The Board of Trade have issued the following Official Notice to Masters of British Ships:—

RUSSO-JAPANESE WAR.

Masters of British Merchant Vessels must immediately stop when summoned, on the high seas, to do so by a warship of either belligerent, and must not resist being visited or searched for contraband of war by such warship, as any attempt on their part to evade or resist visit or search may be attended with serious consequences to themselves and to their vessels and cargoes.

The notifications printed below show what articles are considered by the Russian and Japanese Governments to be contraband of war.

Notifications defining Contraband of War.

I. By Russia.

Extract from an Imperial Order published on the 29th February, 1904.

The following articles are deemed to be contraband of war:-

- Small arms of every kind, and guns, mounted or in sections, as well as armour-plates;
- Ammunition for fire-arms, such as projectiles, shell-fuses, bullets, priming, cartridges, cartridge cases, powder, saltpetre, sulphur;
- 3. Explosives and materials for causing explosions, such as torpedoes, dynamite, pyroxyline, various explosive substances, wire conductors, and everything used to explode mines and torpedoes;
- 4. Artillery, engineering and camp equipment, such as gun carriages, ammunition waggons, boxes or packages of cartridges, field kitchens and forges, instrument waggons, pontoons, bridge trestles, barbed wire, harness, &c.;
- Articles of military equipment and clothing, such as bandoliers, cartridge boxes, knapsacks, straps, cuirasses, entrenching tools, drums, pots and pans, saddles, harness, completed parts of military uniforms, tents, &c.;
- 6. Vessels bound for an enemy's port, even if under a neutral commercial flag, if it is apparent from their construction, interior fittings and other indications, that they have been built for warlike purposes and are proceeding to an enemy's port in order to be sold or handed over to the enemy;
- Boilers and every kind of naval machinery mounted or unmounted;
- Every kind of fuel, such as coal, naphtha, alcohol and other similar materials;
- Articles and materials for the installation of telegraphs, telephones, or for the construction of railroads;
- 10. Generally, everything intended for warfare by sea or land, as well as rice, provisions and horses, beasts of burden and others which may be used for a warlike purpose, if they are transported on the account of or are destined for the enemy.

The following acts, forbidden to neutrals, are assimilated to contraband of war: The transport of the enemy's troops, of his despatches and correspondence, the supply of transports and warships to the enemy. Neutral vessels captured in the act of carrying contraband of this nature may, according to circumstances, be seized and even confiscated.

II. By Japan.

Notification published 10th February. Contraband of war divided into two classes:—

First Class.—Military weapons, ammunition, appointed as that on vexplosives and materials, including lead, shall come into opera saltpetre, sulphur, &c., and machinery for be further postponed.

making them, uniforms naval and military, military accourtements, armour-plated machinery, and materials for construction or equipment of ships of war, and all other goods which, though not coming under this list, are intended solely for use in war. Above-mentioned articles will be regarded as contraband of war when passing through or destined for enemy's army, navy or territory.

Second Class.—Provisions, drinks, horses, harness, fodder, vehicles, coal, timber, coins, gold and silver bullion, and materials for construction of telegraphs, telephones, railways. Above-mentioned articles will be regarded as contraband of war when destined for enemy's army or navy, or in such cases where being goods arriving at enemy's territory there is reason to believe they are intended for use of enemy's army or navy. Exception has been made as regards articles manifestly intended for use of vessel carrying them.

And whereas it is expedient that Part II of the Act and so much of the Act as is consequential upon and necessary for the operation of Part II of the Act shall come into operation for that Council upon the first day of April, nineteen hundred and four, aforesaid, but that the day appointed as that on which Part III of the Act shall come into operation for that Council shall be further postnoned.

Now, therefore, the Board of Education, pursuant to the Act and to every other power enabling them in that behalf, hereby appoint as the appointed day for the said Council for all the other purposes and provisions aforesaid other than the purposes and provisions of Part II of the Act and of so much of the Act as is consequential upon and necessary for the operation of Part II of the Act, the first day of July, nineteen hundred and four, or such later day or days as the Board may for any such other purpose or provision for the said Council hereafter appoint.

