"(4.) One-half of the said area shall be cleared " of buildings as soon as the local authority "shall have acquired the same but until " such provision as is hereinbefore mentioned " shall have been made on such half of the " said area for the accommodation of two hundred and seventy-five persons of the " working class no buildings occupied as "dwelling-houses at the date of the Scheme " in the remaining half of such area shall be " demolished."

And whereas the Mayor, Aldermen, and Councillors of the Metropolitan Borough of Bermondsey (hereinafter referred to as "the Borough Council") are, as the succesors of the said Vestry, in relation to the said Metropolitan Borough, the Local Authority for the purposes of Part II of the Act;

And whereas by an Order dated the 27th day of May, 1903, We permitted the Borough Council to modify the Scheme so as to require the Borough Council to demolish the buildings on the second half of the area comprised in the Scheme before provision was made for the accommodation of persons of the working class as required by the Scheme, and as soon as such demolition was completed to make provision for the accommodation of persons of the working class to the extent required by the Scheme as sanctioned and modified;

And whereas the Borough Council have in pursuance of the Scheme as modified by the lastmentioned Order demolished the whole of the buildings on the area comprised in the Scheme, and have made application to Us to permit the Scheme as sanctioned and modified as aforesaid to be further modified so as to allow the Borough Council to erect buildings on the area comprised in the Scheme for the accommodation of 980 persons of the working class instead of the 550 persons of the working class for whom accommodation was required to be provided in pursuance of the Scheme as sanctioned and modified as aforesaid:

And whereas We are satisfied that an improvement can be made in the details of the Scheme by the modification which forms the subject of the application of the Borough Council:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers vested in Us in that behalf, We do hereby Declare and Direct as follows:-

We permit the Borough Council to further modify the Scheme so that the following provisions shall have effect :-

- (a.) The Borough Council shall cause suitable buildings to be erected on the area comprised in the Scheme sufficient to provide dwellings for the accommodation of nine hundred and eighty persons of the working class instead of five hundred and fifty persons of that class required to be accommodated as aforesaid:
- (b.) All the provisions of the Scheme as sanctioned and modified as aforesaid shall apply to the dwellings to be erected on the area comprised in the Scheme for the accommodation of the number of persons of the working class for whom in pursuance of this Order suitable dwellings are to be erected on that

(c.) The erection of the dwellings in pursuance of the provisions hereinbefore contained and applied may be undertaken by the Borough

(d.) The borrowing powers conferred on the Local Authority by subdivision (5) of Article I of the Order dated the fifth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and nivety-nine, and transferred to and exerciseable by the Borough Council shall apply to the dwellings authorized by this Order to be
