throughout the County Borough of West Bromwich so as to be between the last day of February and the 13th day of August in any year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the County Borough of West

Bromwich to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the Act:—

Blackbird, Tree Creeper, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, House Martin, Sand Martin, Starling, Swallow, Swift, Thrush, Tit, Wagtail.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

IV. During the period between the 12th day of August in any year and the 1st day of March following, the killing or taking of any of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County Borough of West Bromwich:—

Bittern, Blackbird, Chiff Chaff, Tree Creeper, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Goldfinch or Thistlefinch, Great Crested Grebe (Loon or Diver), Little Grebe or Dabchick, Hoopoe, Kingfisher, Lark, House Martin, Sand Martin, Nightingale, Nightjar. (Fern Owl, Goat Sucker, Night Hawk), Nuthatch, Ring Ouzel, Water Ouzel, Redstart, Robin, Starling, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Thrush, Tit, Wagtail, Aquatic Warbler, Galackcap Warbler, Dartford Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Common Wren, Fire-crested Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Woodpecker, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate, Snake Bird).

#### Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County Borough.

V. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County Borough of West Bromwich, viz.:—

Blackbird, Buzzard, Curlew or Whaup, Goldfinch or Thistlefinch, Great Crested Grebe (Loon or Diver), Hobby, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Lark, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar (Fern Owl, Goat Sucker, Night Hawk), Nuthatch, Osprey, Owl (all species), Sandpiper (Summer Snipe), Starling, Thrush, Tit, Woodpecker (all species), Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate, Snake Bird).

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 9TH FEBRUARY 1904.)

KENT (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1904.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Application of Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, with modifications, to certain Scheduled

1. The provisions of the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 shall apply to the Districts specified in the First Schedule hereto, (in this Order referred to as Scheduled Districts,) as if they had been declared by Special Order of the Board to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area, but subject to the modifications hereinafter contained.

Markets Fairs Sales and Exhibitions of Swine by Licence of Local Authority.

- 2.-(1.) The Local Authority may grant a Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition of swine in a Scheduled District, if they are satisfied that the market fair sale or exhibition is to be held in a market fair-ground saleyard or place of exhibition which is capable of being cleansed and disinfected in accordance with the next following Article, and thereupon the market fair sale or exhibition may be held accordingly: Provided that unless and until the Board otherwise order, no such Licence shall be granted by the Local Authority for the holding of a market fair sale or exhibition of swine within the petty sessional division of Ashford, in the administrative county of Kent.
- (2.) A Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition under this Article shall be signed by the Clerk of the Local Authority, by special direction of the Local Authority, and shall specify the name and address of the person licensed to hold the market fair sale or exhibition (as owner of a market, or as an auctioneer, or otherwise), and shall also specify the place where the market fair sale or exhibition is to be held, and may authorise the holding of periodical markets fairs sales or exhibitions on stated days for a time limited, not exceeding three months, but the Licence may be renewed from time to time or revoked at any time by the Local Authority.
- (3.) A Licence shall be published in such manner as the Local Authority consider best fitted to ensure publicity for the same, and a copy of the Licence shall be posted and kept posted during the holding of such market fair sale or exhibition by the person licensed to hold or holding the same at or near the gate or other entrance of the market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition where such market fair sale or exhibition is held.
- (4.) The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board a copy of every Licence granted by them for the holding of a market fair sale or exhibition under this Article.
- (5.) A fit person or a sufficient number of fit persons shall be appointed by the Local Authority and named in the Licence for the purpose of receiving Licences authorising movement, of

swine to the market fair sale or exhibition, and for granting Licences for movement of swine therefrom in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

(6.) No swine shall be moved along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare into a market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Article unless accompanied by a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 or this Order.

#### Cleansing and Disinfection of Markets, &c.

- 3. Every market fair-ground sale-yard and place of exhibition in which a market fair sale or exhibition of swine is held under the last preceding Article, shall so soon as practicable after the holding of the market fair sale or exhibition, and in any case before it is again used for swine, be cleaned and disinfected by the person licensed to hold the market fair sale or exhibition in the following manner:—
  - (i.) all parts of the market fair-ground saleyard or place of exhibition that have been used for swine shall be thoroughly scraped and swept, and all dung, sawdust, litter, or other matter effectually removed therefrom; then
  - (ii.) the same parts shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water; then
  - (iii.) the same parts shall be disinfected in such manner as the Local Authority may direct; and
  - (iv.) the scrapings and sweepings shall be well mixed with quicklime and be effectually removed from contact with animals.

