The Wild Birds Protection (County of Salop) Order, 1904.

Dated 9th March, 1904.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1902 and upon application by the County Council of Salop, I hereby make the following Order :-

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County of Salop) Order, 1904."

BIRDS.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

II. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the whole of the County of Salop to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the Act:

Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, House Martin, Sand Martin, Nuthatch, Swallow, Swift, Treecreeper, Grey Wagtail, White Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail.