THE Ashton - upon - Mersey Urban District Council, in pursuance of a Resolution passed by such Council at a Special Meeting, convened and held upon the eighth day of March, 1904, as directed by sub-section (2) of section 90 of the Manchester Southern Tramways Act, 1903, do hereby intimate to you the desire of the Council to exercise the powers and assume the obligations conferred or imposed on you by the said Act in relation to the construction, maintenance, and user of so much of the tramways as are situate in the district of the said Council.

YE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS made by the Hartlepool Electric Tramways Company Limited and the General Electric Tramways Company (hereinafter referred to as "the Companies") under the powers conferred on the said respective Companies by the Railway Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, the Tramway Act, 1870, the West Hartlepool Light Railways Order, 1898, and the West Hartlepool Light Railways (Deviation, &c.) Order, 1901.
1. The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter

set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages of the Companies and to all places with respect to which the Companies have power to make bye-

laws or regulations.

2. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a carriage by the hindermost or conductor's platform, except in the case of carriages which are in charge of one official only, when every passenger shall enter or depart from a carriage by the driver's platform and not otherwise.

3. No passenger shall smoke inside any car-

riage or any compartment of a carriage unless a written notice permitting smoking be attached to the carriage at the time such person is travelling thereby. Any person offending against this Byelaw is liable, in addition to incurring the penalty below mentioned, to be summarily removed at the first opportunity from the carriage.

4. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any carriage, play or per-

form upon any musical instrument.

5. A person in a state of intoxication shall not be allowed to enter or mount upon any carriage, and if found in or upon any carriage shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

6. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any carriage, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any carriage, or wilfully interfere with the

comfort of any passenger.
7. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice,

in or on the carriage, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Rye-laws and Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any

damage done.

8. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a carriage, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the carriage. or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor. might for any other reason be offensive to passen-gers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in the interior of any carriage, and may be prevented from entering the interior of any carriage, and shall not enter the interior of any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and if found in the interior of any carriage, shall, on the request of the conductor, leave the interior of the carriage, upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

9. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor or other duly authorized servant of the Companies, the fare legally demandable

for the journey.

10. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do, to the conductor or any duly authorized servant of the Companies, and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by

such passenger.

11. Any ticket for the time being issued by the Companies in respect of fares shall be only available for the carriage on or for which it is issued, and no passenger shall be entitled to leave any carriage for any purpose whatever at any stage and resume his journey by a different carriage to that on or for which such ticket was issued without payment of a fresh fare from the point at which the passenger entered the second or other carriage.

12. A passenger not being an artizan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the Statutory Provisions relating to the Companies shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artizans, me-

chanics, or daily labourers.

13. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artizans, mechanics, and daily labourers) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform, and not in the interior or on the roof

of any carriage.

14. No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Companies shall be permitted to travel on the steps or platfor s of any carriage, or stand on the roof or sit on the outside rail on the roof of any carriage, and any passenger or other person so travelling, standing, or sitting, shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

15. No person except a passenger or intending passenger shall enter or mount any carriage, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part

of any carriage.

16. When any carriage contains in the interior thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation according to the notice thereof attached to the carriage is provided in such interior no person beyond such number

shall enter, mount, or remain therein except by the express permission of the conductor or other official of the Companies being first obtained. When any carriage contains on the outside thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation is provided on such outside, no person beyond such number shall enter, mount, or remain thereon.

17. No person shall enter, mount or leave, or attempt to enter, mount or leave, any carriage

whilst in motion.

18. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any carriage, except by the permission of the conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. No person shall take a dog or other animal into any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any carriage in breach of this Regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the carriage immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

19. No person shall travel in or on any carriage of the Companies with loaded firearms.

20. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Companies in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any carriage or tramway or light railway of the Companies.

21. The conductor of each carriage shall enforce or prevent the breach of these Bye-laws and Regulations to the best of his ability.

22. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws or Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

23. The expression "conductor" shall include any officer or servant in the employment of either of the respective Companies and having

charge of a carriage.
24. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each carriage in use a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.

25. On these Bye-laws coming into force, the Bye-laws made by the General Electric Tramways Company on the 1st day of May, 1896, shall be considered as repealed.

26. These Bye-laws shall come into force on the first day of May, one thousand nine hundred

and four.