#### Licences for Movement out of Licensed Markets, &c.

- 4.—(1.) Swine exposed at a market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Order may be moved from the market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition along over or across a highway or thoroughfare in a Swine-Fever Infected Area or a Scheduled District if accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement—in the Form set forth in the Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 or to the like effect—granted by the Local Authority of the District in which the market fair sale or exhibition is held.
- (2.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than four days inclusive of the day of issue.
- (3.) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and where the place of destination specified in the Licence is in a Swine-Fever Infected Area, or a Scheduled District, the swine shall be moved to such place and not elsewhere.

#### Licences after Completion of Movement.

- 5.—(1.) Where swine are moved with a Licence under the Swiue-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, or this Order, to a market fair sale or exhibition in a Swine-Fever Infected Area or a Scheduled District, the Licence shall be delivered up at the entrance to the market fair-ground sale-yard or place of exhibition by the person in charge of the swine to the person appointed under this Order to receive the same.
- (2.) Where swine are moved with a Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902, or this Order, to any other premises in a Swine-Fever Infected Area or a Scheduled District, the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or

sent by post to, the nearest Police Station by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the said movement.

#### Attendance at Markets, &c.

6. A Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend at every market fair sale or exhibition licensed under this Order.

#### Revocation by Board of Licences.

7. If the Board are of opinion, with respect to any Licence for a market fair sale or exhibition under this Order, that the holding of such market fair sale or exhibition thereby licensed is inexpedient, or that the Licence is objectionable in any particular, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

#### Markets, &c. of Swine by Licence of Board.

8. Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions and in addition thereto a market fair sale or exhibition of swine may be held with a Licence of the Board, which Licence will only be granted where the Board after inquiry are satisfied that exceptional circumstances render such market fair sale or exhibition necessary or expedient.

#### Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

- 9.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.
- (2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

#### Local Authority to enforce Order.

10. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

#### Forms.

11. For the purposes of any Movement Licence under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1902 or this Order, the Scheduled Districts shall be deemed to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area.

#### Offences.

- 12.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, or of the conditions of a Movement Licence thereunder, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (2.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (3.) If any person fail to deliver up or send a Licence, as required by this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If anything is omitted to be done as regards cleansing or disinfection in contraven-tion of this Order, the owner and the lessee and the occupier of any place in or in respect of which the same is omitted, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

#### Interpretation.

#### 13. In this Order-

"The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:

"Swine-Fever Infected Area" means an area declared by Special Order of the Board to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area:

"The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Ruapehu Shoal—Non-existence of.

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 464 of 1902, which states that the steamship "Ruapehu," belonging to the New Zealand Shipping Company, struck on the 2nd June, 1902, at 2.30 A.M., on a 4-fathoms shoal, in approximately lat. 10° 33′ N., long. 16° 39′ W.

This reported danger was searched for first by His Majesty's ship "Magpi-," in June, 1902, over an area of 10 square miles, without success; secondly, by His Majesty's ship "Partridge, November, 1902, over an area extending 15 miles north, 7 miles south, and about 6 miles east and west of its supposed position, also unsuccessfully.

In May, 1903, His Majesty's surveying-vessel "Goldfinch" examined an area of over 800 square miles, on a scale of half an inch to a mile, around the supposed position of the shoal, without discovering any sign of danger.

In December, 1903, His Majesty's surveying-vessel "Goldfiach" made further exhaustive search, on a scale of 2 inches to the mile, over an area of 120 square miles, without any success, the soundings showing the bottom to be remarkably even, but gradually decreating towards the shore.

A comparison of the soundings obtained by the "Ruapehu" before and after she grounded, with those now obtained in the various searches made for this shoal, leads to the conclusion that the vessel really struck on one of the known shoal patches in about lat. 11° 2′ N., long. 16° 43′ W., about 25 miles to the north and east. She probably experienced a strong north-easterly current in the night. Such a current is not unknown in the months of June to September in this locality, and it is shown on the monthly current charts of the North Atlantic compiled by the Meteorological Office, and published by the

The Ruapehu Shoal, shown in lat. 10° 33' N., long. 16° 39' W., has therefore been expunged from the Admiralty Charts.

CAUTION.—Mariners are advised to study the monthly current charts of the several oceans, published by the Admiralty, more especially their set near salient points in the general shipping tracks, always remembering that little or no time is lost, in a voyage, by giving dangerous points a wide berth.
