#### BANKRUPTCY, ENGLAND. FEES.

Order as to Fees and Percentages, dated 4th February, 1904.

I, the Right Honourable Hardinge Stanley, Earl of Halsbury, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, do, by virtue of the powers vested in me by the Bankruptcy Act, 1883, prescribe that, notwithstanding anything contained in the Order as to Fees and Percentages dated the 18th and 19th days of December, 1890, in any case in which under sections 159, 160, and 161 of the Bankruptcy Act, 1883, an Official Receiver has become, or is acting as Trustee in proceedings under the Bankruptcy Act, 1869, such fees and percentages may be charged for and shall be payable in respect of the proceedings, including proceedings taken and conducted before the date of this Order, in addition to the fees and percentages prescribed by Tables B and D of the Board of Trade may by Order think fit to allow; and all the provisions of the said Order shall, so far as applicable, apply to the said additional fees and percentages when so allowed.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, the following extracts from the Cyprus Gazette of 29th January :—

#### (No. 6984.) Small-Pox.

In consequence of an outbreak of small-pox at Syria and Asia Minor, His Excellency the High Commissioner, under the power and authority vested in him by "The Infectious Diseases Prevention Ordinance, 1883," has been pleased to order that all passengers arriving from that place will be submitted to the following regulations before being allowed to land in Cyprus :--

1. Any vessel arriving at any port in Cyprus, except Larnaca, from Syria or Asia Minor, with passengers for Cyprus, is to be medically inspected, their effects disinfected. In the event of there being any case, or suspected case, of small-pox on board, pratique will be refused, and the vessel is to be ordered to proceed to Larnaca, a note to that effect being made on the bill of health, and the Chief Medical Officer is to be at once informed by telegram.

2. All arrivals at Larnaca from Syria or Asia Minor are to be carefully inspected, their effects disinfected before being admitted to pratique, and for further security, all persons wishing to land are to be carefully visited at the end of the pier, in accordance with instructions issued by the Chief Medical Officer.

3. In the event of any person being found to be affected with small-pox, the said person, with his relations, friends, and servants accompanying him, if any, will be isolated in quarantine, and the Chief Medical Officer is to be immediately advised of the fact by telegram.

4. All persons landing will be required to give to the Health Officer the address of the place where they propose to reside, and should they, before the expiration of 15 days after their arrival, change their place of abode, they will give notice of such change to the Health Officer.

5. All such persons shall be subject to be visited by the Health Officer or any other doctor appointed by the Chief Medical Officer for the purpose, within a period of 15 days from their arrival.

### MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903. Borough of Huddersfield.

W HEREAS by section 8 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1903") it is enacted that the Local Government Board may, by regulations made under Section 6 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1896"), prohibit or restrict the driving of any motor cars, or of any special kind of motor cars, on any specified highway or part of a highway, which does not exceed sixteen feet in width, or on which ordinary motor car traffic would, in their opinion, be especially dangerous:

And whereas by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act of 1903, it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Local Government Board with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour:

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the borough of Huddersfield have applied to the Local Government Board to make regulations :-(a) Under section 6 of the Act of 1896, and section 8 of the Act of 1903, for restricting to seven miles per hour the speed at which any motor car may be driven on any highway situate in so much of the said borough as is comprised within a circle drawn with a radius of one mile from the Market Cross in the said borough; and (b) under subsection (1) of section 9 of the Act of 1903, putting the above-mentioned provisions of that subsection in force in so much of the residue of the said borough as is comprised within a circle drawn with a radius of 2 miles from the said Market Cross. A map of the borough showing the two areas which would be affected by the said regulations may be inspected between the hours of 10 A.M. and 4 P.M. at the office of the Local Government Board, Whitehall, London, and a duplicate of the said map

may be inspected at the office of the Town Clerk of the borough, at the Town Hall, Huddersfield.

Not ce is hereby further given that objections to the making of such regulations, or of either of them, may be sent in writing to the Local Government Board at their office aforesaid, on or before the seventeenth day of March, 1904.

A copy of any such objection should be sent at the same time by the objector to the Council of the said borough, addressed to the Town Clerk, at the Town Hall aforesaid.
