The following are the rules to be observed :-

ATTENDANCES AND PRESENTATIONS.

1. All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists, of the Royal Navy and the Royal Marines, of whatever rank, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Private Secretary to the First Lord of the Admiralty. All Civil Officers of the Admiralty will follow the same rule.

2. All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists, of the Army, Militia, Yeomanry, or Volunteers, of whatever rank, except those on the Indian and Colonial Establishments, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the

Adjutant-General at the War Office.

3. All Officers of the Indian Civil Service and of the Indian Army, of whatever rank, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Private Secretary to the Secretary of State at the India

Office, Whitehall.

4. All Officers of the Colonial Service and Colonial Forces, of whatever rank, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Colonial Office, Whitehall, with the exception of Officers of the local Forces of the Colonies possessing responsible Government, who will apply to the War Office for their cards for attendance or for presentation by the Adjutant - General. The application must in all cases be supported by a credential from the Governor or Officer commanding the local Forces of the Colony.

5. Similarly, all Gentlemen connected with the Foreign Office, the Home Office, Officials connected with the Houses of Parliament or any Government Department, will communicate with and obtain their cards for attendance or presentation at Levées from the Department under which

they serve.
6. Judges, Law Officers, King's Counsel, and all Legal Officials holding appointments under the Crown, are requested to make their applica-tions through the Secretary to the Lord Chancellor.

7. Peers, Bishops, Members of Parliament, Clergy of all Denominations, and all Gentlemen other than the above mentioned, will be good enough to communicate with the Lord Chamberlain at St. James's Palace, when they will each be furnished with a card of admission for use at the Levée.

In the case of the Levée to be held on the 29th instant all names, both for attendance and presentatation, must be received at the various offices not later than Wednesday, the 24th instant.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

2. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

3.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If any person with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order allows a pig to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

12. No passenger or other person, not being a servant of the Corporation, shall be permitted to travel on the steps or platforms of any carriage, or stand either on the roof or, except with the express permission of the conductor first obtained, in the interior, or sit on the outside rail on the roof of any carriage, and any passenger or other person so travelling, standing or sitting, shall cease to do so immediately on

request by the conductor.

13. No person, except a passenger, or intending passenger, shall enter or mount any carriage, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any carriage, or, except with the express permission of the conductor first obtained, travel therein otherwise than on a seat provided for

14. When any carriage contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to contain, no additional person shall enter, mount,

Bye-Laws and Regulations made by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the County Borough of Rotherham, as promoters under the powers conferred by Section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870, at a meeting of the Town Council, held in the Council Chamber, Town Hall, Rotherham, on the 3rd February,

Application of Bye-laws.

1. The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages used on the tramways of the Corporation, and to all places with respect to which the Corporation have power to make Bye-laws or Regulations.

Definition.

2. For the purpose of these Bye-laws the term "Corporation" shall mean the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the County Borough of Rotherham; the term "tramways" shall mean the tramway system worked by the Corporation, whether situate within the borough of Rotherham or in any other district; the word "car" means any carriage or car run upon the tramways for the conveyance of passengers; the word "conductor" means any officer or servant of the Corporation having charge of or helping in charge of a car; the word "motorman" means any officer or servant of the Corporation driving or helping to drive a car.

Entering and leaving Cars.

· 3. Every person shall enter or depart from a car by the conductor's platform in the rear of the car and not otherwise, unless so directed by the

All persons desiring to mount a car for the purpose of travelling thereon shall first permit all persons to alight who may be intending so

Entering or leaving Car whilst in motion.

4. No person shall enter, or mount, or leave or attempt to enter, mount, or leave any car whilst in motion.

Payment of Fares.

5. Every passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor, or other duly authorized officer of the Corporation the fare legally demandable or, except with the express permission of the for the journey, and receive a ticket therefor. Any passenger leaving the car shall be deemed | conductor. The conductor may decline to take to have completed his journey.

Passengers to produce Tickets.
6. Each passenger shall, immediately upon demand, show his ticket to the conductor or any duly authorized officer or servant of the Corporation, and shall also, when required so to do, deliver up his ticket, or in case of failure to produce such ticket, pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

Workmen's Tickets.

7. No person not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the Act of Parliament relating to the Corporation, shall use or attempt to use any ticket intended for artisans, mechanics or daily labourers.

Full Cars.

8. When any car contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to contain, no additional person shall enter, mount, or remain in or upon any such car, when warned by the conductor not to do so; and any person remaining after being so warned shall be liable to the penalty hereinafter provided.

Unauthorized Travelling.

- 9. No person, not being an officer or servant of the Corporation, shall travel on the steps or platform of any car, or stand on the roof, or sit on the outside rail on the roof or platform of any car. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or mount any car, and no person shall hold, or hang on by or to any part of any car, except straps or other appliances provided inside the car for the convenience of passengers.
- Smoking. 10. No person shall smoke inside or on either platform of any car.

Offensive Language.

11. No person shall swear, or use obscene language whilst in or upon any car, or spit, or commit any nuisance in or upon any car, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger. No person shall play or perform upon any musical instrument, or beg or collect money, alms, or subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game or gamble, or deposit remnants of food or fruit in or upon any car.

Objectionable Persons.

12. No person in a state of intoxication, or affected with any infectious or contagious disease shall enter or mount upon any car, and if any person is found in or upon any car he shall, in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter provided, forfeit his fare, and be immediately removed from the car by or under the direction of the conductor. A passenger whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a car, soil or injure the seats or fittings of the car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or any person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be objectionable to passengers, shall not be allowed to enter or remain in or on any car, and if found in or on any car, shall, on the request of the conductor, leave the car upon his fare, if previously paid, being returned.

Dogs.

13. No dog or any other animal shall be allowed in or on any car.

Luggage or Parcels.

14. Personal luggage, not exceeding 28 lbs. in weight, shall be conveyed at the passenger's own risk, and shall be placed as directed by the into or upon any car any luggage calculated to annoy or inconvenience passengers.

Damaging Cars.

15. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the seats, curtains, or fittings, or any other part of any car, or remove or deface any number plates, printed or other notices in or on any car, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise damage, any car; and no person, not being a servant of the Corporation, shall touch, handle, or interfere with any electric muchine or appliance in, under, upon, or about any car (except the electric bells provided for the use of passengers). Any person acting in contravention of this regulation shall be liable, in addition to the penalty hereinafter provided, to pay the amount of damage done.

Firearms.

16. No person shall enter, get upon, or travel in or on any car with loaded firearms, or with any instrument or implement which may be dangerous or offensive to any passenger.

Disabled Cars.

17. If at any time a car becomes disabled, or damaged, or from any cause unable to proceed, all passengers shall, upon the request of the conductor, leave the car, and if such passengers have paid their fares, shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but shall be entitled to continue their journey by the next available car. No person shall, except with the permission of the conductor, mount or enter a disabled car.

Interference with Motormen or Conductors' duties.

18. No person other than the conductor or motorman shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights, switches, ventilators, trolley cord, or any part of a car or its equipment, or signal a car to start.

Obstructing Officials in execution of duty.

19. No passenger or other person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any car or tramway.

Conductors and Motormen to enforce Byelaws.

20. Every conductor and motorman shall, to the best of his ability, enforce these Bye-laws and regulations, and prevent any breach thereof.

21. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws or regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

22. There shall be placed and kept in a conspicuous position inside of each car in use a printed copy of these Bye-laws and regulations.

Date of Commencement.

23. These Bye-laws shall come into force on the 1st May, 1904.
